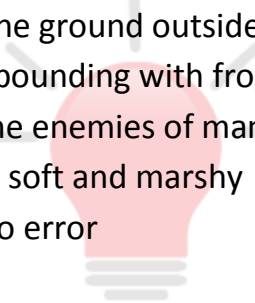

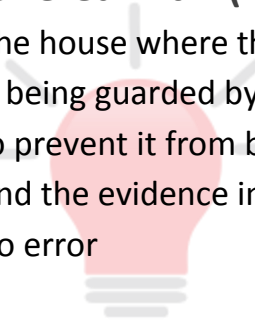

Explanations:**1.**

In part B, 'a great rush' signifies more than one person and thus 'visitors' must be used in place of 'visitor'.

Hence, option B is correct.

2.

If your actions or remarks are aimed at a particular person or group, you intend that the person or group should notice them and be influenced by them.

Ex. Advertising aimed at children should be curbed.

In part D, 'aimed before' hence must be replaced with 'aimed at' to make it a grammatically correct sentence.

Hence, option D is correct.

3.

The sentence is absolutely correct and thus has no error in it.

Option E is hence the correct answer.

4.

In part D, 'interfere' must be replaced with 'interferes' to match the tense of the sentence.

Hence, option D is correct.

5.

The sentence is absolutely correct and thus has no error in it.

Option E is hence the correct answer.

6.

In part C, 'for' must be added before 'a few minutes' to make the sentence grammatically appropriate.

Hence, option C is correct.

7.

In part C, 'contain' must be replaced with 'contained' to match the tense of the sentence.

Hence, option C is correct.

8.

In part D, 'being' must be used before 'interfered' to match the tense and voice of the sentence.

Hence, option D is correct.

9.

The sentence is absolutely correct and thus has no error in it.

Option E is hence the correct answer.

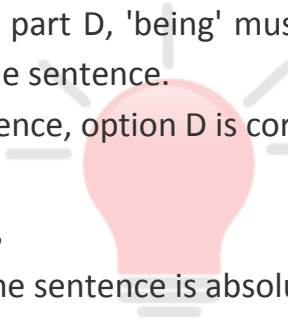
10.

When two or more connected nouns refer to the same person or thing, the Article is ordinarily used before the first only; but when two or more connected nouns refer to different persons or things, the Article is used before each.

Ex. Sir Surendranath was a great orator and statesman.

Similarly, in part D of the given sentence, the repetition of article 'a' is erroneous and hence must be removed to make it a grammatically correct sentence.

Hence, option D is correct.



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
