Who: World Day Against Child Labour

What: was observed on 12th June 2021

The COVID-19 pandemic has had a devastating effect on lives and livelihoods around the world. The subsequent socio-economic fallouts of the pandemic have had a tremendous impact on the lives of millions of children who are victims of child labour, in particular, the United Nations has observed. As nations across the globe observe the World Against Child Labour Day on June 12, a report published by the International Labour Organization (ILO) of the UN states, "The number of children in child labour has risen to 160 million worldwide — an increase of 8.4 million children in the last four years," attributing the rise to the pandemic. Addressing the need to put an end to the evil practice, the theme for the year is "Act Now: End Child Labour".

The theme will be observed throughout the "Week of Action" that began on June 10. Explaining the significance of the day, the ILO report said, "Child labour reinforces intergenerational poverty, threatens national economies and undercuts rights guaranteed by the Convention on the Rights of the Child." Additionally, 2021 is also the "International Year for the Elimination of Child Labour".

Eminent neurologist and Padma Shri awardee Dr Ashok Panagariya passed away due to post-Covid complications today. Dr Panagariya was 71.

Dr Ashok was reportedly on ventilator support for the last several days at a private hospital. His condition deteriorated in the past two days and he died today.

Dr Ashok Panagariya held many top positions, including Vice-Chancellor of Jaipur's Rajasthan University of Health Sciences, and a member of the Government of Rajasthan's Planning Board.

Who: Firmina – World's Longest undersea cable

What: built by Google

When: published on 9th June 2021

Google today announced its plans to build a new subsea cable that will connect the East Coast of the U.S. and Las Toninas, Argentina — with additional landings in Brazil and Uruguay. The idea here is to provide users in South America with improved low-latency access to Google's portfolio of consumer and cloud services. The cable will be designed and installed by SubCom and should be ready for service by the end of 2023.

The closest Google data center in the region (and its only one in South America) can be found near Santiago, Chile, which is connected to the U.S. West Coast through Google's Curie cable.

The Firmina cable, named after Brazilian abolitionist and author Maria Firmina dos Reis, will augment Google's existing cable investments in the region. The Tannat cable, a joint venture between Antel Uruguay and Google, for example, already connects the same locations, while the Monet cable connects the U.S. and Brazil, where Google's Junior cable already connects various parts of the country.

What: launches four satellites with Long March-2D rocket

When: published on 11th June 2021

China sent four satellites into planned orbits from the Taiyuan Satellite Launch Center in northern Shanxi Province on Friday.

The satellites Beijing-3 (BJ-3), HISEA-2 (HS-2), Yangwang-1 (YW-1) and Tianjian (TJ) were launched by a Long March-2D rocket at 11:03 a.m. (Beijing Time).

Developed by China Spacesat Co., Ltd., the commercial remote-sensing satellite BJ-3 can provide services in the fields of resources survey, city management, environmental monitoring and disaster relief.

The HS-2 satellite will be used by Xiamen University to study the ecological environment of the near shore and shallow sea. The YW-1 satellite will be used by Shenzhen-based Origin Space Technology Co., Ltd. for asteroid resource exploration and research. The TJ satellite will be used by universities for teaching and training on in-orbit services.

What: okays Piramal's bid for DHFL with some conditions

When: published on 8th June 2021

The Mumbai bench of the National Company Law Tribunal (NCLT) on Monday approved Piramal Capital and Housing Finance's (PCHFL) Rs 37,250-crore resolution plan for Dewan Housing Finance (DHFL) with a few conditions.

It asked the company's committee of creditors (CoC) to consider giving more money to small fixed deposit holders under the approved resolution plan. "We are not remanding the plan back to CoC; we respect their commercial wisdom," the NCLT said. It is likely that the CoC may consider reallocation of funds under approved resolution plan for FD holders.

The partnership with Akshay is aimed at creating awareness for Mylab's products and kits such as CoviSelf and also to share educational content, according to the firm.

"Akshay will play a vital role in educating people about the use, safety and efficacy of products, thus making our citizens well equipped to fight against Covid," the company said in a statement.

