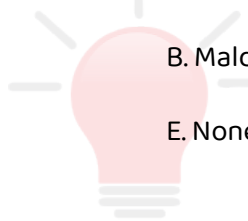

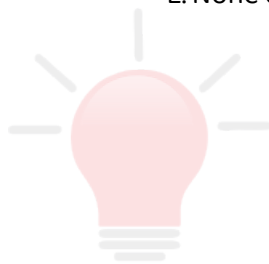

What: adopts resolution to mark 2023 as 'International Year of Millets'

When: published on 4th March 2021

The United Nations General Assembly (UNGA) on Wednesday unanimously adopted a resolution tabled by India along with Bangladesh, Kenya, Nepal, Nigeria, Russia and Senegal to mark 2023 as the 'International Year of Millets'.

"The UN General Assembly today unanimously adopted resolution initiated by India with Bangladesh, Kenya, Nepal, Nigeria, Russia and Senegal to mark 2023 as the International Year of Millets. Resolution was co-sponsored by 70+ countries," tweeted India in UN, NY.

Meanwhile, TS Tirumurti, permanent representative of India to the United Nations, took to Twitter to thank all the countries who co-sponsored the resolution, saying that this is a big step to promote nutritional and ecological benefits of millets to the millets as a key component of food basket and effect policy changes.[\(Read more\)](#)

Who: New Book "Artificial Intelligence and the Future of Power: 5 Battlegrounds"

What: authored by Rajiv Malhotra

When: published on 19th February 2021

With Artificial Intelligence helping "biological materialism sneak in through the back door", the world is witnessing a real clash of civilisations with "the battle between algorithm and being" writes Rajiv Malhotra, an internationally acclaimed author and public intellectual, in this seminal deep dive into a phenomenon that is only partially visible, like an iceberg.

Lamentably however, most of India's leaders, public intellectuals, media personalities, policy makers, think tanks and authors are "ignoring the dangers" that lie ahead, "living securely in their comfort zones with like-minded peers", Malhotra, the founder of the Princeton-based Infinity Foundation that specialises in the field of civilisational studies, writes in "Artificial Intelligence and the Future of Power – 5 Battlegrounds" (Rupa).

Noting that China had created a vast ecosystem of domestic intellectual property in next generation technologies including AI, 5G, nanotechnology, robotics, Virtual/Augmented Reality, aerospace and biotechnology, Malhotra writes that all this while, "the brutal reality is that India's newly minted billionaires were shortsighted – the products of jugaad and selfishness. They achieved instant wealth but failed to anticipate global trends. They became intoxicated with their status as popular icons that were glorified by the media and the government" and even received Padma awards "because they built personal fortunes even though they made precious little contribution toward nation-building".[\(Read more\)](#)

What: achieve financial closure of 745 MW-Bangladesh project; Stock hits 5% upper circuit

When: published on 5th March 2021

Anil Ambani-backed Reliance Power and Japan-based JERA are developing a new gas-fired power generation project in Bangladesh, through their joint venture project company. The duo has achieved financial closure for the project with a group of lenders that includes Japan Bank for International Cooperation ("JBIC") & Asian Development Bank ("ADB") and all requisite conditions for availing drawdown under the loan agreements have been satisfied.

The project includes build, own, and operate a 745 MW (net output: 718 MW) natural gas combined-cycle power project in Meghnaghat, Narayanganj, located approximately 40 km southeast of Dhaka (the "Project"/ "Phase 1").

Further, RPower's wholly-owned subsidiary Samalkot Power Limited ("Samalkot Power") has received approval from the Export-Import Bank of the United States ("US Exim Bank") to sell one module of equipment (Module 1) to Samsung C&T Corporation ("Samsung C&T") of South Korea, who is the EPC contractor for the Project, for Rs.1540cr.[\(Read more\)](#)

What: regains slot as India's top trade partner despite tensions

When: published on 23rd February 2021



China has regained its position as India's top trading partner despite a decaying relationship between the Asian neighbours.

The two countries were involved in a bloody border conflict last year and saw India ban 220 Chinese tech apps.

But that did not stop China leapfrogging the US in 2020 to become India's biggest trade partner.

Two-way trade between the long-standing economic and strategic Asian rivals stood at \$77.7bn (£55.2bn) last year.[\(Read more\)](#)

During the virtual exhibition and prize announcement for "Khel Khel Mein" which is a pan-Maharashtra toy and game design competition, Prakash Javadekar, Minister of Information and Broadcasting said that IIT will start courses related to VFX, Gaming and Animation from later this year when the session commences.
