Who: 'Shooter Dadi' Chandro Tomar

What: passes away due to Covid-19

When: published on 1st May 2021

Shooter Chandro Tomar, nicknamed 'Shooter Dadi', passed away at the age of 89 due to Covid-19 on Friday. She had been admitted to a hospital in Meerut on April 26 after she had complained of difficulty breathing.

"Mera saath chhoot gaya, Chandro kaha chali gayi (She has left me, Chandro where have you gone?)," her sister-in-law Prakashi Tomar, who is also one of the oldest female sharp shooters, wrote on her Twitter page.

Hailing from the Baghpat village in Uttar Pradesh, Tomar was 60-plus when she picked up the gun for the first time but went on to win many national competitions for veterans, her feats ultimately inspiring the award-winning Bollywood movie 'Saand ki Aankh'. (Read more)

What: launches in-app vaccine finder tool in India

When: published on 5th May 2021



American technology conglomerate Facebook has partnered with the Indian government to roll out a vaccine finder tool on its mobile app in India, which will help people identify places nearby to get vaccinated.

According to Mashable, earlier this week, Facebook announced a USD 10 million grant for emergency response efforts for the Covid-19 situation in the country. The vaccine tracker tool will allow users to find the nearest vaccine centre locations and their hours of operation as shared by the Ministry of Health and Family Welfare (MoHFW).

The tracker tool will also aggregate and display walk-in options (for 45 years and above) along with a link to register on the Cowin portal and schedule vaccination appointments.

Facebook said in a post on its platform, "Partnering with the Government of India, Facebook will begin rolling out its Vaccine Finder tool on the Facebook mobile app in India available in 17 languages to help people identify places nearby to get the vaccine." (Read more)

What: imposes Rs 3 crore penalty on ICICI Bank

When: published on 3<sup>rd</sup> May 2021

A penalty of Rs 3 crore has been imposed on ICICI Bank Ltd for contravention of certain directions, the Reserve Bank of India said on Monday. The RBI has imposed a monetary penalty of Rs 3 crore on ICICI Bank for "contravention of certain directions issued by the RBI contained in Master Circular on 'Prudential Norms for Classification, Valuation and Operation of Investment Portfolio by Banks' dated July 1, 2015", the central bank said in a statement.

It, however, added the action is based on the deficiencies in regulatory compliance and is not intended to pronounce upon the validity of any transaction or agreement entered into by the bank with its customers. Giving details, the RBI said an examination of correspondence in the matter of shifting of securities from one category to another revealed, inter alia, contravention of the directions.(Read more)

Who: Coal Miners' Day

What: was observed on 4th May 2021

Coal Miners' Day is celebrated on May 4 to recognize the hard work of some of the great unsung heroes of Industrial Revolution. In India, coal mining began in the year 1774 when John Summer and Suetonius Grant Heatly of the East India Company started commercial exploration in the Raniganj Coalfield along the western banks of the Damodar river. Demand for coal increased after the introduction of steam locomotives by railways in 1853. However, it was not a healthy place to work in. There were several incidents of extreme exploitation and massacre took place in coal mines in the name of profit. (Read more)

Who: Two dung eating beetle species

What: discovered from Maharashtra

When: published on 27th April 2021

Two beetle species, thriving on animal dung, have been newly discovered from Pune and Nashik in Maharashtra.

Beetles are commonly spotted emerging from inside the soil after the first rainfall. There are also beetles that grow on plants and crops, like sugarcane.

Researcher Aparna Kalawate from the Zoological Survey of India (Western Regional Centre) along with her German collaborator Oliver Hillert identified the two species — Bolboceras bopdevense (11.46mm in length) found at Pune's Bopdev ghat and Bolboceras trimbakense (12.39mm in length) traced near Trimbakeshwar in Nashik. The beetles were deep brown in colour and had distinct horns growing on their face.(Read more)

What: set target of road construction of worth Rs 15 lakh cr in next 2 years: Nitin Gadkari

When: published on 1<sup>st</sup> May 2021

Road Transport and Highways Minister Nitin Gadkari said government has set a target of road construction of worth 15 lakh crore rupees in next two years. He said the government is giving utmost priority to the development of infrastructure.

Addressing the Indo-U.S. Partnership Vision Summit through video conferencing yesterday, Mr Gadkari exuded confidence that the Ministry will achieve target of 40 kilometres per day of highways construction in current fiscal. He said that Government is permitting 100 percent FDI in road sector.

The Minister added that in India, projects like National Infrastructure pipeline for 2019-2025 is the first of its kind and government is committed to provide world class infra to its citizens and improving quality of their lives. He said that under the NIP, there are over 7,300 projects to be implemented at a total outlay of 111 lakh crore rupees by 2025. (Read more)

What: Signs PPA with SECI for 540 MW of Blended Wind Power Projects

When: published on 4<sup>th</sup> May 2021

JSW Renew Energy, a wholly-owned subsidiary of JSW Future Energy, announced that it has signed a power purchase agreement (PPA) with the Solar Energy Corporation of India Limited (SECI) to develop 540 MW of blended wind projects. JSW Future Energy is a 100% subsidiary of Mumbai-based power producer JSW Energy.

