## **Explanations:**

1. There is an error in the Part C of the sentence since there is no subject-verb agreement in this part of the sentence. The corresponding subject here is in plural number as we are talking about incidents and the verb should be also in the plural case. Therefore, *have been* should have been used here. There is no error in any other part of the sentence.

#### The correct sentence would be:

There have been a couple of minor localised incidents of law and order which **have been handled** very professionally.

This makes Option B the correct choice among the given options.

2. There is an error in the Part B of the sentence since here we are saying that something happened because of the recent decision of the government. It should have been *due to*. Other parts of the sentence have no error and therefore no correction is required to be carried out in any of the other parts of the given sentence.

#### The correct sentence would be:

Since then tourism, horticulture and other sectors of our economy suffered tremendous losses due to the decision of the government to restrict movement of civilians on the only road link of Srinagar-Jammu.

This makes Option D the correct choice among the given options.

**3.** There is no error in any of the given parts of the sentence and that is why no correction is required here.

This makes Option E the correct choice among the given options.

**4.** There is an error in the Part C of the given sentence since here we have used adjective to modify another adjective. This is not correct as far as the parts of speech are concerned. It should be an adverb modifying an adjective. Therefore it should have been *truly honoured*. There is no error in any other part of the given sentence.

#### The correct sentence would be:

It is such a privilege to be taking Prime Minister Modi on an adventure into the Indian wilderness and I feel **truly honoured** to get to spend time with this remarkable world leader.

This makes Option A the correct choice among the given options.

**5.** There is no error in any of the given parts of the sentence and therefore no correction is required in this sentence.

This makes Option E the correct choice among the given options.

**6.** The error lies in the fragment B of the sentence.

#### Reason:

Usage of the preposition 'for' in fragment B is incorrect. The correct prepositional phrase is 'in comparison to'.

Instead of the preposition 'for', the preposition 'to' should be used to make it a grammatically correct sentence.

#### **Correct Sentence:**

Our bond market is stunted **in comparison to** those of more financially evolved nations, particularly that for corporate paper.

Option B is hence the correct answer.

7. The error lies in the fragment B of the sentence.

#### Reason:

Usage of the superlative form of the word 'safe' given in fragment B lacks parallelism with the comparative form of the word 'strong' given in bold.

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Instead of 'safest', the comparative form 'safer' should be used to make it a grammatically correct sentence.

#### **Correct Sentence:**

With reforms, a stronger bond market will make India's financial system **safer** and free up liquid, low-risk, long-term funds for economic development.

Option B is hence the correct answer.



**8.** The error lies in the fragment B of the sentence.

#### Reason:

The correct phrasal verb of 'call' appropriate for this sentence is 'calls for'.

#### Call for (phrasal verb)

Meaning: Make necessary.

E.g.: Desperate times call for desperate measures.

Instead of 'with', 'for' should be used to make it a grammatically correct sentence.

#### **Correct Sentence:**

To put it bluntly, the current situation **calls for** fiscal expansion, along with measures to revive private investment in infrastructure.

Option B is hence the correct answer.

**9.** The error lies in the fragment C of the sentence.

#### Reason:

Usage of the verb 'love' shows that it is in plural form and must take a plural subject with it. Instead of the single subject 'spectator', the plural subject 'spectators' should be used in order to make it a grammatically correct sentence.

#### **Correct Sentence:**

Women's badminton has been a display of exquisite skill, wrist turns, drop shots and exhausting rallies that **spectators love**, but drain contestants physically.

Option C is hence the correct answer.



**10.** The error lies in the fragment B of the sentence.

#### Reason:

The given sentence is in simple present tense. Therefore, the fragment B should also be in simple present instead of present perfect tense in order to make it a grammatically correct sentence.

#### **Correct Sentence:**

The Amazon tussle highlights the precarious balance that must be achieved between national concerns and international efforts to protect the global commons.

Option B is hence the correct answer.





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
