## **Explanations**:

1. Coming to Statement I, there is no error in the sentence since it is grammatically and contextually right. Therefore, it is a correct sentence.

Statement II is not correct since there is an error in the degree of the comparison used in the sentence. There are two options and the comparison is between two things. This means comparative degree should be used and not the superlative degree as used in the sentence. The correct sentence would have been: <u>But it is also true that they are unable to decide **the better among the two options** available in front of them.</u>

Statement III is not correct since there is an error in the degree of the comparison in the sentence. When two qualities of the same person are compared, the comparative degree as in -er is not used but more + Adjective is used. Here, the correct statement would have been: <u>It seems that the perpetrators of the crime are more wise than brave.</u>

Statement IV is correct since there is no grammatical error in the sentence. Therefore, there is no correction required in it.

Only II and III are incorrect whereas the rest of the two are correct statement. This makes option A the correct choice among the given options. 2. Statement I is not correct since *has* should have been used with the International Monetary Fund since it is a single organization and *have* used in this statement is not right. The correct sentence would have been: *The International Monetary Fund* **has decided** that it will dole out subsidies to the developing countries in the present financial year.

All the other statements II, III and IV are correct as there is no grammatical and contextual error in those sentences.

This makes option C the correct choice among the given options.

**3.** Statement I is correct since there is no error in it either grammatically or contextually. Therefore no correction is required in this sentence.

Statement II is not correct since there is an error in the usage of the phrase *give a call* since it is implied that the central bank will decide the future course of action. *Take a call* should have been used in this context. The correct sentence would be: <u>The Monetary Policy Committee of the bank will only **take a** <u>call</u> regarding this after the inflation framework is published by the Government.</u>

Statement III and IV are grammatically and contextually correct. No correction is required in either of the two statements. None of the given options gives the correct combination of correct / incorrect statements.

This makes option E the correct choice among the given options.

**4.** All the given statements are correct grammatically and contextually. No correction is required in any of the given statements.

This makes option E the correct choice among the given options.

**5.** Statement I is not correct since according to the rules of grammar, it is necessary that if any principal verb is used after *from*, the *-ing* form of the verb should be used. It is not correct to use *prevented from to do their duties.* The correct usage would have been *prevented from doing their duties.* The correct sentence would be: <u>It was alleged that Police were **prevented from doing** their duties.</u>

Statement II is not correct since there is an error in the usage of the verb in the part *did not allow the Police entering the crime scene.* The correct usage would have been *did not allow the police to enter the crime scene.* The correct sentence would be: <u>The public were so angry with the incident that they</u> *did not allow the Police to enter* the crime scene.

Statements III and IV are correct and therefore no correction is required in such statements.

This makes option E the correct choice among the given options.

**6.** I. The government has been battling troubles **for** weeks now- The correct word here is *for* which implies the government has been dealing with issues *since quite some time*.

II. He faced criticism **for** his handling of the security issue- He faced flak *because of how* he handled the security issue. The correct word is *for*.

III. All citizens are expected to serve in the military at age 18- This is correct.

Hence, option C is correct.

7. I. The biggest risk to the economy is short-run populism with long-run side-effects- The error is due to

II. The oil price surge and cooling off is dictated by global geopolitical tremors.

III. Some of the dark clouds that **hovered** over the economy through the year have now receded- The event has already occurred and thus, *hovered* is the correct word.

Hence, option C is correct.

8. I. In a liberal democracy, governments must refrain from stopping people who may **want** to contest-The error here pertains to tense usage. The event has not yet happened and the theme is 'what should ideally be done' in a situation. The correct form would be **want**.

II. The Rafale deal has been the subject of heated claims and counter-claims.- This is correct.

III. The Centre is pushing for lower rates of GST for most goods and services. - This is correct.

Hence, option A is correct.

**9.** All the statements are correct and contain no error.

Hence, option E is correct.

**10.** I. India is home to some of the worst mine disasters **and** there is a need to have the mining activity regulated- The error is due use of incorrect conjunction. Here, both fragments move in the same direction and thus 'and' is the correct word instead of 'but'.

II. Statutory norms related to data protection are seen as essential to protect citizens from any breach of their informational privacy- The word 'norms' is plural and hence 'are' would be correct instead of 'is'.

III. Timely confirmation helps donors start on early treatment and take precautionary measures- This is correct.

Hence, option C is correct.
