What: constitutes Nilesh Shah headed expert committee on Investment Funds

When: published on 25th May 2021

The International Financial Services Centres Authority (IFSCA) on Tuesday constituted an expert committee to recommend a roadmap to promote investment funds at international financial services centres.

The 12-member panel will be headed by Kotak Mahindra Asset Management Company Managing Director Nilesh Shah.

The country's first IFSC has been set up at the Gujarat International Finance Tec-City (GIFT) in Gandhinagar

As per the Terms of Reference (ToR), the committee will recommend to IFSCA a long term vision for operations of investment funds at IFSCs.

While the committee has been constituted to holistically review the global best practices and make recommendations to IFSCA on the roadmap for the industry, it is also expected to identify issues that may be critical for development of the investment funds industry at IFSCs, including inter-regulatory issues, according to a statement.

What: Overtakes Amazon's Jeff Bezos To Become World's Richest Man

Louis Vuitton Moet Hennessy (LVMH) owner and French fashion tycoon Bernard Arnault have surpassed Amazon's Jeff Bezos to become the world's richest man. According to Forbes, Arnault climbed to the top position on Monday with an estimated net worth of \$186.3 billion. By adding \$300 million to his net worth, Louis Vuitton owner has dethroned Jeff Bezos who was the world's number one till now.



Amazon's Jeff Bezos had reclaimed the position recently after Tesla Chief Elon Musk had lost the spot after sliding 8.6% of his shares due to his tweet on Bitcoin. Currently, Bezos holds \$186 billion of net worth, and Elon Musk has \$147.3 billion of net worth. In March 2020, Arnault's worth had jumped \$76 billion while his recent achievement resulted after the fashion tycoon's worth jumped to \$186.3 billion on Monday. In the past 14 months, Louis Vuitton had a whooping rise of over \$110 billion even in the pandemic-hit conditions.

For the first time in his career, Robert Lewandowski has won the European Golden Boot. The Bayern Munich striker scored an incredible 41 goals in 29 Bundesliga appearances to claim the top scorer spot in Europe. It's truly been an incredible campaign from Lewandowski who was also able to break Gerd Muller's 49-year single-season scoring record en route to becoming the European Golden Boot winner.

Lewandowski's 41 goals was by far the highest total recorded by any player in Europe. In second place was Lionel Messi who registered 30 goals during Barcelona's La Liga campaign. Right behind Messi in third place was Cristiano Ronaldo. The Juventus player recorded 29 goals during his Serie A season. Bettering these two legendary players' goal-scoring numbers is an incredible achievement as they have both won this award multiple times.

What: To Raise Up To Rs 7,000 Cr By Issuing Bonds

HDFC Ltd on Tuesday said it will raise up to Rs 7,000 crore by issuing bonds on private placement basis.

The base issue size for the secured redeemable non-convertible debentures (NCDs) is Rs 5,000 crore with option to retain oversubscription of up to Rs 2,000 crore, HDFC said in a regulatory filing.

The country's largest mortgage lender will offer coupon rate of 6 per cent per annum on the bonds, the issue for which opens on May 28, 2021. The issue will close on the same day.



'The object of the issue is to augment the long-term resources of the Corporation. The proceeds of the present issue would be utilised for financing/refinancing the housing finance business requirements of the Corporation,' it said.

What: becomes first wallet admitted to UPI network

ICICI Bank's Pockets wallet has become the first financial institution in India to be permitted to offer UPI IDs in its own name and make transactions directly without routing it via a bank account.

So far, UPI IDs were reserved only for those who have an account with any recognized Indian bank, including co-operative banks.

Wallets were not allowed to allocate UPI IDs in their own names so as to prevent money laundering.

Instead, they are forced to tie-up with an approved bank for generating UPI IDs for their customers and are also forced to route all UPI transactions through a bank account.

The solution has been designed to enable a digital, streamlined onboarding process that delivers the experience consumers prefer such as fewer customer information fields to input, no physical paperwork, and comparatively lesser time required for completing the credit card application. What traditionally required an in-person interaction with customers for physical documentation and processing is now replaced with a completely digital process wherein a digital application link is sent to the customer, which the customer can complete from the comfort of their homes along with a video KYC (Know Your Customer). Further, the solution significantly reduces the integration time and effort for the Bank, while encompassing credit/risk decision workflow for digital end-to-end onboarding.

What: set to launch 1st WHO BioHub Facility

When: published on 24th May 2021

The World Health Organization (WHO) and the Swiss Confederation will launch the first facility to share rapidly virus and pathogen samples between laboratories worldwide, as the WHO BioHub Facility was approved through a Memorandum of Understanding on Monday.

