## Explanation:

1. For the first blank, as the 'We were given' is being talked about, so the word which can suit the requirement is "attended" as it means 'to be present at (an event, meeting, or function)', as it fits into the sentence grammatically.

This eliminates all other options (A, C and E).

For the second blank, 'met in the evenings' holds the context and suggests us that the sentence is in past tense therefore "lived" fits here perfectly as it means 'to spend one's life in a particular way or under particular circumstances'. This ruled out option 'D'.

Meanings of the given words:

**Attend (Verb):** to be present at (an event, meeting, or function).

**Live (Verb):** to spend one's life in a particular way or under particular circumstances.

**Organise (Verb):** to arrange systematically; order.

**Reside (Verb):** to have one's permanent home in a particular place.

**Stay (Verb):** to remain in the same place.

So, the correct option is B.

2. For the first blank, 'has been orphaned and' holds the context and makes the use of "rescued" perfect to the context as it means 'to save (someone) from a dangerous or difficult situation' and completes the sentence.

This eliminates all other options (C, D and E).

Also, for the second blank, 'rehabilitate it' in the sentence holds the context of the sentence and allows us to use "eventually" as it means 'in the end, especially after a long delay, dispute, or series of problems' and fits into the context completely as "event" will change the context of the sentence completely and that will make the sentence absurd.

This eliminates option C.

Meanings of the given words:

**Rescued (Verb):** to save (someone) from a dangerous or difficult situation.

**Eventually (Adverb):** in the end, especially after a long delay, dispute, or series of problems.

**Saved (Verb):** to keep safe or rescue (someone or something) from harm or danger.

**Event (Noun):** a thing that happens or takes place, especially one of importance.

**Accidentally (Adverb):** by chance; inadvertently.

So, the correct option is A.

3. For the first blank, 'out of the 36' just before the blank is enough to suggest the use of "states" as it means 'a nation or territory considered as an organized political community under one government', as the sentence also demands a plural noun.

This eliminates all other options (A, B, C and E).

Also, for the second blank, 'West Bengal' needs a word which means 'of or near a coast' here, and the only word which can come is "coastal".

Meanings of the given words:

**Beach (Noun):** a pebbly or sandy shore, especially by the sea between high- and low-water marks.

**Landlocked (Adjective):** (of a country or region) almost or entirely surrounded by land.

**State (Noun):** a nation or territory considered as an organized political community under one government.

**Coastal (Adjective):** of or near a coast.

**City (Noun):** a large town.

So, the correct option is D.

4. For the first blank, 'has pre-' just before the blank is enough to suggest the use of "booked" as it means 'to reserve (accommodation, a place, etc.)', as we need a verb in third form.

This eliminates all other options except 'B'.

"Ordered" becomes invalid due to 'scientist' just after the second blank, as we need a plural word in the second blank and this ruled out 'B' too.

Meanings of the given words:

**Book (Verb):** to reserve (accommodation, a place, etc.).

**Developers (Noun):** a person or thing that develops something.

**Order (Noun):** the arrangement or disposition of people or things in relation to each other according to a particular sequence, pattern, or method.

**Scientist (Noun):** a person who is studying or has expert knowledge of one or more of the natural or physical sciences.

So, the correct option is D.

5. For the first blank, 'are likely to' holds the context and makes the use of "succeed" perfect to the context as it means 'to achieve the desired aim or result' and completes the sentence.

This eliminates all other options (B, D and E).

Also, for the second blank, 'that too could' in the sentence holds the context of the sentence and allows us to use "result" as it means 'to occur or follow as the consequence of something' and fits into the context completely as we need a verb in plural form and "benefit" will make the sentence absurd.

This eliminates option C.

Meanings of the given words:

**Succeed (Verb):** to achieve the desired aim or result.

**Result (Verb):** to occur or follow as the consequence of something.

**Proceed (Verb):** to begin a course of action.

**Benefit (Verb):** to receive an advantage; profit.

So, the correct option is A.

6. For the first blank, it can be understood that 'different universities' holds the context as it demands a word that in plural form. The word "academics" which means 'a teacher or scholar in a university or other institute of higher education', fits here by all means.

