Bharti Airtel has decided to merge its broadband satellite, or VSAT, business with that of market leader Hughes Communications India, to create a stronger no. 1 in the space, in a bid to increase scale, improve operational efficiencies and target new customers in areas such as in-flight connectivity.

In a statement Tuesday, Airtel said its VSAT business will be demerged into Hughes Communications India's operations through a slump sale, but didn't provide any financial details.

Hughes Communications will own 67% share of the new entity while Airtel will own the rest, people familiar with the matter said. They added that the new company will continue to be called Hughes Communications India Ltd., but the name could be changed in future.

Insiders revealed that closure of the deal may take between nine and 12 months, depending on regulatory clearances, and the merged entity will have a combined share of 63%.

Campbell scored 179 (137 balls, 15 fours and six sixes) while Hope scored 170 (152 balls, 22 fours and two sixes). The pair were finally separated in the 48th over when Campbell was dismissed by Barry McCarthy. West Indies posted 381 for 3.

Campbell and Hope surpassed the previous opening-stand record held by Pakistan's Imam-ul-Haq and Fakhar Zaman when they scored 304 against Zimbabwe at Bulawayo in July 2018.
