### **Explanations:**

**1.** The part in bold in the given sentence is grammatically correct and needs no improvement.

Hence option D is the correct answer.

**2.** Option C changes the bold part of the sentence completely and makes it incorrect.

The expression 'did not' should be followed by a verb in the first form and plural form.

Out of the given options, the option which follows the structure as discussed above is option B.

Hence option B is the correct answer and the correct sentence will be "The idea of giving bonus before Diwali did not click with the chairperson."

**3.** The word 'true' is an adjective and it should be preceded by an adverb to make the sentence meaningful and grammatically correct.

In option B, 'necessity' is a noun and hence it is incorrect.

The phrase in option C does not fit in the sentence, as it is a modified version of the part given in bold in the question and has the word 'necessary' which is an adjective, hence it is incorrect.

In option A, 'necessarily' is an adverb used before the adjective 'true'.

Hence option A is the correct answer and the correct sentence will be "It is not necessarily true that what starts well ends well."

4. In English language to show or indicate habitual and regular actions, we use simple present tense.

So here 'taken' should be replaced by 'takes'.

Hence option A is the correct answer and the correct sentence will be "Everyday he takes a morning walk before going to the office."

5. The use of the word 'next' after the bold part of the sentence indicates that the sentence is talking about what will happen in the future.

So here 'is' should be replaced by 'will' to make the sentence of the future tense.

Hence option B is the correct answer and the correct sentence will be "The market is in an unstable condition and we do not know what will happen next."

6. In the bold part of the given sentence, the usage of the pronoun 'much' is incorrect.

It should be replaced by the pronoun 'most' to make the sentence grammatically correct.

Hence option B is the correct answer and the correct sentence will be "Most of the people do not follow rules in our country."

**7.** The word 'repo' means a repurchase agreement.

The word 'rapport' means a close and harmonious relationship with a person or group of persons.

So according to the context of the sentence, her closeness with the manager made everyone jealous.

Hence option A is the correct answer and the correct sentence will be "Her rapport with the manager made everyone jealous."

**8.** The bold part of the sentence implies that the investors were wanted in good numbers.

Therefore 'investor' will be replaced by 'investors' and the expression 'in good numbers' is to be added to make the sentence grammatically correct.

Hence option A is the correct answer and the correct sentence will be "In order to attract investors in good numbers, the government created a single window system."

**9.** The part in bold in the given sentence is grammatically correct and needs no improvement.

Hence option D is the correct answer.

**10.** The given sentence is an interrogative sentence in past continuous tense.

The structure of such a sentence is "what / why / where + was / were + noun / pronoun + fourth form of the verb /-ing form/gerund form.

Such a structure is followed only in option A.

Hence option A is the correct answer and the correct sentence will be "What was he doing before I came here?"



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
