|  | The verb 'are' is not the correct verb to be used in this sentence, because as per the rules of conjunction in grammar when two subjects are joined by 'either or' or 'neither nor', the verb agrees with the subject that is nearest to it i.e., with the second subject and here the second subject 'mother' is singular and therefore the correct verb to be used here will be 'is'.<br>Therefore the correct sentence will be "Neither his father nor his mother is agreeing for their marriage." |               |         |            |   |  |              |          |   |  |

**3.** The fragment A of the sentence is erroneous.

In it, the preposition 'for' is missing after the word 'ordered' and it should be used to make the sentence grammatically correct.

Therefore the correct sentence will be "Since I had ordered for a large number of handsets the dealer agreed to give me an additional discount of 10%."

Hence option A is the correct answer.

**4.** The fragment B of the sentence is erroneous.

Here 'on' is not the correct preposition to be used. It should be replaced with 'of' as the sentence says that the growth rate of GDP belongs to India and as per the rules of preposition in grammar, the usage of the preposition 'of' is to show possession, origin or belonging.

Therefore the correct sentence will be "According to a recent survey made by the World Bank growth rate of India's GDP will be near about 7.3% in 2018."

Hence option B is the correct answer.

**5.** The fragment C of the sentence is erroneous.

This part of the sentence talks about both the system and the people together, so a plural noun should be used for them and therefore 'goal' should be replaced by 'goals'.

Therefore the correct sentence will be "Sometimes people fight with the system unnecessarily without understanding that the common goals of both the system and the people are actually the same."

Hence option C is the correct answer.

**6.** The fragment C of the sentence is erroneous.

The word 'interval' is a noun and the word 'regularly' is an adverb.

An adjective is used to qualify ordescribe a noun, and an adverb is generally used to qualify or describe a verb.

So here before the word 'intervals', 'regularly' should be replaced with 'regular' as the word 'regular' is an adjective to make the sentence correct.

Therefore the correct sentence will be "Since they were instructed to maintain cleanliness in the campus, they cleaned the campus at regular intervals."

Hence option C is the correct answer.

**7.** The fragment A of the sentence is erroneous.

The word 'despite' doesn't take any preposition and so there is no need to use 'of' after despite in the sentence.

Therefore the correct sentence will be "Despite his best efforts he failed to retain the position due to unwanted political interference."

Hence option A is the correct answer.

**8.** The fragment B of the sentence is erroneous.

The given sentence is in past continuous tense and the structure of such a sentence is "subject + present participle  $(1^{st} \text{ form of the verb + ing}) + auxiliary verbs (was/were) + object", as per the rules of tenses in grammar.$ 

In part B of the sentence the auxiliary verb 'was' is missing.

Therefore the correct sentence will be "It seemed to me that the principal of the school was looking at me in a rather suspicious manner."

Hence option B is the correct answer.

**9.** The fragment B of the sentence is erroneous.

Here 'on' is not the correct preposition to be used, and it should be replaced with 'at' as according to the rules of preposition in grammar 'at' is used to indicate a place, and in the given sentence the place is the inaugural function.

Therefore the correct sentence will be "There was a huge gathering present at the inaugural function."

Hence option B is the correct answer.

**10.** The fragment C of the sentence is erroneous.

Since the helping verb 'was' is used in the part B of the sentence, it means that the sentence is in simple past tense, and therefore in part C of the sentence 'have' should be replaced with 'had'.

Therefore the correct sentence will be "The road from the highway to the hill was more difficult than we had feared."

Hence option C is the correct answer.