According to the company, this makes it the single largest PPA in the blended wind projects category and marks JSW's foray into the wind power generation segment.

JSW Future Energy said that it had received the letter of award (LoA) for a total blended wind capacity of 810 MW from SECI in September 2020.(Read more)

Who: Online Sales

What: accounted for 19% of Overall Retail Sales in 2020: UNCTAD Report

When: published on 3<sup>rd</sup> May 2021

Online sales accounted for nearly a fifth of total retail turnover last year as lockdowns to combat the spread of the coronavirus pandemic fuelled a boom in e-commerce, a United Nations study released on Monday showed.



Online sales accounted for 19% of overall retail sales in 2020, up from 16% a year earlier, according to estimates from the UN Conference on Trade and Development (UNCTAD) based on national statistical offices in major economies.

South Korea reported the highest share at 25.9%, up from 20.8% the year before. China had a 24.9% share, Britain 23.3% and the United States 14.0%.(Read more)

Who: Goldman Sachs

What: Revised India's GDP Forecast for FY22 to 11.1% from 11.7%

When: published on 4th May 2021

Wall Street brokerage Goldman Sachs has lowered its estimate for India's economic growth to 11.1 per cent in fiscal year to March 31, 2022, as a number of cities and states announced lockdowns of varying intensities to check spread of coronavirus infections.

India is suffering the world's worst outbreak of COVID-19 cases, with deaths crossing 2.22 lakh and new cases above 3.5 lakh daily. This has led to demand for imposition of nationwide strict lockdowns to stem the spread of the virus - a move that the Modi government has so far avoided after the economic devastation last year from a similar strategy.

Instead, it has left it to the states to impose restrictions to manage the virus. Several states and cities have imposed lockdowns of varying degrees. "The intensity of the lockdown remains lower than last year," Goldman Sachs said in a report. "Still, the impact of tighter containment policy is clearly visible in higher frequency mobility data across key India cities." As containment policy has tightened, high frequency data -- particularly on the services side -- has taken a hit. The manufacturing side -- as indicated by high frequency data on electricity consumption, and the stable April manufacturing PMI -- has been more resilient. (Read more)

Who: INS Kolkata

What: reaches Kuwait to bring liquid medical oxygen

When: published on 4th May 2021

Indian Naval Ship (INS) Kolkata on Tuesday reached Port Shuwaikh in Kuwait to bring liquid medical oxygen and other medical items to India, the Indian Navy said. 'Earlier the ship had embarked 200 bottles of oxygen and 43 oxygen concentrators from Doha, Qatar,' it said in the statement. India is struggling with the second wave of the coronavirus infection as hospitals in several states report a severe shortage of oxygen, drugs, equipment and beds.



The Indian Navy said, "In support of the nation's fight against Covid-19 and as part of operation Samudra Setu II, INS Kolkata arrived Port Shuwaikh, Kuwait on 04 May 2021 and will embark Liquid Medical Oxygen and medical stores from Kuwait.' India's total tally of COVID-19 cases has crossed

the 2-crore mark with over 50 lakh infections being added in just 15 days.

The total tally of coronavirus cases in the country mounted to 2,02,82,833 with 3,57,229 new infections being reported in a day, while the death toll increased to 2,22,408 with 3,449 new

fatalities, according to Union Health Ministry data updated on Tuesday. (Read more)

Who: Congo

What: declares the end of the 12th Ebola outbreak in the country

When: published on 4th May 2021

The Democratic Republic of the Congo (DRC) on Monday officially declared the end of the 12th

Ebola outbreak, which killed six people in its eastern province of North Kivu.

Since the outbreak declared on February 7, 2021, a total of 12 cases have been reported, including

six deaths in the province, the Xinhua news agency reported.

Thanks to the experience of the DRC's response team and health partners, the epidemic has been brought under control in less than three months after its declaration, said health Minister Jean-

Jacques Mbungani.

"Local health workers and authorities should be commended for their rapid response, tenacity, experience and hard work in controlling this outbreak," said Matshidiso Moeti, World Health

Organization (WHO) regional director for Africa.

The recent resurgence was genetically linked to the 2018-2020 epidemic in the northeastern part of the country, in which 3,470 people were infected and 2,287 were killed. Another outbreak in the western province of Ecuador infected 130 people and killed 55 between June and November

2020.(Read more)

India has been invited to join parts of the first in-person G7 Foreign and Development Ministers' meeting in UK, the Foreign, Commonwealth and Development Office (FCDO) said on Tuesday. External affairs minister Dr. S. Jaishankar is likely to represent India at the meeting.

This is the first in-person G7 meeting of foreign ministers in two years to be held in London.

"The Foreign Secretary has also invited India, Australia, the Republic of Korea, South Africa, and the Chair and Secretary-General of the Association of Southeast Asian Nations (ASEAN), to join parts of this year's G7 Foreign and Development Ministers' meeting as guests," the FCDO said.

"Their attendance will bring broader experience and geographic representation, and demonstrate the importance of the Indo-Pacific region," it further added.(Read more)
