Who: Digital payments soar

What: manifold in 5 years to FY20: RBI

When: published on 11th October 2020

Concerted efforts by the Reserve Bank to move to a non/less-cash economy by pushing digital payments have begun to pay rich dividends as the volume of such payments has jumped manifold in the past five years, the latest data from the central bank showed.

Between 2015-16 and 2019-20, digital payments have grown at a compounded annual growth rate of 55.1 per cent - from 593.61 crore in the year to March 2016 to 3,434.56 crore in the year to March 2020.

In absolute terms, value has grown from Rs 920.38 lakh crore to Rs 1,623.05 lakh crore during this period, clipping at an annual compounded rate of 15.2 per cent.(Read more)

AIM is the flagship programme of the Government of India that promotes a culture of innovation and entrepreneurship across country. Its ATLs are accessed by over 2.5 million school kids in India. ATL is a dedicated innovation workspace set-up at schools where students get access to do-it-yourself (DIY) kits and learn to tinker and create innovative solutions using the latest technologies.

As part of the SOI, CGI has agreed to adopt 100 schools with ATLs across Bangalore, Chennai, Hyderabad and Mumbai to promote and train students. Union Education Minister Ramesh Pokhriyal has informed K. Somaprasad, MP, that the All India Council for Technical Education (AICTE) has constituted a committee for preparing the Professional Engineers Bill.

The committee will function under the chairmanship of M.S. Ananth, former director, IIT Mardas, he said in a letter sent to the MP who had raised the matter in Rajya Sabha during a special mention demanding a professional regulatory mechanism in engineering field.

Mr. Somaprasad had pointed out that though there were 10,396 engineering institutes in India approved by the AICTE at present, only few were imparting quality education.(Read more)

Who: New Zealand passport

What: is now the most powerful in the world; India secures 58th position

When: published on 8th October 2020

New Zealand passport is now the most powerful in the world as per the recent global rankings. Reportedly, the passport index lists the power of passports in terms of real-time, visa restrictions, factoring in legislative changes, and entry requirements.

Earlier, New Zealand shared the top position with Japan. However, it has now claimed the position solely, and has secured a definitive top spot. In fact, a New Zealand passport can now get you visa-free access to more than 120 countries.

The second spot is shared by passports of Japan, along with Germany, Switzerland, Austria, Ireland, Luxembourg, South Korea, and Australia. The third spot is shared by Sweden, France, Spain, Belgium, Italy, and Finland. Meanwhile, India secured 58th position on the list, and shares the position with Algeria, Jordan, Benin, and Gabon.(Read more)

The exercise involved participation of Quick Reaction Teams, Dog Squads and Bomb Disposal Teams of Army as well as Anti-Terrorism Squad (ATS) and Quick Reaction Team of Maharashtra Police.

Her husband Arjun Rao, a retired IAS officer, said she had been suffering from a neurological problem for a long time. She was admitted to the hospital a few days ago, when her condition worsened. She breathed her last at around 1.30 am.



Born in 1956 at Anakapalle in Andhra Pradesh's Visakhapatnam district, Shobha Naidu had been one of the prominent exponents of Kuchipudi dance in the country. A disciple of Kuchipudi maestro Vempati Chinna Satyam, she had started giving stage performance at a very young age. (Read more)

What: receives Rs 5,550 crore from KKR for 1.28% stake sale

Reliance Industries Ltd (RIL) on Thursday said it has received Rs 5,550 crore from global investment firm KKR, which has picked up 1.28 per cent stake in its retail arm. Earlier, on September 23, RIL had announced that KKR will make the investment in its subsidiary Reliance Retail Ventures Ltd (RRVL) to buy 1.28 per cent equity stake.

"Reliance Retail Ventures Limited, a subsidiary of the company, today received the subscription amount of Rs 5,550 crore from Alyssum Asia Holdings II Pte. Ltd. (a unit of KKR) and allotted 81,348,479 equity shares to KKR," Reliance Industries said in a regulatory filing. (Read more)

Who: Kejriwal

What: launches 'Red Light On Gaadi Off' campaign to cut down on air pollution



When: published on 15th October 2020

Delhi chief minister Arvind Kejriwal on Thursday launched a new anti-pollution campaign under which

people will be encouraged to switch engines of their vehicles off while waiting at traffic signals.

On Thursday, the pollution levels in the city remained in the "very poor" category. "It has been seen that we often do not switch off our vehicle engines while waiting at traffic signals. That is called idling.

The 'Red Light On, Gaadi Off' campaign will aim to bring a behavioural change in that regard. It will

help reduce air pollution," said Kejriwal in a video press briefing.

He added, "Around 10 million vehicles are registered in Delhi. Even if one million of them actively

follow the campaign, experts suggest that it can reduce PM10 emissions by 1.5 tonnes a year and

PM2.5 emissions by 0.4 tonnes a year." (Read more)

What: to launch SC scholarship scheme

The Council of Ministers today approved the Dr BR Ambedkar SC Post Matric Scholarship Scheme,

which will be effective from 2021-22. It will be formally launched on October 17.

The scheme will come as a relief to nearly 2 lakh SC students pursuing post matric education in

government and private educational institutions.

Apart from ensuring 25 per cent admissions in all educational institutions, the income criteria for both parents for a student has been enhanced from Rs 2.50 lakh to Rs 4 lakh. A recommendation in this

regard was made by a committee comprising ministers Charanjit Channi, Sadhu Singh Dharamsot, Dr

Raj Kumar Verka and Chairman of the Technical Education Board Mohinder Kaypee. (Read more)

Hindustan Zinc clarified today saying, we would like to inform that the company has signed a non-binding memorandum of understanding (MoU) with the government of Gujarat to set-up state-of-the-art Zinc smelter plant with zero liquid discharge in Gujarat.(Read more)

He was scheduled to retire on October 31 but now his term has been extended till January 31, 2021. This is the second extension for Shanmugam who was to retire from service on July 31 this year. He assumed the office of Chief Secretary on July 1, 2019.

Renowned Malayalam poet and Jnanpith award winner Akkitham Achuthan Namboothiri, who is said to have heralded modernism in Malayalam poetry, died at a private hospital here on Thursday.

He was 94.

A widower, the Mahakavi (great poet), as he was known, leaves two sons and four daughters. Hospital sources said he was admitted for age related ailments a couple of days ago and the end came at 8.10 am. Popularly known as Akkitham, his "Irupatham Noottandinte Ithihasam" (Epic of the 20th Century) is considered as one of the first truly modernist poems in Malayalam literature. A popular verse-"Velicham dukhamanunni, thamasallo sukhapradam", which is roughly translated as "light brings sorrow, my child, darkness is bliss" is like a proverb for Keralites. (Read more)

Who: Gurdeep Singh, CMD of NTPC

What: Gets Extension on His Term Till July 2025

When: published on 15th October 2020

The Appointments Committee of the Cabinet (ACC) has extended the tenure of state run NTPC Ltd chairman and managing director, Gurdeep Singh till 31 July 2025, making him one of the longest serving chief at India's largest power generation utility, said two people aware of the development.

This comes in the backdrop of NTPC's pivot towards green energy. The state-run conventional power generation firm is rewriting its playbook, given that India's energy landscape is rapidly evolving. With an installed capacity of 62.91 gigawatts (GW), the NTPC group has 70 power stations across the country.



Singh, a mechanical engineer by training had first assumed the charge of utility's chairman and managing director in February 2016. He has earlier worked at NTPC and also across the power sector in firms such as CLP, CESC, IDFC, Powergen and AES. (Read more)
