Explanations:**1.**

In part C, use of the auxiliary verb 'are' is erroneous and hence must be replaced with 'will' to make the sentence meaningful.

Hence, option C is correct.

2.

The sentence is absolutely correct and thus has no error in it.

Option E is hence the correct answer.

3.

In part D, as the phrase following the main verb 'hope' has to be an infinitive (to + base form of a verb), 'signed' must be replaced with 'sign' to make it a grammatically correct sentence.

Hence, option D is correct.

4.

In part B, 'both' is being used as an adjective and hence the preposition 'of' which is followed by it is not required to make the sentence complete and thus can be removed.

Hence, option B is correct.

5.

In the predicate part of this sentence, use of two negatives - 'failed' and 'no evidence' together is redundant and meaningless. In part B, 'no', therefore, must be replaced with 'any' to make it a grammatically correct sentence.

Hence, option B is correct.

6.

In part C, the phrase 'more of' must be replaced with 'more than', which means 'over', to make it a grammatically correct sentence.

Hence, option C is correct.

7.

The verb 'invest' is generally followed by the preposition 'in' and not 'with'. The correct formation, hence, will be- The company, which has won the government contract, also plans to invest in the power sector.

Hence, option D is correct.

8.

In option A, 'worthy' must be replaced with 'worth' to make the sentence grammatically correct.

If something is worth a particular action, or if an action is worth doing, it is considered to be important enough for that action.

Ex. I am spending a lot of money and time on this boat, but it is worth it.

Ex. This restaurant is well worth a visit.

Ex. It is worth pausing to consider these statements from Mr Davies.

Hence, option A is correct.

9.

In part C, 'achieves' must be replaced with 'achieved' to make the sentence grammatically correct and appropriate in the context.

Hence, option C is correct.

10.

In part D, possessive pronoun 'its' will not be used when used in context of many countries and must be replaced with 'their'.

Hence, option D is correct.



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
