1. Anecdote (Noun): a short amusing or interesting story about a real incident or person.

Sonnet (Noun): a poem of fourteen lines expressing any kind of sentiment.

Epitaph (Noun): words which written or inscribed on the grave or tomb in the memory of the dead.

Elegy (Noun): a mournful poem, a lament for the dead.

Hence, the correct answer is option D.

Cacographist (Noun): A person who is bad in spellings. 2.

Calligraphist (Noun): A person who has a beautiful handwriting.

Philatelist (Noun): A person who has a hobby of collecting stamps and other postal matter.

Insolvent (Noun): A person who is unable to pay his debts, bankrupt.

Novice (Noun): a person new to and inexperienced in a job or situation.

Pessimist (Noun): a person who looks at the worst aspect or darker side of things.

6. Prodigy (Noun): A young person with exceptional qualities or abilities.

Erudite (Adjective): having or showing great knowledge or learning.

Epicure (Noun): A person who takes particular pleasure in fine food and drink.

Pedant (Noun): A person who makes an excessive or inappropriate display of learning.

Hence, the correct answer is option D.

7. Terrorist (Noun): A person who uses violence and intimidation, especially against civilians, in the pursuit of political aims.

Lunatic (Noun): A person who is mentally ill.

Fanatic (Noun): A person filled with excessive enthusiasm for an extreme religious or political cause.

Desperado (Noun): A desperate or reckless person, especially a criminal or outlaw.

Hence, the correct answer is option D.

8. Cavalry (Noun): Soldiers who earlier fought on horseback but now use armoured vehicles.

Philanthropy (Noun): The act of helping needy people by donating money and funds.

Canophilia (Noun): The love for dogs.

Misogyny (Noun): Hatred of women and womankind.

Hence, the correct answer is option C.

9. Den (Noun): A wild animal's home.

Zoo (Noun): A place typically like a park or garden, where wild animals are kept for study, conservation or display to the public.

Aquarium (Noun): A transparent tank for keeping live fish and other water creatures and plants.

Aviary (Noun): A large cage, building, or enclosure for keeping birds in.
