"WHO is providing critical equipment and supplies to meet the increased needs during the current surge.

4000 oxygen concentrators will be delivered, to be provided to affected states (in India)," the organistion's spokesperson said while speaking to Sputnik. "Over 2,600 WHO experts from various programs (polio, TB, NTD etc) have been redeployed to work with health authorities at all levels to respond to the pandemic," the spokesperson added. Various countries are providing assistance to India as it battles a deadly second wave of the coronavirus pandemic.

A shipment of urgently needed oxygen, medicine and equipment will be delivered over the coming days by EU member states to India through the EU Civil Protection Mechanism, which is coordinated by the Emergency Response Coordination Centre of the European Commission.

The UK has become the first country to announce regulation of the use of self-driving vehicles at slow speeds on motorways.



Britain's transport ministry today said that it was working on specific wording to update the country's highway code for the safe use of self-driving vehicle systems. It added that the ministry will start with Automated Lane Keeping Systems (ALKS) - which use sensors and software to keep cars within a lane, allowing them to accelerate and brake without driver input.

According to the government, the use of ALKS would be restricted to motorways, at speeds under 60 km per hour. The UK government wants to be at the forefront of rolling out autonomous driving technology and the transport ministry forecasts by 2035 around 40% of new UK cars could have self-driving capabilities, creating up to 38,000 new skilled jobs.

It has recently come to light that the Indian Institute of Technology-Bombay (IIT-B) has come out with an innovative way to address medical oxygen shortage across the country by converting nitrogen generators into oxygen generators. IIT-B has come out with a device as part of the pilot project that's being carried out in collaboration with Tata Consulting Engineers (TCE), reports HT.

The shortage of medical oxygen shortage for the treatment of Covid-19 is becoming a growing issue in the country. Covid-19 patients in several hotspot cities in India are struggling to get proper





treatment amidst the shortage of oxygen in the country. IIT-Bombay has run Initial tests that shows oxygen production could be achieved at 3.5 atm pressure, with a purity level of 93%-96 %.

Moreover, given that it takes about four days to convert existing nitrogen plants into oxygen generators, it can save the time spent in setting up a new oxygen plant. The solution will also help provide oxygen supply to the existing hospitals.
