Who: Viswanathan Anand

What: wins Sparkassen Trophy

When: published on 18th July 2021

In a fascinating battle between two former World champions fought over four games in a brand new format of chess, Viswanathan Anand defeated Vladimir Kramnik to win the Sparkassen Trophy at Dortmund on Sunday.

Anand needed only a draw in the final game of the No-Castling Chess event, and he got it in 40 moves.

It was once again an English Opening — all the three previous games had also begun thus — with Anand having the black pieces. The Russian, who started the day 1-2 down, had to win the game if he wanted to stop his old rival from claiming the trophy.

What: opens new global competence centre in Hyderabad, to hire over 2,500 by 2023

When: published on 19th July 2021

Financial services giant Goldman Sachs unveiled its new global competence centre (GCC) spread over nearly 1.6 lakh sq ft across three floors in Hyderabad's IT hub of Madhapur on Monday and said it plans to hire over 2,500 techies by 2023.

The Hyderabad centre, which became operational remotely in March this year with around 250 techies (including internal relocations from Bengaluru and new hires), is expected to grow to 800 employees by end of 2021, of which about 70% would be new hires, said Gunjan Samtani, head of Goldman Sachs services in India.

Russia said Tuesday it had successfully test-fired its new S-500 air defence missile systems at a southern training range and hit a high-speed ballistic target.

Russia says the S-500, which is expected to have a maximum firing range of 600 kilometres, is the most advanced anti-missile system in the world and is capable of countering attacks from space.

Its development however is years behind schedule. The military had previously said the army would begin receiving the first S-500 systems in 2020.

What: develops oxygen rationing device AMLEX

When: published on 20th July 2021

The Indian Institute of Technology (IIT), Ropar has developed a first-of-its-kind oxygen rationing device – AMLEX that supplies a required volume of oxygen to the patient during inhalation and trips when the patient exhales CO2. This process saves oxygen which otherwise unnecessarily get wasted.

"The device can operate on both portable power supply (battery) as well as line supply (220V-50Hz)", said Director, IIT, Ropar, Prof Rajeev Ahuja.

"Made specifically for oxygen cylinders, AMLEX can be easily connected between the oxygen supply line and the mask worn by the patient. It uses a sensor which senses and successfully detects inhalation and exhalation of the user in any environmental condition," said Dr Sahani, Assistant Professor, Department of Biomedical Engineering.

'A total of 1,16,266 loans amounting to Rs 26,204.49 crore extended under the Scheme since inception. Margin Money requirements for Scheme loans reduced in the Budget Speech for FY 2021-22 Activities allied to agriculture included in the Scheme in the Budget Speech for FY 2021-22,' Minister of State for Social Justice and Empowerment Pratima Bhoumik said in a written reply in Lok Sabha.

What: approves new projects for rejuvenation of 6 rivers in U'khand

When: published on 16th July 2021

The National Mission for Clean Ganga (NMCG) in its 36th Executive Committee on Friday approved

new projects for rejuvenation of six rivers in Uttarakhand, an official statement said.



According to the Central Pollution Control Board (CPCB), there are a total of nine polluted stretches in Uttarakhand and six of them are in the Udham Singh Nagar district on various tributaries or small rivers such as Bhela, Dhela, Kichha, Nandor, Pilankha and Kosi.

Two stretches are on Rispana-Bindal and Suswa, while one stretch is on main river Ganga (downstream Jagjeetpur) already covered by the Jagjeetpur STP project, it added.

"At the 36th Executive Committee meeting of the National Mission for Clean Ganga (NMCG), chaired by Rajiv Ranjan Mishra, Director General, NMCG, new projects for rejuvenation of six polluted river stretches in Uttarakhand were approved," the NMCG said in a statement.

The projects shall cover the six polluted river stretches in the Kumaon region. Out of the rest three polluted stretches, project of Ganga at Jagjeetpur, Haridwar has already been commissioned and on the remaining two, Namami Gange projects are already under execution, it said.
