Explanations :

1. All the fragments are correct.

Hence, option E is correct.

2. Fragment C is incorrect. It uses incorrect pronoun *which* instead of *who*. *Who* is used for living beings while *which* is used for *inanimate objects*.

<u>Correct sentence</u>: Despite the unethical business practices adopted by publishers of such journals, the number of researchers **who** publish in them has been increasing at an alarming rate.

Hence, option C is correct.

3. Fragment A has an error due to use of the word *principle* which means *a fundamental truth or proposition*. The correct word would be principal which means *first in order of importance/ main*.

Correct sentence: The **principal** task of the Finance Commission is to assess the revenue and cost disabilities of the States and make recommendations to offset these disabilities through tax devolution and grants.

Hence, option A is correct.

4. Fragment D is erroneous due to use of the word *weather* which is used to refer to the *climate* instead of the **conjunction** *whether*.

<u>Correct sentence</u>: Since the essence of nonalignment was freedom of thought and action, India insisted that it was valid **whether** there was one bloc or no bloc.

Hence, option D is correct.

Hence, option A is correct.

5. Fragment B is erroneous due to use of the word *advisories*. As per the statement, there is a lot of tension between USA on the one hand and Russia and China on the other. Hence, *advisory*, meaning 'having the power to make recommendations but not enforcing them" is not a good fit here.

Instead, the correct word is *adversaries* meaning *enemies*.

<u>Correct sentence</u>: The United States has identified both China and Russia as **adversaries**, whose leaders, Xi Jinping and Vladimir Putin, are strong and determined to stand up to a faltering Donald Trump.

Hence, option B is correct.

6. Fragment D contains an error due to the use of *effected* instead of *affected*. Effect refers to *a change* which is a result or consequence of an action. Affect means have an effect on; make a difference to.

Correct statement: If no one spits in public places and if everyone practices cough and sneeze etiquette, the TB <u>affected</u> will also fall in line.

Hence, option D is correct.

7. Fragment B contains an error with respect to the use of the word *promotes*. There is a subject-verb disagreement here as the scheme is singular and needs a singular verb- *promote*.

Correct statement: The Janani Suraksha Yojana launched in 2005 is a national programme to **promote** institutional delivery that specifically targets the 10 states of India where institutional deliveries are the lowest.

Hence, option B is correct.

8. Fragment C contains an error with respect to the word *exasperated* which means frustrated and does not fit in here. The correct word would be *exacerbated* which means *to worsen a situation*.

Correct statement: Farm incomes have been unviable for a long time now and have further been <u>exacerbated</u> by the vagaries of the monsoon and international markets.

Hence, option C is correct.

9. Fragment C contains an error due to incorrect article usage. The article *An* is to be followed by a *vowel*. This is not the case here. The correct article would be *the* here.

Correct statement: The mounting rural unrest provides an opportunity to the ruling political party to introduce <u>the</u> much needed agricultural reforms.

Hence, option C is correct.

10. Fragment A contains an error. *At of a crisis* sounds meaningless. Also, the holding of peace talks indicates a way *out* of problems. The correct phrase is *way out* which refers to a potential solution to a problem.

Correct sentence: The peace talks point the way *out* of a crisis that seemed last year to be spiralling out of control, after the exchange of personal and nuclear threats.

Hence, option A is correct.
