Explanations:

1.

The sentence is absolutely correct and thus has no error in it. Option E is hence the correct answer.

2.

Here, for a picnic should be used. Hence, option A is correct.

3.

Replace 'caused' with 'causing'. Like 'including' and 'procuring', 'causing' is used here as a preent participle. Hence, option D is correct.

4.

Replace 'double' with 'doubling' in fragment B.

We use a gerund (verb+ing form) after certain verbs/phrases that are followed by appropriate prepositions; desirous of, keen on, aimt at, hesitate in, etc. Option B is hence the correct answer.

5.

Place 'the' before 'UK'.

We place the definite article 'the' before proper nouns when they refer to the names of descriptive names of countries such as the USA, the UAE, etc.

Hence, option A is correct.

6.

The sentence is absolutely correct and thus has no error in it. Option E is hence the correct answer.

7.

We need to place the past participle that would function as an adjective before the noun 'group'.

We will therefore replace 'empowerment' with 'empowered' to make it a grammatically correct sentence.

Ex. A detailed report or plan contains a lot of details. (Not 'detail') Hence, option A is correct.

8.

The sentence is absolutely correct and thus has no error in it. Option E is hence the correct answer.

9.

Add 'A' before 'few'.

We use indefinite article 'A' before the adjectives 'little' and 'few' to give the sense of 'some'.

A little - Some (Quantity)

A few - Some (Number)

Ex. I have a few good friends.

Ex. I have a little sugar. It will do for another week.

Hence, option A is correct.

10.

Replace 'lesser' with 'less'. Hence, option D is correct.
