Who: Indian Oil Corporation

What: to Invest INR 24, 000 Crore in Gujarat Refinery

When: published on 8th June 2021

The Indian Oil Corporation Limited (IOCL) will expand the Gujarat Refinery in Vadodara where it will invest Rs 24,000 crore in six different projects, including India's first hydrogen dispensing station, said Dharmendra Pradhan, Union Minister for Petroleum and Natural Gas, on Monday.

A memorandum in this regard was signed in the presence of Pradhan and Chief Minister Vijay Rupani. These projects will expand the present capacity of Gujarat Refinery in Vadodara to 18 million metric tonne from 13.7 million metric tonne and will also provide 25,000 direct and indirect jobs.

"Today India is the third biggest consumer of energy. We will be the world's biggest consumer of energy by 2030... About 1.5 decades ago, Gujarat included natural gas in its energy mix. Today, natural gas or clean fuel consumption accounts for six per cent of India's energy basket. The global average is between 23 and 24 per cent. But for Gujarat, this average (for natural gas) is 26 per cent. Today, Gujarat stands two per cent above global average," said Pradhan while announcing the investments in Gujarat.

Avantika Singh, Vice-Chairman & CEO, GMB, said, "This will be a first-of-its-kind commercial maritime services cluster in India, which has been conceptualised to enhance competitiveness and self-sufficiency of India in the maritime sector and provide a one-stop solution for the entire maritime fraternity."

The two parties will begin the work with a pilot project in the Zanskar valley area.

Indian Institute of Technology Madras' Centre for Memory Studies recently hosted virtually Asia's first International Memory Studies Workshop. It precedes the official launch of the Indian Network for Memory Studies (INMS), and brought together participants from all over the world.

A number of participants acknowledged the academic as well as the deeply existential need to engage with the field of Memory Studies in the current pandemic world where memory, connectivity and empathy emerge as vital human attributes. Conducted from April 26 to 30 2021, the workshop had 108 registered participants.

This international workshop on Memory Studies, the first of its kind in Asia, precedes the official launch of the Indian Network for Memory Studies (INMS), the first national network in the field in Asia



under the aegis of the International Memory Studies Association, Amsterdam. The launch of the INMS will take place in mid-June 2021 through a virtual event at IIT Madras.

The Interpol has launched a new global database named "I-Familia" to identify missing persons through family DNA and help the police solve cold cases in member countries.

Describing it as a ground breaking database officially launched this month, the Interpol in a statement said it applied cutting-edge scientific research and used the DNA of relatives to identify missing persons or unidentified human remains around the world.

"In late 2020, DNA from the children of an Italian man missing since 2004 was added to I-Familia and then checked against DNA from all unidentified human remains in the system. A match was found between the children's DNA and that of the body found in the Adriatic Sea, closing a case that had gone cold 16 years earlier," it said.

What: Plans World's First CO2-Neutral Cement Plant by 2030 in Sweden

When: published on 1st June 2021

HEIDELBERGCEMENT plans to retrofit its plant in Sweden to capture 1.8m t/y of CO2, and become what it says will be the world's first carbon-neutral cement plant.

The company says a feasibility study is underway to select the carbon capture technology for its Slite plant on the island of Gotland. It aims to capture the plant's full emissions by 2030 and these will be stored offshore. It will also increase the share of biofuels used to fuel operations at the plant.

Cement production is estimated to be responsible for around 8% of emissions worldwide; and the Slite plant produces 75% of the cement used for concrete production in Sweden.

What: promotes safer schools

Primary school teacher and the Global Teacher Prize 2020 winner, Ranjitsinh Disale has been named the World Bank's education advisor for the period June 2021 to June 2024. He will also be associated



with the World Bank's 'Coach' project which aims to accelerate student learning by improving inservice teacher professional development (TPD).

Speaking to EducationWorld about his role as an advisor, Disale said, "My role entails designing the overall framework but I will be in direct contact with teachers and other stakeholders as and when required." As part of his new role, Disale has chalked out plans to make schools safer even in conflict areas by marking them as special green-cross spaces that are not to be attacked. He proposes approaching the United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organisation (UNESCO) to run a campaign making people and organisations aware of the new initiative.

#### 12. Hints to Remember

Who: IIT Hyderabad

What: develops nano-fibre technology based oral tablets of Amphotericin B to treat fungal infections

When: published on 4<sup>th</sup> June 2021

The Indian Institute of Technology (IIT), Hyderabad has developed nano-fibre based oral tablets of Amphotericin B, called as AmB, to treat fungal infections post COVID treatment. Currently the AmB is available in injectable form.

