Who: GoAir

What: rebrands as Go First in a shift to ultra-low-cost airline model

When: published on 14th May 2021

After being in the skies for 15 years, Wadia Group-owned GoAir has rebranded itself as 'Go First' as the airline focuses on ultra-low-cost business model amid the aviation industry grappling with pandemic headwinds.

The announcement on Thursday also comes amid reports that the airline was preparing for an initial share sale to raise funds for its ambitious expansion plans. The Go First as ULCC (ultra-low-cost carrier) would operate single aircraft type across its fleet, which currently has both Airbus A320 and A320Neos (new engine option) planes in operation, it said in a said.

With a 7.8 market share per cent in March, the city-based airline breached the 10 per cent market share threshold for the first time in June 2014 and barring a few occasions it kept hovering in the sub-10 per cent range till the emergence of the pandemic last year.

United Nations is preparing for the thirtieth anniversary of the International Year of the Family, 2024, which aims to raise awareness of megatrends and responsive family-oriented policies to



tackle their effects. Megatrends including new technologies, demographic shifts, rapid urbanization, and migration trends, as well as climate change, have been dramatically shaping our world.

Who: Jacinda Ardern

What: takes out top spot in Fortune's 50 World's Greatest Leaders list

When: published on 14th May 2021

The eighth annual list celebrates leaders - some well-known and others who aren't so familiar - who made a difference amid the "truly unprecedented times" of the Covid-19 pandemic.

Fortune said in its reasoning that Ardern had "already sealed her position as a great leader early in her premiership" by "empathetically steering her country through the aftermath of a terror attack and the deadly eruption of a volcano".

"Then the Covid-19 pandemic struck, and Ardern targeted not just suppression of the virus, but its complete elimination."

The magazine also praised Ardern's adoption of "world-leading climate and gender-equity policies" which saw New Zealand become the first country in the world to legally require banks and financial firms to disclose climate change's effect on businesses.

She was followed on the list by the pioneers of vaccine delivery system messenger RNA (mRNA), used by the Pfizer/BioNTech and Moderna Covid-19 vaccines.

The CAC, comprising Madan Lal and Sulakshna Naik interviewed eight candidates for the post, before picking Mumbai-based Powar.



The 42-year-old Powar was the head coach of the team in 2018 before he and ODI captain Mithali Raj became embroiled in a public spat. The fight began after Raj was dropped from the T20 World Cup semi-final against England, a match that India eventually lost.

While speaking to ANI DGP Ashok Kumar said there are many people in the society who want to help, and there are many people who need help, the police is working as a nodal agency to merge these two.

"We started this mission on May 1 and it has completed 10 days. So far we have received 4 thousand 365 calls in 10 days and on Sunday, we received 649 calls in the state alone," he said.

He said at the time of the country's Independence Punjab had 13 districts.

Attenborough's role will involve making the "compelling case for climate action" to both global leaders and the public, where his job will also be "to evidence the progress underway, and to highlight the actions decision makers will need to take ahead of and at COP26."

Attenborough said he was "greatly honoured" to be given the role, in a video statement released in response to the announcement.

China will regulate all cannabinoid substances, the country's National Narcotics Control Commission (NNCC) announced on Tuesday. This makes China the first country in the world to do so, showing the country's continued efforts to crack down on new psychoactive substances, after it regulated all fentanyl-related substances in 2019.

Deng Ming, deputy head of the NNCC, said at a Tuesday press conference that China will add 18 substances, including synthetic cannabinoid substances and ketamine, to the narcotic and psychotropic drugs regulation list.

Who: Coronavirus Strain Found in India

What: Is a 'Variant of Concern,' WHO Says

When: published on 10<sup>th</sup> May 2021

The World Health Organization on Monday classified a coronavirus variant first spotted in India as a global "variant of concern," saying preliminary studies showed it may be more transmissible than some other variants.

The WHO didn't report any evidence suggesting that currently authorized vaccines would be less effective against the variant.

The variant, known as B.1.617, is being studied by scientists around the world as they try to figure out its role in the fast growing Covid-19 surge in India, which reported more than 366,000 new daily cases on Monday. The variant has already spread to more than 30 countries, according to the WHO, including the U.S., the U.K., France and Japan.

The surge in India rose rapidly last month, overwhelming hospitals in the country's hardest-hit cities. Anecdotally speaking, "the pattern now is that one person in the family gets it, the whole family seems to get it," said Dr. Soumya Swaminathan, the WHO's chief scientist, in an interview. "This is unlike the first wave. And so I think what we're seeing is more transmissible."

Who: China's first Mars rover, Zhu Rong

What: successfully landed on Mars

When: published on 14th May 2021

China's Zhurong Mars rover, mounted atop a rocket-powered lander, dropped away from its orbiting Tianwen-1 mothership Friday and descended to touchdown on the red planet, official news agencies confirmed, a superpower feat that highlights the growing prowess of the Chinese space program.

