1.

National Highway 2, commonly referred as Delhi-Kolkata Road, is a busy Indian National Highway that runs through the states of Delhi, Haryana, Uttar Pradesh, Bihar, Jharkhand, and West Bengal, It constitutes a major portion of the historical Grand Trunk Road along with NH 91 and NH1 in India.

Pachmarhi, a beautiful hill station in the satpura range, is known as Queen of Satpura because of its mystic beauty. It is a known destination for Bollywood film shootings. It is situated in Madhya Pradesh.

The Apsara research reactor is India's and Asia's first nuclear reactor. It was designed and built in India, with assistance and fuel from the United Kingdom. It is a swimming-pool-type reactor loaded with enriched uranium as fuel. The Apsara research reactor was inaugurated on January 20, 1957 in Trombay.

4.

The Samjhauta Express is a twice-weekly train that runs between Delhi and Attari in India and Lahore in Pakistan. It covers the approx 490 km between Delhi and Lahore. It is commonly called the Friendship Express. The border crossing takes place between Wagah in Pakistan and Attari in India.

Territorial waters is a belt of coastal waters extending at most 12 nautical miles (22.2 km) from the baseline of a coastal state. India's territorial waters extend into the sea to a distance of 12 nautical miles(13.8 mi; 22.2 km) from the coast baseline.

The Indian Space Research Organisation is the Indian space agency run by the government of India. The organization was founded by Dr. Vikram Sarabhai on 15th August 1969. Its headquarter is situated in Bangalore.


A union territory is an administrative division which is ruled directly by the Central Government. The seven current union territories of India are:
