## Explanations :

1. The word 'exploting' is misspelled in the given sentence.

The correct spelling would be 'exploiting'.

All other words are correct in every aspect.

**Admit** : confess to be true or to be the case

**Spyware** : software that enables a user to obtain covert information about another's computer activities by transmitting data covertly from their hard drive

**Exploit** : make full use of and derive benefit from

**Vulnerability** : the quality or state of being exposed to the possibility of being attacked or harmed, either physically or emotionally

Hence, option C is the correct answer..

2. The word 'gullibel' is misspelled in the given sentence.

The correct spelling would be 'gullible'.

All other words are correct in every aspect.

**Gullible** : easily persuaded to believe something; credulous

**Duped** : deceived; tricked

**Unscrupulous** : having or showing no moral principles; not honest or fair

**Fellow** : a man or boy

Hence, option A is the correct answer.

3. The usage of the word 'altared' is erroneous in the given sentence.

**Altar (noun)**: a table or flat-topped block used as the focus for a religious ritual, especially for making sacrifices or offerings to a deity

**Alter (verb)**: change in character or composition, typically in a comparatively small but significant way

The correct word in place of 'altared' would have been '**altered**'.

All other words are correct in every aspect.

**Hooligan**: thug/ ruffian

**Itinerary**: a planned route or journey

Hence, option D is the correct answer.

4. All the words are spelled correctly in the given sentence.

Their usages are also correct in every aspect.

**Misogynist** : a person who dislikes, despises, or is strongly prejudiced against women

Hence, option E is the correct answer.

5. The word 'acolades' has been spelled incorrectly.

The correct spelling of the word is 'accolades'.

All other words are correct from every aspect.

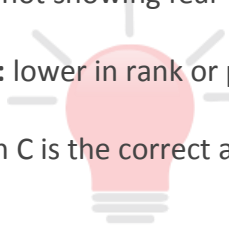
**Bureaucrat** : an official in a government department, in particular one perceived as being concerned with procedural correctness at the expense of people's needs

**Accolade** : an award or privilege granted as a special honour or as an acknowledgement of merit

**Unflinching** : not showing fear or hesitation in the face of danger or difficulty

**Subordinate** : lower in rank or position

Hence, option C is the correct answer.



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6. All the words are spelled correctly in the given sentence.

Their usages are also correct from every aspect.

**Fastidious** : very attentive to and concerned about accuracy and detail

**Dishearten** : cause (someone) to lose determination or confidence

**Sincere** : free from pretence or deceit; proceeding from genuine feelings

**Succeed** : achieve the desired aim or result

Hence, option E is the correct answer.



7. The word 'effeminet' has been wrongly spelled.

The correct spelling of the word is 'effeminate'.

All other words are correct from every aspect.

**Effeminate** : (of a man) having characteristics regarded as typical of a woman; unmanly

**Bully** : seek to harm, intimidate, or coerce (someone perceived as vulnerable)/ a person who habitually seeks to harm or intimidate those whom they perceive as vulnerable

**Throughout** : from beginning to end of (an event or period of time)

**Persecutor** : a person who persecutes someone, especially for their race or political or religious beliefs

Hence, option A is the correct answer.

8. The word 'ascertain' has been wrongly spelled.

The correct spelling of the word is 'ascertain'.

All other words are correct from every aspect.

**Ascertain** : find (something) out for certain; make sure of

**Initiate** : cause (a process or action) to begin

**Investigation** : the action of investigating something or someone; formal or systematic examination or research

**Negligence** : failure to take proper care over something

Hence, option C is the correct answer.

9. The word 'convoi' has been wrongly spelled.

The correct spelling of the word is 'convoy'.

All other words are correct from every aspect.

**Convoy** : a group of ships or vehicles travelling together, typically one accompanied by armed troops, warships, or other vehicles for protection

**Commissioner** : a representative of the supreme authority in an area

**Admit** : confess to be true or to be the case

**Anticipate** : regard as probable; expect or predict

Hence, option D is the correct answer.

**10.** The usage of the word 'queue' is contextually erroneous in the given sentence.

The correct word in place of 'queue' would have been 'cue'.

**Queue** : a line or sequence of people or vehicles awaiting their turn to be attended to or to proceed

**Cue** : a thing said or done that serves as a signal to an actor or other performer to enter or to begin their speech or performance

All other words are used in the sentence correctly.

**Monologue** : a long speech by one actor in a play or film, or as part of a theatrical or broadcast programme.

**Interrupt** : stop the continuous progress of (an activity or process)

**Deafening** : (of a noise) so loud as to make it impossible to hear anything else

Hence, option A is the correct answer.



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
