1. The word 'reclose' does not make any logical sense here. It should be 'reopen', which will give the sentence a proper meaning as 'with at least 50% classroom' supports it too.

Also, meaning of the given words:

Mandate (Noun): an official order or commission to do something.

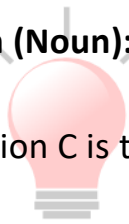
Across (Preposition): from one side to the other of (a place, area, etc.).

Reclose (Verb): to close or be closed after having previously been opened.

Reopen (Verb): to open again.

Instruction (Noun): a direction or order.

Hence, option C is the correct answer.



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2. 'Activict' is the incorrect spelling of the word. The correct spelling is 'activist'.

Also, meaning of the given words:

Activist (Noun): a person who campaigns to bring about political or social change.

Organized (Adjective): arranged or structured in a systematic way.

Attracted (Verb): to cause to come to a place or participate in a venture by offering something of interest or advantage.

Track (Noun): a prepared course or circuit for athletes, horses, motor vehicles, bicycles, or dogs to race on.

Option A is hence the correct answer.

3. The only misspelled word among all is 'accomodating'. The correct spelling of the word is 'accommodating'.

Also, meaning of the given words:

Capable (Adjective): having the ability, fitness, or quality necessary to do or achieve a specified thing.

Accommodating (Adjective): willing to fit in with someone's wishes or needs.

Seamlessly (Adverb): smoothly and continuously, with no apparent gaps or spaces between one part and the next.

Symptoms (Noun): a physical or mental feature which is regarded as indicating a condition of disease, particularly such a feature that is apparent to the patient.

Hence, option B is correct.



4. All of the given words are correctly used.

Also, meaning of the given words:

Advocates (Noun): a person who publicly supports or recommends a particular cause or policy.

Prohibit (Verb): to formally forbid (something) by law, rule, or other authority.

Application (Noun): a program or piece of software designed to fulfil a particular purpose.

Insist (Verb): to demand something forcefully, not accepting refusal.

Hence, option E is correct.

5. If we look thoroughly, one can find that only 'expressed' is wrongly spelled. 'expressed' should have been used in place of it.

Also, meaning of the given words:

Expressed (Verb): to convey (a thought or feeling) in words or by gestures and conduct.

Likely (Adverb): probably.

Approach (Noun): a way of dealing with a situation or problem.

Facilities (Noun): a place, amenity, or piece of equipment provided for a particular purpose.

Option A is hence the correct answer.

6. All of the given words are correctly used.

Also, meaning of the given words:

Whether (Conjunction): expressing a doubt or choice between alternatives.

Appropriate (Adjective): suitable or proper in the circumstances.

Believe (Verb): accept that (something) is true, especially without proof.

Cities (Noun): a large town.

Hence, option E is correct.

7. If we look thoroughly, one can find that 'wandered' is out of context as sentence gives information about some 'parents' and their cause of worrisome and 'wandered' does not fit in any manner. 'Wondered' should have been used in place of it.

Also, meaning of the given words:

Wandered (Verb): to walk or move in a leisurely or aimless way.

Wondered (Verb): to desire to know something; feel curious.

Sounded (Verb): to emit or cause to emit sound.

Depressed (Adjective): (of a person) in a state of unhappiness or despondency.

Adolescent (Noun): an adolescent boy or girl.

Hence, option A is the correct answer.

8. The only misspelled word among all is 'adverticement'. The correct spelling of the word is 'advertisement'.

Also, meaning of the given words:

Advertisement (Noun): a notice or announcement in a public medium promoting a product, service, or event or publicizing a job vacancy.

Frightening (Adjective): making someone afraid or anxious; terrifying.

Flashing (Verb): to shine in a bright but brief, sudden, or intermittent way.

Violence (Noun): behaviour involving physical force intended to hurt, damage, or kill someone or something.

Hence, option A is correct.

9. 'Alotted' is the incorrect spelling of the word. The correct spelling is 'allotted'.

Also, meaning of the given words:

Almost (Adverb): not quite; very nearly.

Allotted (Verb): to give or apportion (something) to someone.

Enclosure (Noun): an area that is surrounded by a barrier.

Excrement (Noun): waste matter discharged from the bowels; faeces.

Option B is hence the correct answer.

- 10.** The word 'save' does not make any logical sense here. It should be 'fire', which will give the sentence a proper meaning as 'several rounds' and 'using his gun' support it too.

Also, meaning of the given words:

Another (Pronoun): used to refer to a different person or thing from one already mentioned or known about.

Save (Verb): to keep safe or rescue (someone or something) from harm or danger.

Fire (Noun): the shooting of projectiles from weapons, especially bullets from guns.

Apparently (Adverb): as far as one knows or can see.

Back (Noun): the rear surface of the human body from the shoulders to the hips.

Hence, option B is the correct answer.



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
