India and England have retained their top positions in the team rankings for Tests and ODIs, respectively, after the annual update today in which series results from 2015-16 are removed, and outcomes from 2016-17 and 2017-18 are weighted at 50 per cent.

India's lead over New Zealand in the MRF Tyres ICC Test Team Rankings has narrowed from eight to two points and England remain at the top of the MRF Tyres ICC ODI Team Rankings with their gap over India reduced to just two points in an expanded table.

Test rankings: India were on 116 points and New Zealand on 108 before the update but India's 3-0 win over South Africa and 2-1 win in Sri Lanka being purged as part of the 2015-16 season sees them losing three points while New Zealand's two 2-0 defeats to Australia being removed sees them gain three points.

In the only change of positions on the table, England have overtaken Australia to fourth position and are on 105 points. Australia are on 98 points after dropping six points as they had won four of the five series in 2015-16, no more part of the calculations. In another significant movement, the gap between seventh-placed Pakistan and eighth-placed West Indies has trimmed from 11 to two points.

Frontline missile destroyer of the Indian Navy INS Ranjit would be decommissioned at the naval dockyard here May 6 after serving for 36 years.

INS Ranjit, the third of the five Kashin-class destroyers built by erstwhile USSR, was commissioned in 1983, according to a navy press release here.

The ship was commissioned as INS Ranjit on September 15, 1983 with Captain Vishnu Bhagwat at the helm, it said.

The officer went on to serve as the Chief of Naval Staff during 1996-98, the release said.

Over the years, the ship has the distinction of serving in both western and eastern seaboard and has been the flag ship of both the western and eastern Fleets.

With a motto of 'Sada Rane Jayate' or 'Ever Victorious in Battle', INS Ranjit has been at the forefront in keeping the nation secure and participated in a number of operations, it said.

Some of these include IPKF operations, Op Talwar during Kargil conflict. In 2003, the ship was deployed off Mozambique to provide security cover to the African Union Summit.

What: can lodge a complaint of cruelty and dowry harassment under Section 498A

When: published on 1st May 2019

In a landmark judgement, a Supreme Court bench comprising Supreme Court Justices Ashok Bhushan and Justice KM Joseph on Tuesday ruled out that any relative of a woman, who is undergoing cruelty and dowry harassment by husband or in laws, can file a complaint against them.

The SC bench said Section 498A of the Indian Penal Code deals with matrimonial cruelty against women and does not require the complaint to be filed by victim woman only. Instead, any relative can lodge a complaint on her behalf which will be deemed to be maintainable.

Section 498A of IPC is invoked when a husband or in laws indulge in cruelty on a woman or seek dowry. The judgement will help the victim women who are unable to lodge a complaint against her husband and in laws.

Passed by Indian Parliament in 1983, Indian Penal Code 498A, is a criminal law which is defined as: "Husband or relative of husband of a woman subjecting her to cruelty—Whoever, being the husband or the relative of the husband of a woman, subjects such woman to cruelty shall be punishable with imprisonment for a term which may extend to three years and shall also be liable to fine."