The IIT Hyderabad researchers have decided to keep the technology free of intellectual property rights and ready for technology transfer for mass production of the drug, which is reportedly cheaper and higher AmB absorption and less Nephrotoxicity.

Prof. Saptarshi Majumdar and Dr. Chandra Shekhar Sharma from the Department of Chemical Engineering have made a study two year ago about oral nanofibrous AmB to be effective for Kala Azar. This was a first-ever attempt to fabricate nanofibrous oral tablets of Amphotericin B for the potential cure of Kala Azar.

The researchers are confident that the technology can be transferred to suitable pharma partners for large-scale production. The researchers recalled that Kala-Azar treatment is being currently used as a treatment for Mucormycosis in the country and opined that the immediate trial of this oral drug should be taken up to increase affordability and availability of the drug.

What: launches free coaching scheme for underprivileged students

When: published on 6th June 2021



Rajasthan has launched Chief Minister Anuprati Coaching Scheme to help underprivileged students prepare for entrance examinations to civil services and professional courses, with an aim to give them equal opportunity, said a circular issued by the state finance department.

Students belonging to scheduled caste, scheduled tribe, other backward classes (OBC), extremely backward castes, minority and economically weaker sections with annual family income less than ₹8 lakhs per annum will be able to avail the scheme run by the tribal area development, minority affairs, and social justice and empowerment departments. Children of government employees receiving Pay-Matrix level-11 will also qualify for the scheme, which can be utilised by every eligible student for a period of one year.

Under the scheme, free coaching will be provided for preparation for civil services examination, conducted by the Union Public Service Commission (UPSC), Rajasthan Administrative services (RAS) examination and subordinate services joint entrance examinations organised by the Rajasthan Public Service Commission (RPSC). It will also help students prepare for other RPSC examinations such as Rajasthan Teacher Eligibility Test (REET), Grade Pay-2400 or Pay-Matrix Level-5 services, constable examination, sub-inspector and 3600 Grade pay or Pay matrix level-10 jobs.

What: Becomes First State To Use NFC-Based "eIDs"

When: published on 7th June 2021

Consistent with the development across the globe the place Digital Identification Playing cards (eIDs) have been launched in quite a few nations, Punjab Authorities has additionally initiated the utilization of eIDs outfitted with Close to Area Communication (NFC) expertise for his or her officers/staff by means of one in all its outstanding entity viz. Punjab Mandi Board.

Disclosing this right here at the moment, Chairman Punjab Mandi Board Lal Singh mentioned that these eIDs are outfitted with NFC technology-a standard-based wi-fi communication expertise, permits knowledge change between units which might be just a few centimeters aside will probably be used as a major authentication device. The NFC operates at 13.66 MHz and transfers knowledge at as much as 424 Kbits/ seconds.

Notably, an NFC enabled cell machine can act as a card or reader or each, enabling consumer machine to share data and to show his/ her id.

The 'e-Nirman' portal and its mobile App was launched by the state chief minister Vijay Rupani on Tuesday. As per state government data, so far about 9.20 lakh workers from the unorganised sector are registered on the portal and have received the U-WIN smart cards from the state government.

Maiga succeeds Moctar Ouane, arrested by the military on May 24 after the publication of the list of his second government.

Maiga takes up the post of prime minister at a time the West African country is in a crisis in all sectors. What is most urgent for him will be to make lifted all sub-regional and international sanctions that risk permanently asphyxiating the country.

Malian transitional president Assimi Goita said the new government would quickly engage in dialogue with stakeholders in order to calm the social climate.

Born on April 2, 1958 in Tabango, Gao region, Choguel Kokalla Maiga is a telecommunications engineer by profession who took his first steps into politics within the National Union of Young People of Mali (UNJM), an association founded by former President Moussa Traore, overthrown on March 26, 1991, by the military.

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The re-appointment as above is subject to the approval of shareholders at the ensuing annual general meeting of the bank.

Bandhan Bank reported an 80.1% fall in net profit to Rs 103.03 crore on 13.2% rise in total income to Rs 3,787.91 crore in Q4 FY21 over Q4 FY20.

Bandhan Bank operates as a commercial bank. The bank has its presence in 34 states and union territories in India with 5,310 banking outlets serving 2.30 crore customers, as on 31 March 2021.
