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## Explanations:

1. I. Demonstration is given 'for' something, thus the correct preposition is 'for' instead of to.

Correct sentence: Chief Minister and thousands of people from Andhra will demonstrate for special status for the state.

II is correct.

III is incorrect with respect to use of wrong form of verb 'seize'. With helping had, third form of verb is used. Thus it should be 'seized' instead of 'seize'.

Correct sentence: The AAP leader pointed out how the Centre had the Anti-Corruption Branch of the Delhi government *seized* by paramilitary forces.

Hence option B is correct.

2. I. is correct.

II. is incorrect with respect to use of 'again'. Here against should be used to indicate the comparison between Pakistani Rupee and USD.

Correct sentence: Pakistani rupee had depreciated by 30 percent *against* the U.S. dollar.

III. is incorrect with respect to use of wrong helping verb 'were'. The noun used here 'rating' is singular, so instead of 'were', use of 'was' is preferred.

Correct sentence: Pakistan's credit rating *was* downgraded by S&P, which cited diminished growth prospects.

Hence option C is correct.

3. I. is correct.

II. is wrong as it uses wrong form of verb.

The sentence is in past tense, so instead of 'include', "included" is preferred.

III. is also correct.

Hence option A is correct.



4. All the given statements are absolutely correct.

Hence option E is correct.

5. I. Chabahar port is a singular subject, thus the verb should also be singular i.e. instead of 'enjoy', "enjoys" should be the correct helping verb.

Correct sentence: Chabahar port *enjoys* special strategic status and is the gateway to Afghanistan.

II. is absolutely correct.

III. is grammatically incorrect as wrong quantifier is used here. 'areas' is countable, so instead of 'much', use of "many" is preferred.

Correct sentence: We need some drivers and incentives in *many* areas such as biotechnology, IT and so on.

Hence option C is correct.

6. I. is grammatically incorrect. As the ones who have promoted Brexit were the human beings and for living-beings 'who' is used instead of 'which'.

Correct sentence: There should be special places in hell for those *who* promoted Brexit.

II. and III. are correct.

Hence option D is correct.

7. I. is grammatically incorrect as it uses incorrect preposition with the verb 'transform', which is accompanied by prepositions 'to' or 'into'.

Correct sentence: Global warming is on track to transform the frigid mountain peaks *into* bare rocks shortly.

II. is also grammatically incorrect with respect to use of singular pronoun 'this' along with the plural subject basins.

Correct sentence: People living in the downstream areas of *these* river basins benefit directly and indirectly from its resources.

III. is absolutely correct.

Hence option B is correct.

8. Statement I is wrong due to use of adjective “long” instead of adverb “longer”.

Statement II is absolutely correct.

Statement III is wrong due to violation of the rule of subject-verb agreement. According to which, with a plural noun, plural verb is to be used. Here aftermaths is plural , so the verb “follows” should also be plural i.e. follow.

Hence option C is correct.

9. Statement I is wrong due to omission of article ‘the’ before '2014 majority'. It is a specific thing before which article ‘the’ is to be used grammatically.

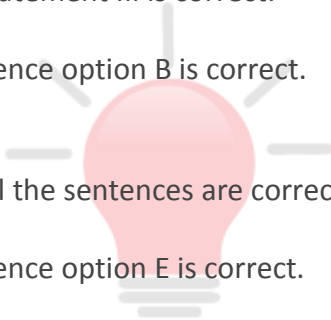
Statement II is also wrong as it uses wrong preposition. Share is demanded 'in' an alliance and not 'for' an alliance.

Statement III is correct.

Hence option B is correct.

10. All the sentences are correct.

Hence option E is correct.



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
