Who: 6,197 gram panchayats in Haryana

What: to go digital

When: published on 2nd October 2020

Haryana Chief Minister Manohar Lal Khattar on Friday launched "Gram Darshan", a scheme aimed at making accessible data of 6,197 gram panchayats of the state just a click away.

This is a step forward towards complete digitization of villages by uploading the entire records of all development activities of villages as well as of various government departments on a single digital platform, an official statement said.

Haryana Deputy Chief Minister Dushyant Chautala was also present at the digital launch of the scheme.(Read more)

What: Launches Construction Of 750 Rural Stadiums, Flags Off Ambulances

Punjab Chief Minister Captain Amarinder Singh on Friday launched several development initiatives including flagging off a fleet of ambulances, construction of 750 rural stadiums or playgrounds and signing of MoU for conferring ownership rights on economically weaker sections.

The MoU was signed between the Local Government Department and Centre for Policy Research, while the ambulances were flagged off in Patiala, Jalandhar and Ludhiana.

The Chief Minister said that the 750 stadiums, being taken up for development at a cost of Rs 105 crore in rural areas, will help channelise the energy of the youth in a constructive manner, under the state government's rural transformation strategy and Tandarust Punjab Mission.(Read more)

Organizations from India, Thailand, South Korea, Nepal, Indonesia, Vietnam, Japan, China, Philippines, Singapore, Taiwan, and New Zealand participated in the event.

Asia for Animals (AfA) Coalition is composed of 23 well-known and respected animal welfare organizations that have a shared focus on improving the welfare of animals in Asia.

Intensive animal farming and poor treatment of farm animals pose a pandemic-level threat to humans and also depletes the health of the animals. Diseases such as swine flu, bird flu, and Nipah virus all emerged from farmed animals.(Read more)

What: launches book celebrating Mahatma Gandhi's special association with Delhi

When: published on 3rd October 2020



Mahatma Gandhi spent 720 days of his life in Delhi and visited the city 80 times between 1915 and 1948. During his stay in the city, he participated in protests, observed fasts and addressed public meetings to encourage people to join the freedom movement.

In addition to this Gandhi also attended social functions. He inaugurated the Modern School at Barakhamba Road and Lakshminarayan Temple popularly known as Birla Mandir. These selective anecdotes about Gandhi's association with Delhi are part of the coffee table book— Bapu— The unforgettable. The book was launched by Delhi Archives on Friday on the occasion of his 151st birth anniversary.

The book was unveiled by Deputy Chief Minister Manish Sisodia in the presence of secretary of arts, culture, and language (ACL) department Manisha Saxena and head of the archives Sanjay Garg. On the occasion, the department also held a webinar on 'Footprints of Gandhiji in Delhi'. Professor Sucheta Mahajan of Jawaharlal Nehru University (JNU), Sohail Hashmi (film maker and author) and Rajmani Srivastava, former assistant director of the National Archives of India, spoke at the event. What: lifts off cargo spacecraft SS Kalpana Chawla carrying 8,000-pound supplies

When: published on 3rd October 2020

The National Aeronautics and Space Administration (Nasa) launched the Northrop Grumman's Antares rocket and a Cygnus spacecraft bound for the International Space Station (ISS) from its Wallops flight facility on Friday.

A Northrop Grumman Cygnus, the commercial cargo spacecraft named the SS Kalpana Chawla after astronaut Kalpana Chawla, the first Indian-born woman to enter space, carries a 360-degree camera for spacewalking, and radish seeds for growing and a smorgasbord of fancy meats and cheeses for feasting.

The 8,000-pound shipment should reach the International Space Station (ISS) on Monday, the US space agency said. "Over 8,000 lbs of cargo & @ISS_Research on @NorthropGrumman's Cygnus spacecraft will be delivered to our orbiting lab," Nasa said in a tweet. (Read more)

What: develop purified equine antiserum

When: published on 2nd October 2020



India's top health research body Indian Council of Medical Research (ICMR) and Hyderabad-based Biological E have developed purified antisera, raised in animals, as a prophylaxis and treatment for Covid-19.

Antiserum is blood-based serum containing antibodies against viruses.

The therapy works like plasma therapy. However, the blood plasma is obtained from animals — from horses, in this case — that have recovered from a viral infection and found to have antibodies against the virus in their system. Antibodies from horses, known as equine antisera, are quite common.(Rear more)

What: to invest about \$1 billion in Mukesh Ambani's Reliance Retail

When: published on 3rd October 2020

Reliance Industries announced that Singapore sovereign wealth fund GIC and global private equity firm TPG Capital would invest nearly \$1 billion in its retail arm, Reliance Retail Ventures. GIC will invest Rs 5,512.5 crore and TPG will invest Rs 1,837.5 crore in the retail arm. In a regulatory filing, Reliance said that the firms would pick 1.22 per cent equity stake and 0.41 per cent equity stake in RRVL respectively.

The Mukesh Amba<mark>ni-helm</mark>ed oil-to-telecom conglomerate said that the investments value Reliance Retail at a pre-money equity value of \$58.47 billion.

Reliance has already secured more than \$2 billion in investments from global investors including General Atlantic, Abu Dhabi state fund Mubadala and Silver Lake Partners for the retail arm. This investment is TPG's second in Reliance after its \$598 million investment in Reliance's Jio Platforms. Mukesh Ambani has approached Jio Platforms investors to pick stakes in Reliance Retail.(Read more)

The CII Foundation's work on crop residue management has been awarded the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals (UNSDG) Action Award by UNDP in partnership with the Government of Punjab under the category 'Integration, Convergence, Joint Action and Holistic Solution Approach – Industry'. The SDG Action Awards recognise efforts of change makers who are working towards making the world a better place. This is the third edition of the SDG Action Award which identifies



outstanding initiatives that are accelerating action towards the achievement of the Sustainable

Development Goals (SDGs).

