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Explanations:

1. A-E: The RBI could have addressed these concerns when banks and borrowers from these sectors brought these issues to its notice.

Use of verb “bought” creates an error in the sentence. “bought” is the past participle of verb “buy” is clearly a misfit here. The correct verb to be used is “brought”, which is the past participle of “bring”.

Correct sentence: The RBI could have addressed these concerns when banks and borrowers from these sectors **brought** these issues to its notice.

C-D: This would provide time for bankers to think over the sources from which it can bridge the liquidity gap.

This sentence seems to be contextually correct but on the grammar hand it has a problem with respect to the use of pronoun. Here “Bankers” (noun) is plural, so it will be replaced with the plural pronoun “they” instead of “it”.

Correct sentence: This would provide time for bankers to think over the sources from which **they** can bridge the liquidity gap.

B- F: The RBI circular had adversely impacted resolution plans which were under process between lenders and debtors.

This make a grammatically as well as contextually correct sentence.

Hence option D is correct.

2. A-D: The Government of India has recently passed an act who decriminalizes suicide and empowers individuals with mental illness.

Here use of “who” is incorrect as it is referred to Act. ‘Who’ is used for living persons.

Correct sentence: The Government of India has recently passed an act **which** decriminalizes suicide and empowers individuals with mental illness.

B-F: Voluntary organizations are training community workers with the requisite skills required to take care of the mentally ill.

Some of us may confuse and match B-D, but its incorrect as community workers don’t possess the authority to decriminalize or criminalize an issue.

So, the correct combination is B-F.

C-E: Each of us is lending a hand, when we lend our ears to the emotions of our family members and neighbors.

C-E is grammatically as well as contextually correct.

Hence option B is correct.

3. A-E: There are several multiplexes in Chhattisgarh but they don't give any priority to local films.

A-E forms a grammatically as well contextually correct sentence.

B-D: The video companies are making money but they doesn't want to share the revenue with the producers.

B-D make a contextually correct sentence but grammatically they don't follow the subject-verb agreement. Video companies are plural, thus helping verb should also be plural (don't instead of doesn't).

Correct Sentence: The video companies are making money but they **don't** want to share the revenue with the producers.

C-F: It took time for them to realise that home video rights, satellite rights, digital rights are different things.

C-F forms a grammatically as well contextually correct sentence.

Hence option C is correct.

4. A-F: Last year we performed in Fiji and almost each one loved the show.

Each is not used with almost as per grammar rules. Thus it should be replaced with every in order to make a grammatically correct sentence as well.

Correct sentence: Last year we performed in Fiji and almost **everyone** loved the show.

B- D: Our music has a distinctive flavour which people loves.

People is singular, thus loves needs to be "love" to make it grammatically correct.

Correct sentence: Our music has a distinctive flavour which people **love**.

C-E: The most modern instrument used by our band is Banjo.

C-E is grammatically as well as contextually correct.

Hence option D is correct.

5. A-D: Pakistan could be blacklisted by the FATF due to lobbying by India.

A-D forms a grammatically and contextually correct sentence.

B-F: The FATF is working to curb terrorism financing and money laundering.

B-F also forms a grammatically and contextually correct sentence.

C-E: The Foreign office is calculating loss if Pakistan is pushed into the FATF blacklist.

C-E also forms a grammatically and contextually correct sentence.

Hence option E is correct.

6. Let's use elimination technique to cancel the choices that are absurd or irrelevant.

A-F:

Global Warming can do more than just melt polar ice and change weather patterns throughout the world.

This is reasonably and grammatically correct sentence.

A-E:

Global Warming can do more than just melt polar ice and change so long as mankind continues to produce greenhouse gases.

The sentence after combining the fragments doesn't make sense and is hence incorrect.

B-E:

The Earth's temperature will continue to rise so long as mankind continues to produce greenhouse gases.

This complete sentence is evidently correct, both grammatically and contextually.

C-D:

Most international airports have Shops and restaurants of airplane passengers to use.

Usage of 'of 'instead of 'for' makes it erroneous and hence option A and E can be eliminated as well.

Clearly, option **C** is correct answer.

A-F:

The First World War unlike the second, can be argued as being orchestrated by not a single party or regime but through a complicated series of events which played part in tipping the fragile balance of European powers.

The sentence above is evidently correct both grammatically and contextually.

The sentence after combining the fragments does not make sense and is hence incorrect.

B-E:

The sentence after combining the fragments does not make sense and is hence incorrect.

C-D:

The United States entry into the war brought millions of fresh, new, eager men and plentiful supplies

This sentence too is correct both grammatically and contextually.

Hence, Clearly Option **B** is correct option.

The sentence after combining the fragments does make sense and is hence correct.

B-E:

A Black Hole is a great amount of matter packed into a very small area.

The sentence after combining the fragments does make sense and is hence incorrect.

C-D:

Hummingbirds fly with their bodies held upright, not flat like most birds.

The sentence after combining the fragments does make sense and is hence correct.

Clearly, option **D** is correct answer.

The sentence above after combining the fragments doesn't make any sense. Hence, it is able to eliminate.

B-F:

Industrial purchasing may be defined as the decision-making process by which formal organizations establish the need for purchased products and services.

This complete sentence is evidently correct, both grammatically and contextually. Hence, it makes only option **D** is correct option.

The sentence above after combining the fragments doesn't make any sense.

A-D: The Alaknanda is a Himalayan river in the Indian state of Uttarakhand and one of the two headstreams of the Ganga.

The sentence after combining the fragments does make sense and is hence correct.

A-F: The Alaknanda is a Himalayan river in the Indian state of Uttarakhand the fourth smallest by population.

The sentence above after combining the fragments doesn't make any sense.

B-F: Goa is India's smallest state by area and the the fourth smallest by population.

The sentence after combining the fragments does not make sense as there are two the's present in the sentence and is hence incorrect.

Clearly, option E is correct answer.



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
