Explanations:

1. The error is in part A od the sentence.

Reason:

When an "if" clause and a principal clause (which is in future tense) are present in a single sentence, the 'if' clause should always be in the present tense.

Correct Sentence:

If you come to our house tomorrow, we shall play hide and seek together.

Hence, option A is the correct answer.

2. The error is in part C of the sentence.

Reason:

An infinitive is generally followed by "to". But it is not an essential part of it. Some verbs do not take 'to' after it.

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"Made / Make" is never followed by 'to'. It is a bare infinitive.

Other examples: bid, let, see, hear, need, dare etc.

Correct Sentence:

The cruel sister made her little brother cry as he tore her dress while playing.

Hence, option C is the correct answer.

3. The error is in part B of the sentence.

Reason:

"Ascent" means 'a climb or walk to the summit of a mountain or hill' which does not make any sense in the given context.

The correct word in place of 'ascent' would be 'assent' which means 'the expression of approval or agreement'.

Correct Sentence:

The strict boss did not give her **assent** to the employee's whimsical request.

Hence, option B is the correct answer.

4. The error is in part C of the sentence.

Reason:

There is a comparison in the sentence. When a comparison is made between two things, parallelism should be maintained in both sides of the comparison.

'The harder you struggle' should be followed by 'the faster you would reach your destination'.

Correct Sentence:

The harder you struggle, the **faster** you would reach your destination.

Hence, option C is the correct answer.

5. The error is in part B of the sentence.

Reason:

The preposition 'unto' after 'confide' is erroneous. "Confide" is always followed by 'in', or 'to'.

Correct Sentence:

I always confided in / to my friend when I was a child and he never divulged my secrets to anyone.

Hence, option B is the correct answer.

6. The error is in part C of the sentence.

Reason:

The usage of the expression 'pages after pages' is erroneous. This phrase is always used without the '-s'. The correct expression would be 'page after page'.

Correct Sentence:

Last week, the teacher explained the book page after page and I understood everything.

Hence, option C is the correct answer.



7. The error is in part A of the sentence.

Reason:

The usage of 'make up' is erroneous in the given sentence. The correct phrasal verb in place of 'make up' would be 'make up for'.

Make up for [something] => to provide something good, so that something bad seems less important

Correct Sentence:

You have to **make up for** the time you wasted this puja by studying hard if you really want to perform well in the examination.

Hence, option A is the correct answer.

8. The error is in part C of the sentence.

Reason:

The word "unless" itself embodies the negative sense and it does not require "does not" after it.

Hence, the usage of 'does not' in the given sentence is erroneous.

Correct Sentence:

The condition of the healthcare system will not improve unless the committee recommends robust policy changes.

Hence, option C is the correct answer.

9. The error is in part C of the sentence.

Reason:

"Marry" is never followed any preposition.

Hence, the usage of the preposition 'with' after 'marry' is erroneous.

Correct Sentence:

Abhilash finally decided to marry the girl his uncle chose for him.

Hence, option C is the correct answer.

10. The sentence is absolutely correct in every aspect.

There is no error in the given sentence.

Hence, option E is the correct answer.



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
