3.

Meaning: to listen to or hear something from a valid and genuine source.

Ex. 'Where did you hear it from?' 'From the horse's mouth.'

4.

Meaning: To do something in the easiest, quickest, or cheapest way, often harming the quality of your work

Ex. You can't pass IAS exam by cutting corners.

5.

Meaning: to listen to a story or an explanation with considerable doubt.

Ex. You must take anything she says with a pinch of salt. She doesn't always tell the truth.

6.

Meaning: something that you say which means that everyone is successful during some period in their life.

Ex. He'll get that promotion eventually. Every dog has its day.

7.

Meaning: to get little sleep or rest because you are busy until late every night

Ex. No wonder Mary is ill. She has been burning the candle at both ends for a long time.

8.

Meaning: a situation wherein one can enjoy two different opportunities

Ex. She's a working woman and has a loving and understanding husband. She has got the best of both worlds.

9.

Meaning: If some bad luck or misfortune ultimately results in something positive, it's a blessing in disguise.

Ex. Losing my job was a blessing in disguise, I couldn't even have thought about starting my own business that went so successful.

10.

Meaning: to work very hard to accomplish something for someone

Ex. I bent over backwards for you, and you showed no thanks!