"Close international collaboration to ensure the timely sharing of epidemiological and clinical data as well as biological materials is of utmost importance," said Alain Berset, Swiss Federal Councillor for Home Affairs.

The BioHub Facility will be used as a center for storing, sequencing and preparing pathogens to be distributed to laboratories across the world.

"The COVID-19 pandemic and other outbreaks and epidemics have underscored the importance of rapidly sharing pathogens to help the global scientific community assess the risk and develop countermeasures such as diagnostics, therapeutics and vaccines," said WHO Director-General Tedros Adhanom Ghebreyesus in a press release.

Underlining the role of technology in the safety of UN peacekeepers, India has told the world body's top organ that plans are afoot to launch a mobile tech platform in August this year that will provide terrain-related information to the Blue Helmets in the line of duty.

"Infusion of appropriate technology can play a significant role in improving the safety and security of the peacekeepers. Use of field-focused, reliable and cost-effective new technologies in peacekeeping operations that are driven by practical needs of end users on the ground is the need of the hour," India's Deputy Permanent Representative to the UN, Ambassador K Nagaraj Naidu said on Monday.

Addressing the UN Security Council open debate on 'United Nations peacekeeping operations: Improving safety and security of peacekeepers', Naidu said India, in partnership with the UN Department of Peacekeeping Operations and the Department of Operational Support, has been working towards developing a mobile tech platform 'UNITE AWARE' that helps increase situational awareness and provides terrain-related information to peacekeepers.

The Department of Agriculture, Cooperation and Farmers Welfare (DAC & FW) has released the third advance estimate of production of major agricultural crops. 2020-21. According to estimates, Total food production in India 2.66% growth is projected to record 305.44 million tonnes (MT) In 2020-21 (as compared to 2019).

This is an increase of 7.94 MT against the production of 297.50 MT of food grains received during 2019-20.

The estimate of 305.44 MT is 26.66 MT more than the average production of food grains for the last five years (2015-16 to 2019-20).

This assessment is based on data received from the states.

Social Justice and Empowerment Ministry said that this financial assistance will help the Transgender community to meet their day-to-day needs. Our correspondent reports that, the Ministry has asked NGOs and Community-based Organisations working for Transgender Persons to spread awareness about this step.

AIR Correspondent reports, as the country is fighting with COVID-19, members of the Transgender community have been critically affected by the pandemic majorly because of serious disruption of livelihoods. Any transgender person or Community-based Organisations on behalf of the Transgender Person can apply for financial assistance after providing basic details like Aadhar and Bank Account number. They have to fill a form, which is available on the website of the National Institute of Social Defence. Centre had provided similar financial assistance and ration kits to Transgender persons during last year's lockdown. A total amount of over 98 lakh rupees was incurred which benefitted nearly seven thousand Transgender Persons across the country.

The UN agency UNSPU has collaborated in the creation of the portal with an objective of making CSR fund utilisation easy, simple and transparent. The portal will also help achieve the sustainable development goals set by the UN. Mr. Yediyurappa has informed that 2.06 lakh Covid infected people were provided free medical treatment and a sum of 956 crore rupees has been spent by the State Government. He has invited donors to come forward to lend a helping hand to the people suffering from the Covid pandemic through the Akanksha portal. NITI Ayog Chief Executive Officer Amitabh Kant participated in the programme through virtual mode.

Amazon has bought MGM, the Hollywood studio behind the James Bond and Rocky franchises, for nearly \$8.5bn as the battle for global streaming supremacy reaches new heights.

The scale of the deal far exceeds the \$5bn (£3.5bn) price tag suggested when the studio put itself up for sale in December, as the fight to secure must-watch programming fuels fierce bidding wars for owners of increasingly scarce "crown jewel" content.

MGM was also courted by Apple and the Sky owner, Comcast. However, both ultimately balked at the size of the cheque Amazon was willing to write.

The award comprises a Joan Miro sculpture representing and symbolising the award, a diploma, an insignia and a cash prize of 50,000 Euros. The award was announced via video-conference.

influence of Mahatma Gandhi later. He organised protests and strikes in the erstwhile kingdom of Mysore against the British rule and participated in the Quit India movement. He was jailed for 14 months in 1943-1944.

In between then and now, Mickelson won twice on PGA TOUR Champions; lost weight; sold some Coffee for Wellness; partnered with Tom Brady in The Match 2: Champions for Charity, when the world was desperate for live sports amid the paralyzing opening months of the pandemic.

Always, he entertained, even if his golf game had cooled. Now, though, he has made history.

Mickelson, 50, held his nerve, kept his focus, and counter-punched a brutally difficult Ocean Course to a draw Sunday, shooting a final-round 73 to win the PGA Championship. He becomes the oldest men's major winner, besting Julius Boros, who was 48 at the 1968 PGA.
