Burning question:

An urgent or crucial issue under heated discussion.

Ex. Fire in Pune factory raises the burning question: are you prepared?

Option D is hence the correct answer.

2.

To get on (one's) nerves:

To irritate, grate on, or exasperate someone.

Ex. Nothing personal, but your voice is really getting on my nerves.

Option B is hence the correct answer.

3.

Turn the corner:

to pass a critical point in a process.

Ex. The patient turned the corner last night. She should begin to show improvement now.

Option C is hence the correct answer.

4.

High and dry:

without resources or help.

Ex. Your family would be left high and dry by the death of the breadwinner.

<u>Synonyms</u>: destitute, bereft, helpless, without help, without assistance, without resources, in the lurch, in difficulties, forsaken, **abandoned**, stranded, marooned, etc.

Option A is hence the correct answer.

5.

To take something lying down:

to endure something unpleasant without fighting back.

Ex. He insulted me publicly. You don't expect me to take that lying down, do you?

Option A is hence the correct answer.

6.

In the offing:

likely to happen or appear soon

Ex. There are several initiatives in the offing.

Ex. BJP-JD(S) alliance in the offing for Karnataka assembly elections?

Option B is hence the correct answer.

7.

Po die in harness:

To die while still actively working or still of the age or physical condition to do so; to die before retirement

Ex. Musicians mostly die in harness.

Ex. Listing employee welfare initiatives, he said that 10% DA has been granted to SRTC employees during the current financial year, Welfare Scheme policy revised for the employees who die in harness and Insurance Cover Policy for employees also introduced.

Option C is hence the correct answer.

8.

Cut out:

To be fit for or suited to something by nature

Ex. I'm not cut out to be a hero.

Option B is hence the correct answer

9.

A snake in the grass:

A treacherous person

Ex. Did you hear that Yuvraj's best friend stole money from her bank account? What a snake in the grass.

Option C is hence the correct answer.

10.

Gift of the gab:

The ability to speak easily and confidently in a way that makes people want to listen to you and believe you.

Ex. She's got the gift of the gab - she should work in sales and marketing.

Option A is hence the correct answer.
