What: launches solar-based electrification programme for remote villages

When: published on 31st May 2021

Goa Chief Minister Pramod Sawant on Sunday launched solar-based electrification programme for rural households in the state. This project will bring electricity through renewable energy to areas in Goa where grid connectivity is not feasible.

"With a focus on delivering clean, affordable, and reliable energy to all, Pramod Sawant, Chief Minister of Goa, inaugurated a solar-based electrification programme for remote rural households in Goa," a CESL Statement said.

The solar PV-based home lighting systems for households was inaugurated only two days after the agreement was signed between Convergence Energy Services Ltd (CESL) and Goa Energy Development Agency (GEDA).

What: Wins Gold, Mary Kom And Lalbuatsaihi Bag Silver Medal

When: published on 30th May 2021

Pooja Rani won the gold medal in the 75kg Women's Middle category final at the Asian Boxing Championships, in Dubai on Sunday. She defeated Mavluda Movlonova in the gold medal clash. Meanwhile, earlier MC Mary Kom crashed to a narrow split-decision defeat against Kazakhstan's Nazym Kyzaibay in the women's 51kg final. The legendary Indian boxer won the silver medal. The sixtime world champion defeated Lutsaikhan Altantsetseg in the semifinals on Thursday. Meanwhile, Lalbuatsaihi (64kg) also won the silver medal in her category, losing to Milana Safronova. Anupama (+81kg) also bagged a silver medal, losing to Lazzat Kungeibayeva in the final.

Who: "Jayanti" - new species of Spider Cricket

What: discovered in Chhattisgarh

When: published 1st June 2021

Jayanti has become the twelfth subgenus, or species, of cricket identified under the genus Arachnomimus Saussure, 1897. Found in the Kurra caves of Chhattisgarh in April 2021 by a team of zoologists headed by Dr Ranjana Jaiswara of the Zoology Department of Panjab University, Chandigarh, the new subgenus was named Jayanti after Professor Jayant Biswas, one of the leading cave explorers in the country, who assisted the team. The new find has been published in the reputed journal Zootaxa this month.

Arachnomimus is the genus name given by Swiss Entomologist Henri Louis Frédéric de Saussure in 1878 to crickets that resembled spiders. The word Arachnomimus is derived from two Ancient Greek words — ἀράχνη (arákhnē, means "spider") and μῖμος (mîmos, means "imitator, actor"). This is apt because crickets of this group are commonly called spider crickets because of their smaller body size and long legs.

What: to Lend up to Rs 5 Lakh to Individuals for Covid-19 Treatment

When: published on 31st May 2021



Public sector banks will be offering unsecured personal loans between ₹ 25,000 to ₹ 5 lakh to salaried, non-salaried and pensioners for meeting Covid treatment, Indian Banks' Association and State Bank of India said in a press release. As part of the newly created Covid loan book under the guidelines of the Reserve Bank of India, the banks will also offer healthcare business loans for setting up oxygen plants under Emergency Credit Line Guarantee Scheme (ECGLS).

Loan up to ₹ 2 crore capped at 7.5 per cent will be provided to hospitals, nursing homes for setting up oxygen plant, IBA and SBI said.

Business loans for healthcare facilities up to ₹ 100 crore will be provided to setup or expand healthcare infrastructure and to manufacturers of healthcare products and unsecured personal loans will be provided to individuals from ₹ 25,000 to ₹ 5 lakhs for salaried, non-salaried and pensioners for meeting Covid treatment.

What: forms 8-member panel to examine GST exemption on Covid material

When: published on 30th May 2021

The Centre on Saturday constituted an eight-member ministerial panel under the convenership of Meghalaya chief minister Conrad K Sangma to examine Goods and Services Tax (GST) exemptions on a range of Covid-19 essentials such as vaccines, drugs, testing kits and ventilators, according to the Union finance ministry.



Other members of the group of ministers (GoM) are – Gujarat deputy chief minister Nitinbhai Patel, Maharashtra deputy CM Ajit Pawar, Goa transport minister Mauvin Godinho, Kerala finance minister KN Balagopal, Odisha finance minister Niranjan Pujari, Telangana finance minister T Harish Rao and UP finance minister Suresh Kr Khanna.

The GoM will submit its recommendations to the GST Council on or before June 8, the Union finance ministry said. After a protracted discussion on the issue of tax exemptions at the GST Council meeting on Friday, the apex federal body decided to form a committee to examine the merits of waivers on individual items.

