## Explanations:

### 1. Connectors:

A and E

A: Despite all his efforts it has not become possible to

E: crack the examination within one month.

This is correct since the combined sentence makes a meaningful and contextually correct sentence.

Connectors:

C and D:

C: Reading is a good habit but understanding

D: it is more important

This pair is also correct as the combined sentence is a meaningful and contextually correct statement.

None of the other pairs shares the same relationship and they cannot be combined to form meaningful and contextually correct statements. So, only A-E and C-D are correct pairs.

This makes option C the correct choice among the given options.



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### 2. Connectors:

B and F:

B: The insurance sector should also understand

F: Its responsibility towards development.

This is a correct pair as the combined statement will make a meaningful and contextually correct sentence.

None of the other given pairs will imply a meaningfully and contextually correct statement when combined together and therefore none of them can be considered as correct. Only B-F is the correct pair.

It makes option D the correct choice among the given options.

3. None of the given pairs matches each other to form meaningful and contextually correct statements and therefore none of the pairs can be correct.

This makes option E the correct choice among the given options.

Hence, all A-E, B-F and C-D are correct pairs as they make meaningful and contextually correct sentences when combined together.

This makes option C the right choice among the given options.

Hence, C-D, A-E and B-F are correct pairs as they make meaningful and contextually correct statements when combined together.

Hence, option A is the correct choice among the given options.

6. **The disconnect between the two governments was most visible in BIMSTEC Summit.**  
Thus, C-D is correct.

Fragment A of column 1 matches with fragment E of column 2. **The core issue that arises from the proposed law *remains*; whether a marital wrong, should lead to prosecutions and jail terms.** Thus, A-E is correct.

**New Delhi and Kathmandu must put an end to the unseemly controversy by renewing diplomatic efforts as soon as possible.** Thus, B-F is correct.

Therefore A-E, B-F and C-D make valid combinations.

Hence option B is correct.

7. **The core issue that arises from the proposed law remain; whether a marital wrong, should lead to prosecutions and jail terms.**

Fragment A of column 1 is matched with fragment E of column 2 to make the sentence contextually correct but it should should 'remain' as singular verb i.e. "*remains*" to make it grammatically correct. The new sentence will be : **The core issue that arises from the proposed law *remains*; whether a marital wrong, should lead to prosecutions and jail terms.**

**The changes to be introduced through the ordinance do address some of the reservations about the original Bill.**

Fragment B of column 1 is matched with fragment F of column 2 to make the sentence contextually and grammatically correct.

**The Bill made this form of divorce punishable by a three-year prison term and a fine.**

Fragment C of column 1 is matched with fragment D of column 2 to make the sentence grammatically and contextually correct.

Therefore B-F and C-D make valid combinations.

Hence option C is correct.



- 8. He has been witness to the sufferings of the rural women and wished to portray that through this valuable medium.**

Fragment A of column 1 is matched with fragment D of column 2 to make the sentence contextually and grammatically correct.

**This was especially clear during his seven years serving in Visakhapatnam, where he saw the need for a discourse in a not-so-progressive society.**

Fragment B of column 1 is matched with fragment F of column 2 to make the sentence contextually and grammatically correct .

**The thought-provoking piece is even more topical now, given the rapists were recently sentenced to death.**

Fragment C of column 1 is matched with fragment E of column 2 to make the sentence grammatically and contextually correct.

Therefore A-D, B-F and C-E make valid combinations.

Hence option E is correct.

Fragment A of column 1 is matched with fragment E of column 2 to make the sentence contextually and grammatically correct.

**Her sensitive eye caught the attention of the right people.**

Fragment B of column 1 is matched with fragment F of column 2 to make the sentence contextually and grammatically correct .

**The documentary project tried to conjure the story of women who managed to overcome social hurdles.**

Fragment C of column 1 is matched with fragment D of column 2 to make the sentence contextually grammatically correct.

Therefore A-E, B-F and C-D make valid combination.

Hence option B is correct.

**10. Indian farmers and U.S. manufacturers of medical devices could be among the main winners in a trade package under negotiation.**

Fragment A of column 1 is matched with fragment E of column 2 to make the sentence contextually and grammatically correct.

**Having skirmished for months over tit-for-tat tariffs on steel and some agricultural products, the two sides began talks in June.**

Fragment B of column 1 is matched with fragment F of column 2 to make the sentence contextually and grammatically correct .

**Neither the office of the Ministry of Commerce or the United States Trade Representative responded to a request for comment.**

Fragment C of column 1 is matched with fragment D of column 2 to make the sentence contextually correct but grammatically it is erroneous. Instead of 'or' *nor* is used with neither. The correct sentence would be : **Neither the office of the Ministry of Commerce nor the United States Trade Representative responded to a request for comment.**

Therefore A-E, B-F make valid combination.

Hence option D is correct.



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