Henri Marie Dondra has been named prime minister of the Central African Republic (CAR), the country's presidency said in a statement.



The appointment of the former finance minister on Friday came a day after former Prime Minister Firmin Ngrebada announced his resignation and that of his government following legislative elections.

A former chief of staff to President Faustin-Archange Touadera, Ngrebada had been in post since early 2019 when he helped craft a February 2019 peace deal signed with rebel groups in Sudan that now appears on the verge of collapse.

The CAR has seen waves of deadly intercommunal fighting since 2013 that have killed thousands of people and displaced many more.

When: published on 10th June 2021

The Internet and Mobile Association of India (IAMAI) has appointed former Supreme Court Justice (Retd.) Arjan Kumar Sikri to chair the grievance redressal board (GRB), formed as a part of the digital publisher content grievances council (DPCGC). The GRB will address content grievances pertaining to any of the DPCGC member's video streaming services. The council will function as an independent body and act as the second-tier within the three-tier grievance redressal mechanism as envisioned by the Information Technology (Intermediary Guidelines and Digital Media Ethics Code) Rules, 2021.

Under Justice Sikri's leadership, the GRB will aim to provide independent adjudication on content grievances escalated to it. The members of the GRB include prominent personalities from the media and entertainment industry, online curated content providers, experts from various fields — including child rights, women rights, and media laws.

banking financial companies (NBFC), and other companies that may be engaged in providing financial services. The fund will invest in companies which are leaders and/or are gaining market shares due to superior execution, scale, and better adoption of technology.

What: tops PSU banks in terms of loan, deposit growth

When: published on June 11, 2021

State-owned Bank of Maharashtra (BoM) has emerged as the top performer among public sector lenders in terms of loan and deposit growth during financial year 2020-21. The lender recorded 13.45 per cent increase in gross advances at Rs 1.07 lakh crore in 2020-21, as per the published data of BoM.

It was followed by Punjab & Sind Bank which posted 8.39 per cent growth in advances with aggregate loans at Rs 67,811 crore at the end of March 2021.

When it came to deposit mobilisation, BoM with nearly 16 per cent growth was ahead of even the country's largest lender State Bank of India, which recorded 13.56 per cent rise.

What: Extended RBIA System to Select HFCs

When: published on 2nd June 2021

The RBI on Friday extended the risk-based internal audit (RBIA) system to select housing finance companies to enhance the quality and effectiveness of their internal audit system.

In February this year, the RBI had issued a circular mandating the RBIA framework for select non-banking financial companies (NBFCs) and urban co-operative banks by March 31, 2022.

On Friday, the RBI, through a circular, extended the provisions issued for NBFCs to housing finance companies (HFCs) also.

The provisions will apply to all deposit-taking HFCs, irrespective of their size, as well as non-deposit-taking HFCs with asset size of Rs 5,000 crore and above, the central bank said.

What: launches kavach personal loan for Covid patients

When: published on 11th June 2021

The State Bank of India (SBI) on June 11 launched the 'kavach personal loan' scheme for COVID-19 patients. As per the scheme, the state-run lender is offering collateral free personal loans up to Rs 5 lakh at annual interest rate of 8.5 percent.

The collateral free personal loans are aimed at enabling customers to meet medical expenses of self and family members for COVID-19 treatment, the SBI said.

The scheme, launched by SBI Chairman Dinesh Khara, will allow customers to "avail loans up to Rs 5 lakh at an effective interest rate of 8.5 percent per annum for 60 months which is inclusive of three months moratorium", said a statement issued by the bank.

What: New Rules over ATM: Hike in Interchange Fee, Customer Charge

When: published on 11th June 2021

The Reserve Bank of India (RBI) has allowed banks to hike automated teller machine (ATM) transaction charges on the recommendations of a committee.

The central bank released a circular on Thursday, allowing banks to hike interchange fees per transaction through ATMs and non-financial transactions as well. Banks will be able to raise ATM transaction charges from August 1, 2021.

The RBI noted that the last change in interchange fee structure for ATM transactions was in August 2012, while the charges payable by customers were last revised in August 2014.

