Explanations:

1. There is an error in the Part C of the given sentence and we can see that here we are talking about a word that will modify the verb of the given sentence. Here we are saying that we declare ourselves as loudly as possible. This would have been the correct usage of the phrase as here loud has been used been: and that is actually adjective. The correct sentence would have an In our urgency to declare ourselves against these heinous acts as loudly as possible, we forget about the voices we drown with our self-righteous anger.

This makes Option C the correct choice among the given options.

2. There is no error in the given sentence and that is why no correction is required here in this case.

This makes Option E the correct choice among the given options.

3. There is an error in the Part B of the given sentence because here we are speaking in the passive voice and therefore the structure should have been 'to+ be-verb + present participle' however here it is not correct. The correct one would have been to be hanged. The correct sentence would have been:

Asking for the accused of "heinous" cases of rape **to be hanged** is, yet again, another way of separating ourselves from blame, because, in legal terms, the death penalty would apply to the "rarest of the rare" cases of rape.

This makes Option B the correct choice among the given options.

4. "Pave the way for" is a standard English expression/phrase.

It cannot be changed whimsically.

The usage of 'beyond' after 'pave the way' is thus erroneous in the given sentence.

Hence, option C is the correct answer.

5. The given sentence is absolutely correct.

There is no error in the sentence.

Hence, option E is the correct answer.



6. The wording of the sentence requires a noun after the adjective 'public'.

But, 'perceptive' is an adjective.

This is erroneous.

The correct word (=noun) in place of 'perceptive' would be 'perception'.

Hence, option B is the correct answer.

7. There is an error of the subject-verb agreement in this sentence because the subject is in singular number whereas the corresponding verb is in plural form only. The subject *the transportation sector* is singular in number and that is why the corresponding verb will be *accounts for*. There is no error in any other part of the sentence.

The correct sentence would be:

Globally, the transportation sector **accounts for** a quarter of all energy-related carbon dioxide emissions and its share will only increase in future.

This makes Option B the correct choice among the given options.

8. There is an error in the Part B of the given sentence since we have used the infinitive form of the verb here and that is why the present indefinite tense should be used of the corresponding verb. Here *convert* should have been used. There is no error in any other part of the given sentence.

The correct sentence would be:

We have developed a catalyst, a solid material that **helps to convert** matter from one form to another just as nature would but much faster.

This makes Option B the correct choice among the given options.

9. There is no error in the given sentence since all the parts are correct grammatically. Therefore no correction is required in this context.

This makes Option E the correct choice among the given options.



10. There is an error in the Part C of the given sentence since here the adjective form *commercial* has been used whereas the succeeding word is an adjective as well. An adverb can only modify an adjective and an adjective cannot do the work. Therefore the usage of the word *commercial* would not be correct here but the correct usage would have been *commercially*. There is no error in any other part of the sentence.

The correct sentence would be:

With petroleum prices being low currently, the new process may not be commercially viable yet.

This makes Option C the correct choice among the given options.







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
