## Explanations:

1. Collecting second is the hobby of the first one.

The one who collect stamps is called Philatelist.
Hence option (C) is correct.
2. All the options except option $C$ has all the three letters as vowels.

Only option C has a consonant along with two vowels.
Hence option (C) is correct.
3. Checking Conclusion I: No eraser is pencil.

Observing the given statements we can say that we can't find a definite relationship between the classes 'eraser' and 'pencil' as we do not get a definite conclusion out of $\mathrm{O}+\mathrm{E}$ combination of statements. C1 hence doesn't follow.

## Checking Conclusion II: Some papers may be eraser.

Given statement: Some papers are not eraser.

In the above statement, as it's given that some papers are not eraser. So, if some papers are not eraser, what are the other papers? They may be eraser or they may not be eraser.

Clearly, the possibility in conclusion 2 does exist.
Option B is hence the correct answer.
4. From the following image it is clear that $M$ is standing in the middle of the row.

Hence the correct answer is option (A).


5. From the below image it is clear that the park is 12 km in south direction from the hotel.


Hence option (B) is the correct answer.
6. We can create a family tree using the given information as follows-

Thus B is related to D as his son.

Hence option (B) is the correct answer.
7. The code for 'MARBLE' is obtained by interchanging the first and sixth letter, second and fourth letter and third and fifth letter.

Applying this logic, MARBLE will become ELBRAM.
Similarly applying the same logic we'll get 'ELTTOB' as BOTTLE.

Hence option (C) is correct.
8. The correct sequence is 52341

The sequence represents the way of writing an address.

First stage is "House number" is written.
Then the name of "Locality" is written.

After that "City" is written and then comes the "State" followed by "Country."

Example of an address-

The missing term as per the image shown above is XY23.

Note- N.V. is the short form used for Numeric Value.

Hence option (B) is correct.
10. The following table shows the reverse position of letters in english alphabet series.

| $A$ | $B$ | $C$ | $D$ | $E$ | $F$ | $G$ | $H$ | I | J | K | L |
| :---: | :---: | :---: | :---: | :---: | :---: | :---: | :---: | :---: | :---: | :---: | :---: |

Here ABC is decodes as XYZ where the reverse codes of first and third letter are interchanged.
Reverse letter of $A$ is $Z$, but is placed at third position in the given code, Similarly Reverse letter of $C$ is $X$ but is placed at first position in the given code.

As per the above table and logic the required group of letters is NOP.
Hence option (B) is correct.


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
