Explanations :

1. There is an error in part D of the sentence as the definitely article 'the' has not been used before the names of the oceans.

The correct sentence would be:

"The Western Cape is a coastal province containing Africa's southernmost point as well as the apocryphal meeting point of **the Indian and Atlantic Ocean**."

Option D is hence the correct answer.

2. There is an idiomatic error in the part C of the sentence. 'Improve' will be replaced by 'improving' because the phrase 'with a view to' is followed by a noun or a gerund.

Ex. Strips of rainforest were purchased with a view to **creating** protected areas.

The correct sentence would hence be:

"The government has started a new diplomatic policy with a view to improving relations with the neighbouring countries."

Option C is hence the correct answer.

3. There is an error in B part of the sentence as the subject used in the sentence is singular in nature and not plural. Clearly, we need to use a singular verb here. Hence 'have' must be replaced by 'has' in the sentence.

The correct sentence would hence be:

"The youngster, who has been awarded the sport's day award, **has represented** India in countries like U.S., France, and even thrice in Pakistan along with others."

Option B is hence the correct answer.

4. There is an error of 'parallelism' in part B of the sentence as according to the rule of parallel construction the parts of speech used before and after 'and' should be the same. Therefore, the inifitive 'to give' must be replaced by the gerund 'giving' in the sentence.

The correct sentence would be:

"We strongly believe in motivating the students and **giving** them the opportunities to explore their potential and understand the importance of team work."

Option B is hence the correct answer.

5. The fragment C of the sentence is erroneous as usage of active voice in this part makes it absurd in the context.

The correct sentence would therefore be, "The uplift of poor Dalits, minorities, transgenders and other marginalized sections requires ethical governance and sound policies **that are monitored** periodically followed by adequate implementation."

Option C is hence the correct answer.

6. The sentence is absolutely correct and thus has no error in it.

Option E is hence the correct answer.

7. Fragment C of the sentence is erroneous. The preposition following the word 'dominated' must be 'by' and not 'with'.

The correct sentence would therefore be, "As political scientist Christophe Jaffrelot argues in his book, India's Silent Revolution, the evolution of India's post-Independence polity — from being **dominated by** a single party to a multifarious, deeply "regionalised" system was made possible by a "silent revolution" of the lower castes."

Hence, the correct answer is option C.

8. The sentence has no error and hence is absolutely correct.

Hence, the correct answer is option E.

9. The fragment D of the sentence is grammatically incorrect.

Instead of the article "the" before "successful democracy", "a" should be used since here democracy is not being used a specific/particular noun.

The correct sentence would therefore be, "It is widely recognized that judicial independence is an important prerequisite in the making of **a successful democracy**."

Option D is hence the correct answer.

10. The fragment B of the sentence is grammatically incorrect.

Here UBI is pitched as a replacement for other welfare benefits. When the motive is replacement of something, "to" is used after "alternative".

The correct sentence would therefore be, "Libertarians like universal basic income as an **alternative to** other welfare benefits, such as food stamps, because it doesn't phase out at higher levels of income."

Option B is hence the correct answer.