Crop residue burning in the north-western states of India is an established contributor to the

deteriorating air quality in the region, which is aggravated around October.

In 2017-18, the CII partnered with the NITI Aayog to research the issue of air pollution, and a roadmap for action on crop residue burning emerged from that engagement. The CII Foundation then launched

a field project in Punjab in 2018. (Read more)

Sviatlana Tsikhanouskaya, Maria Kolesnikova and Veronika Tsepkalo might well be prominent faces of the opposition in Belarus today. But doubtless Ales Bialiatski is the man who's been giving President Alexander Lukashenko sleepless nights for decades, whose eagle eye spots any abuse and who surely

helped inspire the three women now pushing Lukashenko to the brink.

The 58-year-old human rights activist has fought for human rights and freedom in Belarus for half his life, but he struggles to recall times quite so tough: "The level of repression is currently extremely high, we have not seen the like of this. Right now we're really experiencing a societal disaster."(Read

distancing in the wake of coronavirus pandemic.

CSC's Chief Executive Officer Dinesh Tyagi said older people have been identified as the most vulnerable during the Covid-19 pandemic and are encouraged to stay within their homes as much as

possible.



As most elderly, especially those living in rural areas are not digitally literate, it is deeply impacting their way of life accessing basic goods and services and survival.(Read more)

Union Minister Smriti Irani on Wednesday said various measures are being looked at to address the logistics challenges and reduce the turnaround time for seamless movement of cargo between India and Bangladesh. Irani said leveraging the inland waterway route will also be looked at for seamless movement of cargo between the two neighbours. 'We are actively looking at addressing logistics challenges which emanate at our borders to facilitate quicker turnaround time for both the industries in India and Bangladesh,' said the minister at a CII webinar. The issues being faced in the movement of cargo through Petrapole and Benapole ports are also being investigated, she said.

Irani said imposition of zero duty on exports of ethnic apparel from India to Bangladesh would help increase trade.

'The Indian industry can rejoice if Bangladesh allows retail of ethnic apparel from India at zero duties,' the minister said.(Read more)

The government on Friday announced the launch of an ambitious information technology project 'Sunidhi' to digitise all provident fund and pension related activities of the Coal Mines Provident Fund Organisation (CMPFO). CMPFO, a statutory body under the coal ministry, administers different schemes of provident fund, pension and deposit linked insurance for coal mine workers.

"On the august occasion of 151st birth anniversary of Mahatma Gandhi, CMPFO inaugurated the - Superior New-generation Information and Data Handling Initiative (SUNIDHI), in response to Prime Minister's clarion call of Digital India campaign," the coal ministry said in a statement. (Read more)

Prime Minister Narendra Modi inaugurated Vaishvik Bhartiya Vaigyanik, VAIBHAV Summit this evening through video conference. The Summit is a global virtual summit of overseas and resident Indian researchers and academicians. The summit will conclude on the 31st of this month.

Addressing the Summit, PM Modi said, the Government has taken numerous measures to boost science, research and innovation. He said, Science is at the core of our efforts towards socio-economic transformations.



He said, In 2014, four new vaccines were introduced into the country's immunisation programme which included an indigenously developed Rotavirus vaccine. He said, the government has encouraged indigenous vaccine production. (Read more)

What: Inaugurates 'Atal Tunnel'- World's Longest Highway Tunnel in Himachal Pradesh

When: published on 3rd October 2020

Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Saturday launched a blistering attack on the Congress, saying India's defence interests were compromised under its rule, and asserted nothing is more important to his government than protecting the country.

Modi hit out at the opposition party, which headed the coalition government at the Centre during 2004-14, after inaugurating the strategically important 9.02-km Atal Tunnel, the world's longest highway tunnel which reduces the distance between Manali and Leh by 46 km and the travel time by four to five hours.

He cited a number of strategically important projects, from Atal Tunnel to the air strip at Daulat Beg Oldi in Ladakh and Tejas fighter aircraft production, to assert that they were delayed or almost forgotten and questioned as to what "compulsion" and "pressure" might have been behind it, without directly naming the Congress.(Read more)

In a relief to individual borrowers and medium and small industries, the Centre has agreed in the Supreme Court to waive compound interest (interest on interest) charged on loans of up to Rs 2 crores for a six-month moratorium period announced due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

It said the government will seek due authorisation from parliament for making appropriate grants in this regard and "the endeavour shall be over and above the support of Rs 3.7 lakh crore to MSMEs, Rs 70,000 crore for home loans etc. already extended through the Garib Kalyan and Aatma Nirbhar packages announced by government earlier".(Read more)

Who: European Union

What: leaders break deadlock to impose sanctions on Belarus

When: published on 3rd October 2020

The European Union imposed sanctions against Belarus on Friday in a bid to pressure President Alexander Lukashenko to hold a fresh election.

The EU follows the U.K. and Canada in taking action against the regime, saying that the Aug. 9 election that saw Lukashenko reelected was neither free nor fair and condemning the regime's violence against peaceful protesters and arbitrary arrests.

EU leaders agreed to impose asset freezes and travel bans on 40 Belarusian officials during late night talks at a summit in Brussels. But Lukashenko himself wasn't on the list, raising questions about how much influence the EU will bring to bear on the Belarusian regime. (Read more)
