Who: Astrosat, India's first Multi-Wavelength Astronomical Observatory

What: Completes 5 years of Imaging Celestial Objects in Space

When: published on 29th September 2020

Astrosat, India's first multi-wavelength astronomical observatory, on Monday completed five years of imaging celestial objects in space.

Launched by the Indian Space Research Organisation (ISRO) on 28 September 2015, in the five years of its operation Astrosat has achieved quite a feat.



It has carried out 1,166 observations of 800 unique celestial sources proposed by scientists both from India and abroad, a statement by the Department of Science and Technology (DST) said.

Astrosat has explored stars, star clusters, mapping of large and small satellite galaxies of the Milky Way called 'Magellanic Clouds', an energetic phenomenon in the Universe such as the ultra-violet counterparts to gamma-ray bursts, supernovae, active galactic nuclei.(Read more)

What: Hold First Joint Commission Meeting

India and Chile held their first joint commission meeting on Friday and agreed to add new momentum to their relations in a wide range of fields including trade and commerce, agriculture, health and social security, defence and space.

The meeting held virtually was co-chaired by External Affairs Minister S Jaishankar and his Chilean counterpart Andres Allamand Zavala.

Both sides noted that the Joint Commission was a significant development in India - Chile relations, being the first institutionalized dialogue between the two countries at the level of Foreign Ministers.(Read more)

What: ranks 94/107 in Global Hunger Index

When: published on 18th October 2020

India ranked 94 among 107 countries in the Global Hunger Index (GHI) 2020 and continues to be in the "serious" hunger category, though it has made some progress, particularly since the enactment of National Food Security Act.

Last year, India's rank was 102 out of 117 countries.

The neighbouring countries of Bangladesh, Myanmar and Pakistan too were in the "serious" category but ranked higher than India in this year's index as has been the trend for several years. While Bangladesh ranked 75, Myanmar and Pakistan were in the 78th and 88th position respectively. According to the report, Nepal and Sri Lanka were in 73rd and 64th position and were in the "moderate" hunger category, the report said.(Read more)

What: Participates In 102nd Meeting Of The World Bank Development Committee Plenary

Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman participated in the 102nd meeting of the World Bank Development Committee Plenary through video conferencing on Friday and said the hard-fought gains in reducing the level of poverty, achieved over a number of years, are at great risk of being lost due to COVID-19.

She said developing and developed countries continue to be impacted by COVID-19.

What: successfully test-fires naval version of BrahMos missile from INS Chennai

When: published on 18th October 2020

A naval version of the BrahMos supersonic cruise missile was successfully test-fired from an indigenously built stealth destroyer of the Indian Navy in the Arabian Sea on Sunday, officials said.

The missile was fired from INS Chennai, a stealth destroyer, and it hit the target with pin-point accuracy after performing "extremely complex" manoeuvres, they said.



"BrahMos as prime strike weapon' will ensure the warship's invincibility by engaging naval surface targets at long ranges, thus making the destroyer another lethal platform of Indian Navy," the defence ministry said in a statement. (Read more)

Indigenously built ASW corvettes 'Kamorta' and 'Kiltan' under the command of Rear Admiral Sanjay Vatsayan, 'Flag Officer Commanding Eastern Fleet', will represent the Indian Navy. (Read more)

It was in 12th grade that Kairavi started feeling low and demotivated and kept getting panic attacks to the point where she realised that she had to see someone about it. That there definitely was something wrong. "Nobody around me had really been through this for me to get clarity on what was happening to me. People's understanding of things like this was so low, they wouldn't understand. There was nothing visibly wrong with my life, I didn't have divorced parents, and other such 'problems' that one is 'allowed to be depressed about' according to society," said Kairavi.(Read more)

What: clinches Women's Singles title at Denmark Open

In Badminton, former World Champion Nozomi Okuhara clinched the Denmark Open title beating three-time world champion Carolina Marin in women's singles.

The Japanese star took 56 minutes to get the better of the Olympic gold medallist Spaniard in two games 21-19, 21-17, at Odense. With reigning world champion PV Sindhu of India opting to sit out the event, two of her biggest rivals made it through to the final.

In the men's singles final, world number seven Anders Antonsen of Denmark defeated his compatriot Rasmus Gemke by 18-21, 21-19, 21-12. Antonsen recovered after losing the first game to defeat world number 11 Gemke. The win means Antonsen moves up to second in the world rankings with Gemke at number three. (Read more)

Who: New Zealand PM Jacinda Ardern

What: will start his second term after Historic Election win



Whe: published on 17th October 2020

Jacinda Ardern will govern New Zealand for a second term after the Labour party secured a historic landslide victory in the general election, attracting so many votes it could become the first party in decades to be able to govern alone.

Ardern's deft handling of the Covid-19 outbreak and resolute belief in science and experts was credited with earning the trust of New Zealanders, who cast early votes in record numbers, giving her party more votes than at any other election in the past five decades.

With nearly 100% of the vote counted, Labour had secured 49%, with the opposition National party on 27%. Labour was expected to win 64 of the 120 seats in parliament, and National, 35. It is the best result for the Labour party in 50 years, being hailed as "extraordinary" by the former Labour prime minister Helen Clark, and "mind-blowing" by supporters.(Read more)