The China National Space Administration confirmed Zhurong, named after the god of fire in Chinese mythology, landed on a broad plain known as Utopia Planitia Friday at 7:18 p.m. EDT (7:18 a.m. Saturday Beijing time) after a fiery plunge through the thin martian atmosphere.

Thomas Zurbuchen, NASA's director of space science at NASA Headquarters, congratulated China on the successful landing, tweeting, "together with the global science community, I look forward to the important contributions this mission will make to humanity's understanding of the Red Planet."

What: develops an Oxycare system to regulate oxygen in patients body

When: published on 15th May 2021

The Defence Research and Development Organisation, DRDO has developed an Oxycare system to regulate oxygen being administered to the patients based on the sensed values of oxygen saturation in the body. The intelligent configuration of this Oxycare system provides automatic regulation of oxygen through a Low Pressure Regulator and Electronic Control System.

The Oxycare system developed by DRDO optimises consumption of oxygen based on oxygen saturation in the body. It reduces the workload of hospital staff eliminating the need of routine measurement and manual adjustment of oxygen flow. It is integrated with Non-Rebreather Masks saving oxygen by 30 to 40 per cent. The Oxycare system with audio warning for various failure scenarios can be used at homes, Quarantine Centres, COVID Care Centres and hospitals. DRDO has transferred the technology to multiple industries in the country for production. PM-CARES Fund has accorded sanction for the procurement of 1,50,000 units of Oxycare System at a cost of over 322 crore rupees.

Second time Sherpa reached atop Everest as the mountain guide of a 16-member expedition team led by Bahrain prince Sheikh Mohammed Hamad Mohammed Al Khalifa, he said.

Italy has for the first time appointed a woman, career diplomat Elisabetta Belloni, to head the country's secret service, Prime Minister Mario Draghi announced Wednesday.

Belloni, who has already been the first woman to hold key foreign ministry posts, will now lead Italy's Security Intelligence Department (DIS), reporting directly to the cabinet, said the statement.

The DIS's brief includes handling intelligence and security matters at home and abroad as well as counter-espionage and cybersecurity.

Belloni came to public prominence when she led the foreign ministry's crisis unit between 2004 and 2008, taking responsibility for operations involving Italians injured or killed abroad, whether in attacks or natural disasters.

The US military constitutes of the following 6 branches -Air Force, Army, Coast Guard, Marine Corps, Navy, and the Space Force. In addition to the above branches, the Army National Guard and the Air National Guard are reserve components of their services and function, partially, under state authority.

It is to acknowledge the effort of all the people working in these branches that the Armed Forces Day is celebrated unanimously among the US military. The inception of this day goes back to several years. The Defense Secretary Louis Johnson in 1949 on August 31, stated the concept of single-day observation as the Armed Forces Day in order to substitute separate Army, Navy and Air Force Days. As a result, all the armed forces were put together under one unified agency name — the Department of Defense.

What: tops in 4G download speed, Vodafone in upload: TRAI

Reliance Jio topped the 4G speed chart with a data download rate of 20.1MBbps, while Vodafone was ahead of others in upload speed at 6.7 Mbps in April, according to the latest data from telecom regulator TRAI.

Jio has almost three times higher download speed compared to its closest competitor Vodafone.

Though Vodafone and Idea Cellular have merged their mobile business as Vodafone Idea Ltd, the Telecom Regulatory Authority of India (Trai) still releases separate network speed data of both the entities.

Vodafone recorded a download speed of 7 Mbps in April, according to Trai's data updated on May 11. It was followed by Idea and Bharti Airtel with download speeds of 5.8 Mbps and 5 Mbps, respectively.

What: commits record USD 3.92 billion loan to India in 2020

When: published on 14th May 2021

The Asian Development Bank on Friday said it has committed a record USD 3.92 billion in sovereign loans for 13 projects to India in 2020, including USD 1.8 billion in COVID-19 related projects to support the government's pandemic response.

As part of the pandemic support to India, the Manila-headquartered multilateral agency said it has provided emergency assistance to contain the disease and establish social protection measures for relief to the poor and other vulnerable groups.

ADB also approved financing to help the government improve equitable access to comprehensive primary health care in urban areas.

This is ADB's highest-ever annual lending commitment to India since the start of its lending operations in 1986, it said, adding it has also committed USD 356.1 million through its non-sovereign operations to India, including three COVID-19 support projects.

World Bank, Country Director of Sri Lanka, Faris Hadad-Zervos said: "The World Bank remains responsive to the health priorities of Sri Lanka as well as emergency needs. Effective deployment of the vaccines will help Sri Lanka protect people, build human capital and facilitate inclusive economic recovery."

Sri Lanka has so far inoculated 1.1 million people with the first dose of the coronavirus vaccine, of whom 244,000 people have been given the second dose.
