Explanations :

1. The fragment A of the sentence is erroneous. The error is in the usage of perfect participle. Here, past participle 'provided' must be used instead of 'providing'.

Note: The perfect participle indicates completed action. You form the perfect participle by putting the present participle **having** in front of the past participle **'provided'**.

The correct sentence would therefore be, "With the intervening period **having provided** a wealth of data points and policy developments, including the momentous roll-out of the Goods and Services Tax, there was a clear need to update and refresh outcomes and forecasts."

Option A is hence the correct answer.

2. The sentence is absolutely correct and thus has no error in it.

Option E is hence the correct answer.

3. There is an error in part C of the sentence.

We have to replace 'after' with 'with'

Regard someone or something with something (Idiom):

to look upon someone or something with a certain attitude or with certain expectations.

Ex. The child regarded the teacher with a questioning expression.

The correct sentence would therefore be, "Water from shallow wells should be **regarded with** suspicion, as it may be contaminated."

Option C is hence the correct answer.

4. There is an error in part D of the sentence.

Here the verb 'wants' in the part D is wrongly used. It should be replaced by 'want' as the subject 'customers' is a plural noun. Hence the verb will be replaced by the plural form of the verb.

The correct sentence would be

"The new mobile app Yatra Mini, features only the relevant product lines-bus, train, and budget hotels to appeal to customers who have limitations of phone memory space and want to keep data usage to the minimum."

Hence, option D is correct.

5. The fragment C of the sentence is erroneous because of the usage of past form of the 'be' verb.

The correct sentence would therefore be, "China has justified the construction of a road in the Sikkim sector, claiming that the area is undoubtedly located on its side of the border."

Option C is hence the correct answer.

6. The sentence has an error in part C.

Since the sentence has been started by a past tense verb 'issued', the next part of the sentence can't have a present tense verb. Hence 'demand' should be changed into "demanded".

The correct sentence would be, "The Pakistan foreign ministry issued a statement, claiming that India has scaled down its forces in the POK, but **demanded** that New Delhi must pull back all its troops to end the military standoff in the area."

Option C is hence the correct answer.

7. The all sentences is fully correct.

Hence, option E is correct.

8. Part A has an error.

We have to replace 'the' with 'a', we use 'the' to specify something; however, there is no specific drop of water being talked about here. We also use 'the' at the beginning to refer to someone or something that you have already mentioned or identified.

The correct sentence would be

"A drop of water may travel thousands of miles between the time it evaporates into the atmosphere, and the time it falls to the earth again as rain, sleet, or snow."

Hence, option A is correct.

9. The fragment A of the sentence has an error of preposition.

The correct idiom is - Come off with flying colours. And therefore, the preposition 'in' must be replaced by 'with' to make it a grammatically correct sentence.

The correct sentence would therefore be, "Cadets, who came off **with** flying colours after training at the Air Force Academy at the Combined Graduation Parade reviewed by the Defence Minister."

Option A is hence the correct answer.

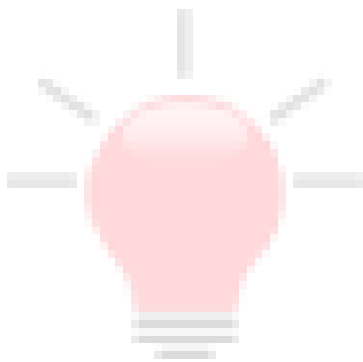
10. There is an error in part A of the sentence.

The word 'celebrating' will be replaced with 'being celebrated' as the sentence is in passive form. The past participle form of the verb will be used with the 'ing' form of the verb in this case.

The correct sentence would be

“Twenty-third December is being celebrated in India as Farmer’s day in the honour of Indian farmers who helps run a vast country like ours by producing basic amenities for sustenance.”

Option A is hence the correct answer.



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
