1.

The passage talks about two types of features- one is basic, which is for free and the others are paid. Thus, the paid features are the added ones over the basic features.

'detracted' means less or subtracted.

Thus, option E is incorrect as the bold word is inappropriately used.

Only option D 'additional' fits here grammatically and contextually.

Hence option D is correct.

2.

The Question Bank

The sentence conveys information about the mail tracking functions of the software.

Tract means an area and is of no relevance here.

An Apple of my eye is an idiom whch means one's beloved.

A bird's eye view means an overall view from above.

An eye catcher refers to someone who is attractive.

Out of all the given options, only the idiom Keep an eye suits the context.

Hence **option B** is correct.

3.

In the first instance means *initially*.

A quick glance is a noun phrase that means a quick look at something. Usage of it in place of the bold phrase would be ungrammatical and hence can be eliminated.

Looking through means while searching for something. This too is a weak choice as a replacement for the bold phrase.

A first look is a noun phrase and would be absurd in the context too.

Clearly, only option A fits in well here.

Hence **option A** is correct.

4.

The sentence conveys a certain amount of curiosity about the mails being read by the recipient or not.

Wandered means to roam here and there, which is incorrect here.

Roaming means to move from one place to another.

Wondered means to give a thought or to think about something.

Did is absolutely irrelevant in the context of the passage.

Only option B fits in well both contextually as well as grammatically.

Hence **option B** is correct.

5.

The sentence here talks about entrepreneurs spotting and working on an opportunity. Here, the need for tracking the status of mails gave birth to the innovative tracking features.

Stunt means trick and is irrelevant.

The best fit hers is option D- capitalize which means to take advantage of a situation.

Hence **option D** is correct.

6.

The original word *embedded* is contextually correct but grammatically incorrect. The word is in the past tense while the rest of the sentence is in present tense.

Thus logically, option A embeds is the best available option.

Hence **option A** is correct.

7.

The original word *sluggishly* means in a *slow manner*, which is contradicting the rest of the sentence and is thus incorrect.

Adversely means unfavourably.

At doorstep means very near to where one lives and thus is irrelevant.

By leaps and bounds means with startlingly rapid progress.

Slowdown means to decline gradually.

Out of all the options, option C is the best fit.

Hence **option C** is correct.

8.

The word nuances which means *a very slight difference or variation,* is appropriately used and no other options fit in as well.

Hence **option E** is correct.

9.

From the passage, we can see that the risk to developing nations is huge. This can only be true if if the number of cyber attacks are on an increase. Hence, *slump* is incorrect as it means *to slow down*.

The only option that fits is option C; rise.

Hence **option C** is correct.

^{10.} SmartKeeda

The word expertise means skill or knowledge and does not fit in with the sentence at all. Also, the blank needs to be filled with an *adjective*, whereas *expertise* is a noun.

Deprived which means lacking a specified benefit that is considered important renders the sentence a meaning that is opposite to the given context and is incorrect.

Similarly, privileged and favored are illogical too.

Advanced means developed or skillful and is a perfect fit.

Hence, **option A** is correct.



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