The World Health Organization (WHO) on Monday announced news labels, using Greek alphabets, for various variants of the coronavirus disease (Covid-19), also giving names to the two variants that have been found in India thus far.

"Labelled using Greek alphabets, WHO announces new labels for Covid variants of concern (VOC) and interest (VOI)," news agency ANI quoted the world health body as saying. "Covid variant first found in India will be referred to as Delta, while earlier found variant in the country will be known as Kappa," WHO further said.

According to WHO, the B.1.617.1 variant has been designated as "Kappa" while the B1.617.2 variant has been dubbed "Delta." The earliest samples from both the variants from both the variants were documented in October 2020, it said.

Centre has allocated three thousand 411 Crore rupees grant to Gujarat under Jal Jeevan Mission to provide safe and potable piped drinking water to all the rural household in the state. Out of which the first tranche of more than 852 Crore rupees for the current financial year has been released. Jal Shakti Ministry said, the Central Government's allocation for the year 2019-20 was around 390 Crore rupees, which was raised to over 883 Crore rupees in 2020-21. In Gujarat, during the last financial year, around 11 lakh rural households have been provided tap water connections and in 2021-22, the state has planned to provide more than 10 lakh households with tap water connections. Gujarat has around 93 Lakh rural households, out of which now 83 per cent households are having piped water supply.

He was commissioned in December 1983 into 81 Armoured Regiment, a Regiment raised by his late father.

The General officer has had the privilege of tenanting various appointments across all six of the Army's geographical Commands as well as at the Army Training Command. He was an Instructor of Tank Gunnery & Tactics at the Armoured Corps Centre & School and served at important assignments at the Army HQ, HQ Integrated Defence Staff (IDS) as well as with the United Nations as a Military Observer at Angola.

India's campaign on Monday came to a superb end after two disappointments as Sanjeet Kumar won the second gold medal for the country at the Asian Elite Boxing Championships in Dubai.

Second-seeded Sanjeet was declared the winner by a 3-2 split decision against the 2016 Rio Olympics silver medallist Vassiliy Levit of Kazakhstan.

Sanjeet is the second gold-medal winner in this edition for India after Pooja Rani, who beat Mavluda Movlonova in the women's 75kg final on Sunday.

The Indian contingent has already ensured their best-ever show by securing an unprecedented 18 medals, including 2 golds, and bettered the previous highest of 13 medals (2 gold, 4 silver and 7 bronze).

What: govt signs MoU with Go-Air for transportation of agri produce

When: published on 31st May 2021

In a significant decision, the Jammu and Kashmir government on Monday signed a memorandum of understanding (MoU) with a private airline for the transportation of perishable horticulture and agricultural produce to various destinations across the country. The MoU between the Horticulture Department and Go-Air was signed in the presence of Principal Secretary Agriculture and Farmers Welfare and Horticulture departments, Navin Kumar Choudhary at Civil Secretariat here, an official spokesman said. Terming the step as significant, the principal secretary said the move will empower the fruit growers of Jammu and Kashmir and will increase their income as well as boost the rural economy. He added it will also address the transportation hiccups for the horticulture produce especially the highly perishable items like Cherry, Plum, Apricots etc. Choudhary said the government is also considering to provide some sort of financial support to fruit growers who will utilise this facility for transportation of horticulture and agricultural yield to outside J-K as well as the facility of refrigerated vans for which the decision could be taken by the government in a couple of days. Under the MoU, the airline will charge Rs 24, Rs 34, Rs 47, Rs 48 and Rs 50 for the transportation of perishable fruit produce from Jammu and Srinagar to Delhi, Mumbai/Pune, Chennai, Kolkata and Bengaluru respectively, the spokesman said. He said the growers can directly approach the airline and transport their produce on the said rates. The government had invited bids from airlines regarding this



and Go-Air was selected as it offered the lowest rates per kg for the transportation of perishable fruit produce.

Governor of Haryana, S N Arya, approved the Haryana Recovery of Damages to Property Bill. According to the bill (now act), any damage created to people's shops, houses, vendor carts, government offices, buses, vehicles and other such public property will be recovered from protestors.

The Recovery of damages to properties will be made by the person causing disturbances to public order by any assembly, lawful or unlawful such as riots and violent disorder. The Act also ensures compensation to victims and the recovery will also be made from people, leaders, organizers and others leading the protest and involved in its planning.