This eliminates options A and E.

Besides, for the second blank, 'to go ahead with the exams as' holds the context and the only word which can suit the requirement of the context is "planned", as it means 'to decide on and make arrangements for in advance' as we need a verb in third form. This eliminates options C and D.

Meanings of the given words:

**Academic (Noun):** a teacher or scholar in a university or other institute of higher education.

**Discussed (Verb):** to talk about (something) with a person or people.

**Planned (Verb):** to decide on and make arrangements for in advance.

**Suppose (Verb):** to think or assume that something is true or probable but lack proof or certain knowledge.

**Institute (Noun):** an organization having a particular purpose, especially one that is involved with science, education, or a specific profession.

**Expect (Verb):** to regard (something) as likely to happen.

So, the correct option is B.

7. The sentence mentions that 'several' and this shows that it's the matter of plural noun. Thus the first blank should provide a noun, which suggests that "allegations" to be perfect for the first blank as it means 'a claim or assertion that someone has done something illegal or wrong, typically one made without proof'. However, the deciding factor is the second blank here.

This eliminates all three options (A, B and E).

Also, for the second blank 'some' holds the context. This makes "countries" fit as it means 'a nation with its own government, occupying a particular territory'. This ruled out option 'C' as we need a plural word here and a noun also.

Meanings of the given words:

**Allegation (Noun):** a claim or assertion that someone has done something illegal or wrong, typically one made without proof.

**Country (Noun):** a nation with its own government, occupying a particular territory.

**Restriction (Noun):** a limiting condition or measure, especially a legal one.

**State (Noun):** the particular condition that someone or something is in at a specific time.

So, the correct option is D.

8. The first blank requires a noun in plural form to support the 'there were'. "Bunkers" means 'a reinforced underground shelter, typically for use in wartime' and thus, fits the blank well.

This eliminates all other options (A, B and E).

Besides, 'where they' in the sentence suggests that a new word to be added to the sentence must be in past tense as entire sentence is in past form. This makes "fired" fit for the blank, which means 'to discharge a gun or other weapon in order to propel (a bullet or projectile)'. This leads to eliminate option 'D' as well.

Meanings of the given words:

**Bunker (Noun):** a reinforced underground shelter, typically for use in wartime.

**Fire (Verb):** to discharge a gun or other weapon in order to propel (a bullet or projectile).

**Army (Noun):** an organized military force equipped for fighting on land.

**Kill (Verb):** to cause the death of (a person, animal, or other living thing).

**Live (Verb):** to remain alive.

So, the correct option is C.

9. The first blank requires a noun in plural form as 'various' holds the context. "Reports" means 'a spoken or written description of an event or situation, especially one intended for publication or broadcasting in the media', which makes it perfect to the context.

This eliminates all three options (B, C and E).

Besides, the second blank requires a verb to support the 'likely to' and this makes "move" correct as it means 'to apply formally to (a court or assembly) for something' as all other options are absurd. "Moved" in this place will make the sentence illogical.

This eliminates option 'D'.

Meanings of the given words:

**Report (Noun):** a spoken or written description of an event or situation, especially one intended for publication or broadcasting in the media.

**Move (Verb):** to apply formally to (a court or assembly) for something.

**Go (Verb):** to move from one place to another; travel.

**Datum (Noun):** a piece of information.

So, the correct option is A.

10. Going with the requirement of the context, “safe” and “effective” fit perfectly as both mean ‘protected from or not exposed to danger or risk; not likely to be harmed or lost’ and ‘successful in producing a desired or intended result’ respectively and complete the sentence as we cannot say about the which word to come first.

This eliminates all other options (C and E).

‘Doubtful’ becomes invalid because ‘crushing of virus’ is discussed in the sentence.

Meanings of the given words:

**Safe (Adjective):** protected from or not exposed to danger or risk; not likely to be harmed or lost.

**Effective (Adjective):** successful in producing a desired or intended result.

**Doubtful (Adjective):** feeling uncertain about something.

**New (Adjective):** produced, introduced, or discovered recently or now for the first time; not existing before.

So, the correct option is D.
