Explanations:

1. The Ashoka Chakra is a depiction of the Buddhist Dharmachakra. It is so called because it appears on a number of edicts of Ashoka, most prominent among which is the Lion Capital of Sarnath which has been adopted as the National Emblem of the Republic of India.

Hence option C is the right answer.

2. The Emblem is adapted from Ashoka's Lion Capital situated at Sarnath. It was officially adopted on the day India became a republic, January 26, 1950.

Hence option C is the right answer.

3. The ratio of the width to the length of the Flag is two to three.

4. The Ashoka Chakra is a depiction of the dharmachakra; represented with 24 spokes. It is so called because it appears on a number of edicts of Ashoka, most prominent among which is the Lion Capital of Ashoka.

Hence option C is the right answer.

9. Vande Mataram is the National Song of India written by Bankim Chandra Chattopadhyay in 1882 in a novel, Anandamath. Originally it was written in two languages i.e. Bengali and Sanskrit.

Hence option C is the right answer.

10. The National Anthem of India Jana-gana-mana, composed originally in Bengali by Rabindranath Tagore, was adopted in its Hindi version by the Constituent Assembly as the National Anthem of India on 24 January 1950.
