What: discovered in Botswana

When: published on 16th June 2021

The diamond firm Debswana has announced the discovery in Botswana of a 1,098-carat stone that it described as the third largest of its kind in the world.

The company's acting managing director, Lynette Armstrong, presented the stone, which was found on 1 June, to the country's president, Mokgweetsi Masisi, on Wednesday.

It is the third largest in the world, behind the 3,106-carat Cullinan found in South Africa in 1905 and the 1,109-carat Lesedi La Rona discovered in Botswana in 2015.

A Gujarat cadre 1986-batch IAS officer, he was appointed to the DPIIT in August 2019. He was admitted to AIIMS in Delhi in mid-April and is the first serving secretary to the Government of India to have succumbed to the disease, as per a PTI report.

Prime Minister Narendra Modi and other senior ministers expressed their condolences over Mohapatra's demise.

Red Bull Racing's Max Verstappen beat Mercedes-Benz AMG's Lewis Hamilton by almost three seconds to claim victory on Sunday at a thrilling 2021 Formula One French Grand Prix, held at Circuit Paul Ricard.

Third place on the podium went to Red Bull's other driver, Sergio Perez, who finished about nine seconds behind his teammate.

Verstappen started the race on pole but soon lost the lead to Hamilton on the exit of Turn 1 due to a bit of oversteer. Verstappen rejoined quickly and was eventually able to jump into the lead thanks to an undercut as both drivers stopped for fresh tires, with Verstappen going first on lap 18 and Hamilton one lap later.

What: ranks as most liveable city in India, Chennai second: CSE report

When: published on 19th June 2021

Bengaluru's traffic is often the source of ridicule. After all, the city's traffic has even averted a terror attack. But despite this, Bengaluru continues to figure among India's most liveable cities. The latest to name Bengaluru as the most liveable city is a report by the Centre for Science and Environment (CSE) titled State of India's Environment in Figures 2021, released on June 16.Bengaluru was ranked the best city overall followed by Chennai, Shimla and Bhubaneshwar.

Only three state capitals feature in the top ten most liveable cities, as per the report. It focused on four parameters— quality of life, economic ability, sustainability and citizens' perceptions— to determine the ease of living index score. Indian cities were rated out of 100 in all parameters and Bengaluru received an ease of living index score of 66.7, followed by Chennai 62.61.

While Bengaluru scored high on the parameter of economic ability (78.82), Chennai scored highest in the parameter quality of life (60.84). Delhi, meanwhile, was ranked the worst capital city as per citizen feedback received, with a score of 69.4; Bengaluru did not fare much better, with a score of 78. The city with the highest citizen perception score was Bhubaneshwar at 94.8.

What: to be declared 'INOPERATIVE' if not linked before June 30, 2021

The Central Board of Direct Taxes (CBDT) had recently extended the deadline to link Permanent Account Number (PAN) with Aadhaar number to June 30, 2021, due to the difficulties posed by the ongoing Covid pandemic..

So now as the deadline is fast approaching, here are some guidelines which must be kept in mind.

As per the new Section 234H of the Income-tax Act 1961, which has been recently introduced during Budget 2021, the PAN cards which are not linked to Aadhaar after June 30, 2021, would be declared "inoperative", as well as a penalty of Rs 1,000 may also be imposed.

On the other hand, the person will be considered as an individual without PAN card.

What: named member of World Bank-IMF High-Level Advisory Group

Montek Singh Ahluwalia, former Deputy Chairman of the Planning Commission and distinguished fellow at the Centre for Social and Economic Progress (CSEP), was named as a member of a High-Level Advisory Group (HLAG) formed by the World Bank and the International Monetary Fund (IMF) in the face of the dual crisis posed by the Covid-19 pandemic and climate change.

Speaking on the immediate priorities for the HLAG, Montek said, "Climate change is at the top of the agenda this year in both developed and emerging market countries and the CoP 26 in November is expected to spell out what the international community needs to do. I hope the group can make a useful contribution to defining a workable strategy that takes account of the concerns of different participants."