What: slips 12 spots to 55th position in global home price movement: Report

When: published on 10th June 2021



India has moved down 12 spots in the global home price index to 55th position in Q1 2021 against 43rd rank in the same period late year, according to the latest report released by leading international property consultancy Knight Frank. On a year-on-year basis, there has been a 1.6 per cent decline in home prices.

However, India has gained a spot in comparison to last quarter (Q4FY20) when the country ranked last globally amongst 56 countries tracked by Knight Frank's Global House Price Index.

What: approves declaration to end AIDS by 2030

When: published on 9th June 2021

The UN General Assembly overwhelmingly approved a declaration Tuesday calling for urgent action to end AIDS by 2030, noting "with alarm" that the COVID-19 pandemic has exacerbated inequalities and pushed access to AIDS medicines, treatments and diagnosis further off track.

The declaration commits the assembly's 193 member nations to implement the 18-page document, including reducing annual new HIV infections to under 3,70,000 and annual AIDS-related deaths to under 2,50,000 by 2025. It also calls for progress toward eliminating all forms of HIV-related stigma and discrimination and for urgent work toward an HIV vaccine and a cure for AIDS.

Without a huge increase in resources and coverage for those vulnerable and infected, "we will not end the AIDS epidemic by 2030," the assembly warned.

State-run EESL and MECON Ltd will collaboratively work towards implementation of various energy efficiency and resources conservation measures in the steel sector and associated mining industry. Energy Efficiency Services Ltd (EESL), a joint venture under the administration of Ministry of Power has signed a memorandum of understanding (MoU) with MECON Ltd, a public sector undertaking under the Ministry of Steel to this effect.



Under this association, EESL and MECON will collaboratively work towards the implementation of solutions related to energy efficiency, clean energy, and other ancillary services in the steel and mining industry, a statement said.

Three Indian S&T led SMEs / Start-ups viz. Ananya Technologies Private Limited, Bengaluru; Prantae Solutions Private Limited, Bhubaneswar and Jayon Implants Private Limited, Palakkad have been selected to undertake joint R&D and technology transfer projects under the India-Russia Joint Technology Assessment and Accelerated Commercialization Program.

The program is a joint initiative of the Department of Science & Technology (DST), Government of India, and Foundation for Assistance to Small Innovative Enterprises (FASIE). Federation of Indian Chambers of Commerce & Industry (FICCI) is implementing the program on behalf of the Department of Science & Technology.

The India-Russia Joint Technology Assessment and Accelerated Commercialization Program was launched in July 2020 as a bilateral initiative between India and Russia to foster collaboration in the field of Science, Technology and Innovation. Twenty-three joint proposals were received against the maiden call of the program, out of which three proposals have been selected for funding after a rigorous evaluation process.

Noted Kannada poet Siddalingaiah passes away on Friday due to Covid-19 related ailments, sources close to him said.

Popularly known as "Dalita Kavi" (Dalit Poet), he was 67. He is survived by wife, a son, and a daughter.

According to the sources, he was admitted to a private hospital for over a month and had been on ventilator support for some time now. His wife too was infected by Covid-19 and has recovered.



Siddalingaiah was poet, playwright, essayist and a Dalit activist, and was one of the founders of the Dalita Sangharsh Samiti. His notable works include Holemadigara Haadu, Saaviraaru Nadigalu, Kappu Kaadina Haadu and Meravanige, among others. He had written plays like Panchama, Ekalavya, and one of his popular essays was Gramadevathegalu.

"Members of the Technical Advisory Group are selected across the globe and appointed by the Director-General, WHO," the communique issued on Friday said.

WHO-TAG is an advisory body to the WHO providing technical guidance and inputs to support WHO's efforts and work in the fields of air pollution and health issues, including how member countries can achieve the air pollution and health-related Sustainable Development Goals (SDG 3.9.1, 7.1.2 and 11.6.2).

bringing my experience and commitment to development to this unique organization, whose history, mandate and recognized world-class expertise make it a key partner for all countries facing the challenges of post-pandemic recovery."
