Who: MoU

What: signed to implement action plan in 132 cities under clean air programme

When: published on 26th March 2021

Representatives of state pollution control boards, urban local bodies and Institutes of Repute signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) for 132 identified cities on Friday to implement city-specific action plans under the National Clean Air Programme (NCAP).

The NCAP is a long-term, time-bound, national level strategy to tackle air pollution problem across the country in a comprehensive manner with targets to achieve 20-30 per cent reduction in particulate matter concentrations by 2024, with 2017 as base year.

Minister of Environment, Forest and Climate Change Prakash Javadekar was also present during the signing of MoU. He said concerted efforts are required by state governments and all concerned for improving air quality in the country, and exhorted all to work in mission mode. (Read more)

Who: Another IAS

What: appointed as new Chairman of Airports Authority of India

When: published on 26th March 2021

Sanjeev Kumar (IAS) has been appointed as the new Chairman of the Airports Authority of India (AAI). The Appointments Committee of the Cabinet (ACC) headed by Prime Minister Narendra Modi, has approved his appointment to the post on Thursday. With his appointment, Kumar will be the 4th Chairman of India's national airport regulator in a row from India's elite bureaucracy, IAS. Currently, AAI's Member (HR) Anuj Aggarwal is holding the additional charge of the post, after Arvind Singh (IAS), who joined the Culture Ministry as Secretary in February this year.

Before Arvind Singh the charge of AAI Chairman was held again by Anuj Aggarwal as Guruprasad Mohapatra, again an IAS, was transferred to the Ministry of Finance. Before Mohapatra, RK Srivastava, a 1984-batch Jharkhand-cadre IAS officer, had been appointed as Airports Authority of India (AAI) chairman for five years in January 2015. Although Srivastava had been removed way before his term



ended, in May 2018 only. After his removal, the Chairman's charge was briefly handled by then Member (Planning) Sudhir Raheja. (Read more)

What: between India and Pakistan underway in New Delhi

Meeting of Permanent Indus Commission between India and Pakistan is underway in New Delhi. The Commission deals with water rights on the Indus river. The Permanent Indus Commission was set up under the Indus Waters Treaty of 1960. The Indian side is being led by the Indian Commissioner for Indus Waters Pradeep Kumar Saxena. The Pakistan side is being led by Syed Muhammad Meher Ali Shah.

The Indus water treaty warrants the two commissioners to meet at least once a year. Last year's meeting scheduled to be held in March in New Delhi was cancelled in view of the Corona virus pandemic. The last meeting took place in Lahore in August 2018. The Indus Waters Treaty was signed between then Prime Minister Jawaharlal Nehru and former Pakistan President Ayub Khan. It sets out a mechanism for cooperation and information exchange between the two countries regarding their use of the rivers.

With a wealth of Rs 44,270 crores, Mangal Prabhat Lodha (65) and family of Lodha Group is the richest real estate developer on the GROHE Hurun India Real Estate Rich List 2020 for the fourth consecutive year. His wealth increased by 39 percent in the current year.

Founded in 1980 and headquartered in Mumbai, Lodha is India's largest real estate developer by sales value for financial years 2014-20 and the second-largest by area delivered. Lodha Group had the highest revenue from operations among all the real estate developers in India during the pandemic hit year 2020, the List said.

With a wealth of Rs 36,430 crores, Rajiv Singh, 61 of DLF ranked second on the list and registered an increase of 45 percent in wealth, backed by 50 percent rise in DLF's share price, it said. (Read more)

Chief Justice of India (CJI) SA Bobde recommended Supreme Court judge Justice NV Ramana as his successor. The CJI sent a letter to the government and handed his copy of recommendation to Justice Ramana. CJI Bobde is scheduled to retire on April 23. He was sworn in as the 47th Chief Justice of India in November 2019, and succeeded Justice Ranjan Gogoi.

