10. Explanations:

1. Option B is incorrect as the statement is totally incorrect and conveys a different meaning than that stated in the original set.

Option C is incorrect as the pronouns 'they' and 'them' mentioned in the beginning have not been specified before and the statement so formed is meaningless.

Option D changes the meaning of the statement by stating that the drivers did not agree for a background check which is incorrect and then they moved to India, which is absurd.

Option A is correct and states everything right grammatically as well as contextually.

Hence, option A is the correct answer.

2. Option A is incorrect as this changes the meaning of the original set and seems to imply that there are less number of people believing in the fact that elections are to be held in July.

Option B is incorrect as the statement seems to imply that there are arguments about when the Pakistan elections would be held while in the original set, this is a given fact and not an opinion. This changes the meaning of the set and is incorrect.

Option C is incorrect for the same reason stated for option B.

Option D is correct and states everything right grammatically as well as contextually.

Hence, option D is the correct answer.

3. Option B is incorrect as it seems to imply that the bans were imposed on plastics after they failed in the developed nations which is not the case as per the original set.

Option C is incorrect as it is not meaningful in terms of structure and grammar.

Option D is incorrect as it changes the entire meaning of the original set and seems to imply that fater failing in the developed nations, Its implementation has been successful in India with some problems being common to the other nations.

Option A is correct and states everything right grammatically as well as contextually.

Hence, option A is the correct answer.

4. Statement A is incorrect as the first few fragments of the line are not a part of the original set and cannot be included as such.

Option B is incorrect as it seems to say that the claim of India eliminating single-use plastic is not dramatic. This is opposite of what the original set states.

Option D is incorrect as the sentence structure is incorrect as the *statement of intent* is to be elaborated in the beginning and not the end. Also, the use of the word *basis* is incorrect and should be replaced with *based*.

Statement C is correct and states everything right grammatically as well as contextually.

Hence, option C is the correct answer.

5. Statement A is incorrect as it simply does not make a meaningful statement on reading.

Statement C is incorrect as in the original set, Trump has merely agreed to stop the War games and has not already stopped them. Also, he did not say that the press conference would take place after his meeting with Kim.

Statement D is incorrect as the phrase 'will agreed' is incorrect in terms of tense usage. Also, the statement here implies that stopping the war games will threaten North Korea while the opposite is true.

Statement B is correct and states everything right grammatically as well as contextually.

Hence, option B is the correct answer.

6. The first option is incorrect as it creates a cause and effect relationship between the number of connections and the scheme completing 2 years. Also, the relationship established between refills and new distribution is incorrect.

Option B is incorrect as it creates an incorrect relationship between giving out new connections and PMUY and in general the sentence structure is also incorrect.

Option D is incorrect as it implies the PMUY found it tough to complete 2 years.

Option C is correct contextually and grammatically. It links all the statements in the correct way.

Hence, option C is correct.

- 7.** Option B is absurd as it implies that the collapse of the Ottomans led to ending of the WWI.

Option C is incorrect as it implies the ending of WWI led to collapse of the Ottoman Empire.

Option D implies the collapse of the Ottoman Empire transformed the Turkish society by making it a tectonic event. This is absurd and meaningless.

Option A is correct contextually and grammatically. It links all the statements in the correct way.

Hence, option A is correct.

- 8.** Option A is incorrect as it is grammatically absurd and the statement also does not make sense in terms of structure.

Option B is incorrect as the phrase 'economies in the US Federal Reserve' is incorrect. Also, it implies that the investors decide when bond yields fall or rise which is absurd.

Option C is incorrect as it implies the US Fed has forced them to invest in the US where the returns are *lower*. This is factually incorrect from the original set of statements.

Option D is correct contextually and grammatically. It links all the statements in the correct way.

Hence, option D is correct.

- 9.** Option B is incorrect as it implies building the mass higher education system has led to inadequate funding.

Option C is incorrect as it implies that because things are changing at the central level, there has been inadequate funding.

Option A is correct contextually and grammatically. It links all the statements in the correct way.

Hence, option A is correct.

10. Option A is incorrect as it implies sourcing untested technologies like the production of 2G ethanol is a good thing while it is the opposite in the original set.

Option C is incorrect as it implies that because the WHO listed Indian cities as the most polluting, India is introducing untested technologies.

Option D is incorrect as it implies the WHO listed Indian cities as polluted due to India sourcing untested technologies which is incorrect.

Option B is correct contextually and grammatically. It links all the statements in the correct way.

Hence, option B is correct.



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
