<u>Fragment D</u>: it still **remained** a media event Here, the error is due to incorrect tense usage. The event is not in the past tense and hence *remained* will not be used. Correct: it still **remains** a media event

Fragment E is correct.

Hence, option E is correct.

2. Fragment D, in bold, is already correct.

<u>Fragment A</u>: While the issue of farmer suicides **have** The word *issue* indicates singular subject and hence should ideally be followed by *has*. Correct: While the issue of farmer suicides **has**

<u>Fragment B</u>: been studied **extent** from the Here, the *word extent* means *degree* and renders the statement meaningless. Correct: been studied **extensively** from the

Fragment C: viewpoint of the suicide victims, the **victim's** Here, there are multiple victims and thus apostrophe would be after the *letter 's'* of victims. Correct: viewpoint of the suicide victims, the **victims'**

Fragment E is correct.

Hence, option E is correct.

3. Fragment E, in bold, is already correct.

<u>Fragment A</u>: It was reasonable to **except** that the government The word *except* means *apart from* and is meaningless here. Expect means anticipate and is correct. Correct: It was reasonable to **expect** that the government

Fragment C: marked 2017–18, which **look** protests by farmers Here, the author is trying to state that the year 2017-18 *witnessed protests*. *Look* is grammatically incorrect.

Correct: marked 2017–18, which saw protests by farmers

Fragment D: and middle-caste groups **for** lower returns in agriculture, and The previous fragment states that there were protests in 2017 and the reason is stated in this fragment as lower agro output. The correct preposition here will be *over* and not *for*. Correct: and middle-caste groups **over** lower returns in agriculture, and

Fragment B is correct.

Hence, option B is correct.

4. Fragment D, in bold, is already correct.

<u>Fragment A</u>: There are those **that** oppose debt relief to peasants on the Here, those refers to people. *That* may be used when referring to people, animals, groups, or things, but *who* is preferred when referring to people.

Fragment B: ground that it constitutes a "moral hazard," but **reframe** from Here, *Reframe* is grammatically and contextually absurd. The next fragment indicates that moral hazard is not applied to willful defaulters. The correct word will be *refrain*. Correct: ground that it constitutes a "moral hazard," but **refrain** from

Fragment E: even when some of **there** companies are wilful defaulters. *There* should be replaced by *their*. Correct: even when some of **their** companies are wilful defaulters.

Fragment D: five years of age in India is serious, **worst** than the same in Here, we need a *comparative adjective* and thus, worse is the correct form to be used. Worst is a *superlative adjective* and is used when one compares three or more things with one another. Correct: five years of age in India is serious, **worse** than the same in

Fragment E: Bangladesh and some of the African countries south of Sahara.

The article 'the' is used for referring to specific things. Here, the Sahara refers to the Sahara desert and is a specific place that is being referred to.

Fragment C: power, it did not do enough to **spurred** private The sentence structure is incorrect due to error in tense usage. The correct word here would be *spur* instead of *spurred*. Spur refers to *encourage*. Correct: power, it did not do enough to **spur** private

Fragment E ways **harms** the investment climate further.

The actions of the new government have already adversely affected the investment climate. The correct form here will be *harmed*.

Correct: ways harmed the investment climate further.

Fragment A is correct.

Hence, option A is correct.

7. Fragment B, in bold, is already correct.

<u>Fragment A</u>: The rapid **expand** of internet-enabled media and The fragment needs a *noun* instead of a *verb* and thus expansion is the correct word. Correct: The rapid **expansion** of internet-enabled media and

Fragment C: a new wave of political enthusiasm with

The fragment is incorrect due to error in terms of preposition There is enthusiasm *among* people and not *with* people. With here implies enthusiasm is *physically present* with people which is absurd. Correct: a new wave of political enthusiasm **among**

<u>Fragment E:</u> avenues for social relations among millenniums. *Millennium* is a period of 1000 years and does not make sense here. The correct word is millennials which refers to a person reaching young adulthood in the early 21st century. Correct: avenues for social relations among millennials.

Fragment D is correct.

Hence, option D is correct.

8. Fragment A, in bold, is already correct.

Fragment B: Sabha has decided to **sent** 'Has decided' in present tense and hence *sent* should be replaced with *send*. Correct: Sabha has decided to **send**

Fragment D: Commission Bill **of** the Parliamentary The Bill will be sent **to** the committee and not **of** the committee. Correct: Commission Bill **to** the Parliamentary

Fragment E Standing Committee (PSC) on Health **on** review. The Bill would be sent **for** review purposes. **On** review does not make sense. Correct: Standing Committee (PSC) on Health **for** review.

Fragment C is correct.

Hence, option C is correct.

9. The Error lies in fragment B. The noun 'United States' has to be preceded by the definite article 'The' to make it a grammatically correct sentence.

The correct sentence will therefore be:

Hence, option B is correct.