Who: Ebrahim Raisi, ultra-conservative judiciary chief,

What: wins Iran's presidential vote amid historically low turnout

When: published on 19th June 2021

Ebrahim Raisi, a hardline judiciary chief with a brutal human rights record, will be the next president of Iran following his win in an uncompetitive election that most of the country sat out.



Raisi, who has long opposed engagement with the West and is a close ally of Supreme Leader Ayatollah Ali Khamenei, sailed to victory in a poll that saw all of his serious rivals barred in the runup to the race.

The 60-year-old won almost 18 million of the nearly 29 million ballots cast, Interior Minister Rahmani Fazli announced Saturday. But many reform-minded Iranians refused to take part in an election widely seen as a foregone conclusion. Overall voter turnout was 48.8% -- the lowest since the establishment of the Islamic Republic in 1979.

What: extends 'Mukhya Mantri Udyaymi Yojna' scheme to all women and youth

Bihar Chief Minister Nitish Kumar on Friday launched two ambitious schemes christened as the 'Mukhya Mantri Yuva Udyaymi Yojna' and the 'Mukhya Mantri Mahila Udyami Yojna' to promote entrepreneurship among youth and women of all sections under the state's 'Mukhaya Mantri Udyami Yojna' scheme.

The schemes were promised by the chief minister during the 2020 Bihar elections in a bid to counter the RJD's poll plank on unemployment. During the polls, the chief minister had promised to extend the existing Rs 10 lakh financial assistance for entrepreneurship development to sections, if voted to power.

Earlier, 'the Mukhya Mantri Udyami Yojna' was started in 2018 and limited to the members of SC, ST and the extremely backward classes (EBCs).

The United Nations General Assembly, on December 22, 2008, adopted a resolution recognizing sickle cell disease as a public health problem. Sickle cell disease makes normal life difficult and patients need regular blood transfusions.

The P N Panicker Foundation has been observing the national reading day, reading week, and reading month since June 19, 1996. This year, the foundation has organized activities that motivate reading online due to the prevailing COVID 19 situation in the country. A month-long 'Digital Reading' celebration would begin today, June 19, 2021, and will continue till July 18, 2021.

On National Reading Day India 2021, the country will once again honour the man behind the Library Movement in Kerala. The day is celebrated in memory of his marked contribution towards the 100% literacy rate in Kerala. The motto of National Reading Day is 'Read and Grow'.

What: improves way of imaging through fog

A team of Indo-French researchers has developed a new imaging technique that can potentially help reveal obstacles in the path that would otherwise be hidden by fog in rail, sea, and road transportation

and would also help spotting lighthouse beacons.

The method can also improve landing techniques of airplanes by providing pilots with a good view of

airport runway beacons — significantly better than relying only on reflected radio waves as is

presently the case.

Researchers from multiple Indian institutions — including Raman Research Institute (RRI) in Bengaluru

and Isro"s Space Application Centre (SAC) in Ahmedabad — and the Université Paris-Saclay, CNRS, France, have developed a new imaging technique that makes imaging of objects in foggy weather

conditions more clearer.

CA Rover Holdings, an affiliate of Carlyle Asia, offered to sell 48 million shares in a price band of `1,002-1,041.30 in India's second-biggest credit card service provider.

Morgan Stanley and Goldman Sachs were the bankers to the deal. Morgan Stanley Asia, the only buyer disclosed in the NSE bulk deal data, bought 5.4 million shares worth `542 crore.

What: re-elected as UN Secretary General for second five-year term

When: published on 18th June 2021

United Nations Secretary-General Antonio Guterres, on June 18, was re-elected the chief of the world body, after the Security Council adopted by acclamation a resolution recommending his name to the General Assembly for a second five-year term beginning January 1, 2022.

A vote was held in the General Assembly to re-elect Antonio Guterres on June 18. He will now hold the office of the UN Secretary-General for a second term from January 1, 2022, to December 31, 2026.

Volkan Bozkir, President of the 75th session of the UN General Assembly, announced on June 18 that Antonio Guterres "has been appointed by acclamation Secretary-General of the United Nations for the second term of office beginning on January 1, 2022 and ending on December 31, 2026."

Bozkir then administered the oath of office to 72-year-old Guterres at the podium of the UN General Assembly Hall.
