Explanations:

1. Fragment C of the sentence is erroneous.

Here, the phrase 'like to' should be replaced by 'likely to' to make it a grammatically correct sentence.

Be likely to:

Be likely to allows us to express a probable action.

Ex. It's likely to rain tomorrow. (It is probably going to rain tomorrow.)

Correct Sentence:

In the next 80 years flooding around the planet's land masses is **likely to** rise by almost 50 per cent, endangering many millions of coastal dwellers.

Option C is hence the correct answer.

2. The error lies in fragment D of the sentence.

Usage of the preposition 'in' after the verb 'turn' is wrong'. It should be 'turn into' in the context of the sentence.

The Question Bank

Turn into (Phrasal Verb):

To become (a particular kind of thing or person); be transformed into.

Ex. The slight drizzle turned into a downpour.

Correct Sentence:

A mix of more extreme storm surges, combined with ever higher sea levels, will sweep away the world's beaches and turn millions of comfortable US citizens **into** climate refugees.

Option D is hence the correct answer.



3. Formation of fragment A is erroneous.

Here, the fragment should be made in 'inverted form' to make it a grammatically correct sentence.

Note: Inverted sentences are required with certain grammar structures, or used as a means of sentences stress or emphasis.

Rule of Inversion after 'So':

"So + adjective ... that" combines with the verb "to be."

Ex. So strange was the situation that I couldn't sleep.

Ex. So difficult is the test that students need three months to prepare.

Correct Sentence:

So powerful was the explosion that rocked Beirut on August 4th that people in Cyprus, 240 km away, thought they had suffered an earthquake.

Option A is hence the correct answer.

4. Fragment B of the sentence is erroneous.

Here, instead of 'cramp', its past participle form 'cramped' should be used.

Cramped (Adjective):

Uncomfortably small or restricted.

Ex. Staff had to work in cramped conditions.

Correct Sentence:

Strong winds and severe flooding forced many to break quarantine and flee to **cramped** evacuation centers, where social-distancing protocols are virtually impossible to maintain.

Option B is hence the correct answer.



5. Fragment D is erroneous here.

Usage of the possessive adjective 'its' is ungrammatical in the sentence. As the subject 'Artificial agents' is plural, 'its' should be replaced by 'their' to make it a grammatically correct sentence.

Correct Sentence:

Explainable artificial intelligence is a branch of artificial intelligence research that examines how artificial agents can be made more transparent and trustworthy to **their** human users.

Option D is hence the correct answer.

6. The error lies in fragment A of the sentence.

There is an idiomatic expression error in this fragment. The correct idiom to be used here is - keep one's powder 'dry', and not 'wet'.

Keep one's powder dry (Idiom):

To be prepared to act with little advance notice. The phrase refers to gunpowder, which needs to be kept dry in order to work properly.

Ex. I know this job opportunity didn't work out, but keep your powder dry for the next one that comes along.

Option A is hence the correct answer.

7. Fragment C of the sentence is erroneous.

Usage of the definite article 'the' is missing right before the name of a government body; Kerala State Electricity Board.

Correct Sentence:

Seventeen dams managed by the Irrigation Department and **the** Kerala State Electricity Board across the State are currently discharging water.

Option C is hence the correct answer.

8. The sentence is error free.

Option E is hence the correct answer.

9. Fragment C of the sentence is erroneous.

Here, the usage of 'to' just after 'in accordance' is grammatically incorrect and it needs to be replaced by 'with' to make it correct. This is because-

in accordance to - refer to agreement or conformity with people and their beliefs. (informal)

in accordance with - refer to agreement or conformity with rules, laws and regulations. (formal)

Correct Sentence:

The Comptroller and Auditor General can be removed from office only by the President in accordance with the procedure mentioned in the Constitution.

Option C is hence the correct answer.

10. Fragment D of the sentence is erroneous.

Here, the usage of 'regards' is grammatically incorrect and it should be replaced by 'regard'. This is because the phrase 'in regards to' is incorrect. The correct one is 'in regard to'.

You may hear people say "in regards to," but the proper phrase is singular: "in regard to."

Correct Sentence:

The Consumer Confidence Survey is conducted by the Reserve Bank of India to find out how optimistic the consumers are in regard to their financial situation.
