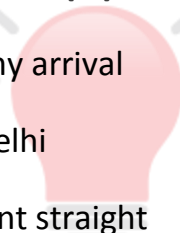

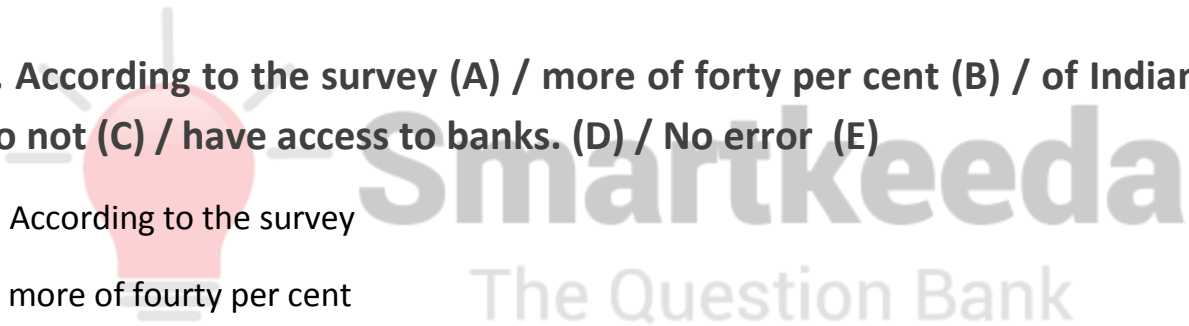

Explanations:**1.**

In part B, use of the adverb 'then' is absurd in the context and it, hence, must be replaced with the preposition 'than' that is commonly used while comparing two or more things.

Hence, option B is correct.

2.

In part C, 'to have' should be replaced with 'from having' as 'deter', which is a verb, is generally followed by the preposition 'from' which has to be followed by a gerund. The correct formation will be- "The reports have deterred some women to have the operation."

Hence, option C is correct.

3.

In part A, the use of two comparatives 'more' and 'better' together is erroneous and hence 'more' can be replaced with 'much' to make it grammatically correct sentence.

Hence, option A is correct.

4.

In part A, the preposition 'at' must be replaced with 'on' to make it a grammatically correct sentence.

Hence, option A is correct.

5.

In part D, the adverb 'badly' must be used in place of the adjective 'bad' as an adverb is needed for the sentence to be grammatically correct.

Hence, option D is correct.

6.

In part C, 'provide' must be replaced with 'provided' as the sentence is in passive voice and past participle of the verb is required for the sentence to be grammatically correct.

Hence, option C is correct.

7.

Under the context, the phrase 'more of' must be replaced with the prepositional phrase 'more than', which means 'over', to make it a grammatically correct sentence.

Hence, option B is correct.

8.

In part A, 'instead' must be replaced with prepositional phrase 'instead of' which means 'in place of'.

Hence, option A is correct.

9.

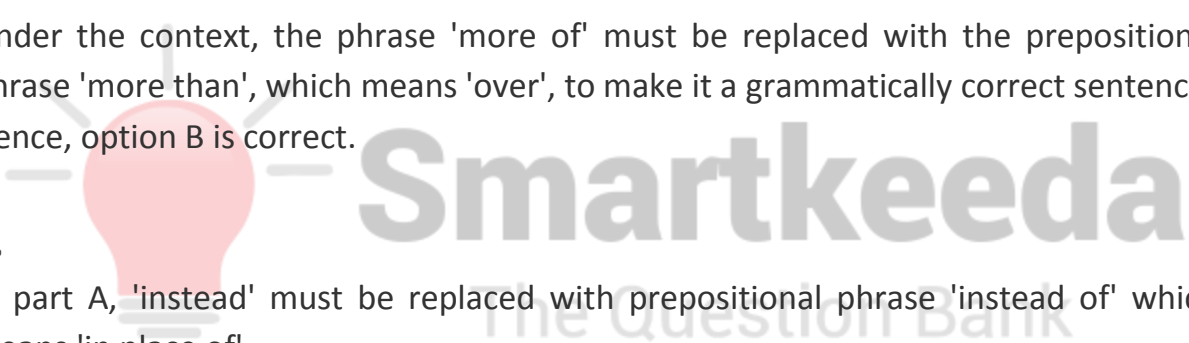