The Chief Justice's recommendation comes after the government asked him to recommend his successor, as a little less than a month is left for his retirement. (Read more)

What: sets up inter-disciplinary team to explore potential of Yoga



When: published on 27th March 2021

The Union Ministry of Ayush has set up an interdisciplinary team of experts to explore the potential of Yoga as a productivity enhancing tool for the population.

The committee is chaired by H R Nagendra, chancellor, Swami Vivekananda Yoga Anusandhana Samsthana and its members include representatives from All India Institute of Medical Science (AIIMS) New Delhi, Indian Institute of Management (IIM) Bengaluru, Indian Institute of Technology (IIT) Bombay, various leading Yoga institutions, the corporate sector and the Ayush Ministry.

One of the primary tasks of the committee is to review evidence that linked Yoga to productivity and analyse the same. The various possible directions of the productivity dimension could then be identified systematically, and along these directions, protocols could be developed. The committee resolved that it would adopt an approach based on science and evidence in finalising its recommendations.

The committee will submit its preliminary recommendations by May this year. In the inception meeting held recently, the committee recognised that in the past five years, there has been an unprecedented global surge in the popularity of Yoga. But the productivity dimension of Yoga - its role at the workplace in offering benefits to employees to perform better - remains unexplored to a large extent. (Read more)

Who: Vijayveer, Tejaswani

What: win gold in all-Indian 25m rapid fire pistol mixed team final

When: published on 27th March 2021

India's Vijayveer Sidhu and Tejaswani claimed the gold medal in the 25m rapid fire pistol mixed team event of the ISSF World Cup in Delhi on Saturday.

In an all-Indian gold medal match, they comfortably beat Gurpreet Singh and Abhidnya Patil 9-1 at the Dr Karni Singh Shooting Range.

In the Qualification 2, Gurpreet and Patil finished at the top with a total score of 370 while the team of 16-year-old Tejaswani and 18-year-old Sidhu aggregated 368.

On Friday, Sidhu won the individual silver medal in the 25 rapid fire pistol event ahead of Anish Bhanwala and Gurpreet.

Later, India missed out on a medal in the trap mixed team event as Kynan Chenai and Shreyasi Singh went down to Turkey in the bronze medal match. (Read more)

Who: Indonesia's 2,968-metre high Mount Merapi volcano

What: erupts

When: published on 27th March 2021

Indonesia's most volatile volcano was erupting again on Saturday, releasing plumes of ash high into the air and sending streams of lava and debris down its slopes. No casualties were reported.

An avalanche of rocks spilled down Mount Merapi's slopes before dawn and clouds of hot ash shot 200 meters (656ft) into the air as the mountain groaned and rumbled, said Hanik Humaida, the head of Yogyakarta's Volcanology and Geological Hazard Mitigation Center.

The volcano unleashed hot clouds of ash at least eight times since the morning as well as a series of pyroclastic flows – a mixture of rock, debris, lava and gasses – that had reached nearly 2km (1.2 miles) down its slopes, Mr. Humaida said.

The 2,968-metre (9,737-foot) high volcano is on densely populated Java island near the ancient city of Yogyakarta. It is the most active of dozens of Indonesian volcanoes and has repeatedly erupted recently. (Read more)

Who: Iran and China

What: sign 25-year cooperation pact

When: published on 28th March 2021

Iran and China signed a 25-year "strategic cooperation pact" on Saturday in the latest expansion of Beijing's flagship trillion-dollar Belt and Road Initiative as the US rivals build closer ties.

Negotiations for the deal, launched five years ago, sparked controversy in Iran last year and virtually no details of its contents have been released.

China is Iran's leading trade partner and was one of the biggest buyers of Iranian oil before then US president Donald Trump reimposed sweeping unilateral sanctions in 2018 after abandoning a multilateral nuclear agreement with Tehran.

The China-Iran pact, which Tehran said included "political, strategic and economic" components, was signed by the two countries' foreign ministers, Wang Yi and Mohammad Javad Zarif, a correspondent reported. (Read more)
