Explanation:

1. John Doe order is a pre-infringement injunction remedy provided to protect the intellectual property rights of the creator of artistic works like movies, songs, etc. John Doe order is also known as Rolling Anton Pillar, Anton Pillar or Ashok Kumar order.

Hence option A is correct.

2. The Supreme Court on 30 June 2016 clarified that only the transgender community would qualify as the "third gender".

In doing so, a bench comprising justices A.K. Sikri and N.V. Ramana refused to modify a 2014 ruling on transgender rights.

Hence option A is correct.

3. The **Whanganui River** in New Zealand has become the first landmark in the world to be granted the same legal rights as that of a human being, following a 140-year struggle. The bill passed its third reading in New Zealand's Parliament on 15 March 2017. It aims to establish a new legal framework for the river.

Hence option D is correct.

4. ATTENDANCE OF RETIRED JUDGES AT SITTINGS OF THE SUPREME COURT: 8. Under Article 128 of the Constitution, the Chief Justice of India may, at any time, with the previous consent of the President, request any person who has held the office of a Judge of the Supreme Court to sit and act as a Judge of the Supreme Court.

Hence option B is correct.

5. The Public Trust Doctrine primarily rests on the principle that certain resources like air, sea, waters and the forests have such a great importance to the people as a whole that it would be wholly unjustified to make them a subject of private ownership.

6. The Delhi High Court on Tuesday 16th July 2013, asked social networking site Facebook to upload a disclaimer on its home page that children below the age of 13 years cannot open an account on it.

A division bench of Acting Chief Justice B.D. Ahmed and Justice Vibhu Bakhru asked Facebook to not allow children under 13 years from opening an account.

Hence option B is correct.

7. The process of drafting a constitution is usually long, intricate and politically fraught — but with 160 different active constitutions to draw from, it's also uniquely amenable to data analysis. With that in mind, Google has partnered with the Comparative Constitutions Project to launch a new site called *Constitute*, devoted to comparing the world's constitutions. It examines nearly 350 constitutional themes, organized into topics like the duties of a citizen and the role of the executive. The result is a comprehensive view of how countries structure their governments, and a powerful tool for any would-be founders. As one co-founder put it, "If want to see what African constitutions have to say about the rights of women after 1945, you can do that in just a few clicks."

Hence option B is correct.

8. The Mental Healthcare Bill, 2016, aims to provide provide for mental healthcare and services for persons with mental illness and ensure these persons have the right to live a life with dignity by not being discriminated against or harassed.

Hence option C is correct.

9. The Centre on Tuesday 30 August 2016, announced a hike in minimum wage for unskilled non-farm workers of the central government to Rs 350 a day, from the current Rs 246, in an attempt to mollify trade unions that have threatened to go on a nation-wide strike on Friday.

Hence option A is correct.
