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## Explanation:

1. The passage is related to foot artery and the significance of pre-requisite of its surgery. Statement (B) is introducing the passage with knowledge of a particular artery as 'chief artery'.

However it seems that statement (A) is the introduction but actually it follows statement (E) because both are related to 'anatomy' of the arteries.

Statement (D) is regarding 'reconstruction' of the arteries, thus it finds suitable after (B).

Statement (C) is clearly out of context as 'absent pulses' and 'impaired blood flow' do not contribute to the central idea.

Therefore, option C is the correct answer.

Additional Info: Please note, the correct sequence would be **B-D-E-A**.

2. The passage gives a problem-solving idea to do away with environmental problems due to energy consumption. Statement (D) is initiating the passage and statement (C) is very specific to the 'environmental issues' explained in (D). Therefore, (D) is followed by (C).

Evidently, (E) is the supporting statement of (C). So (C) is followed by (E).

From the 'energy efficient lighting system' in (B) it is clear that it is following (E).

Statement (A) is the comparison between older and modern LEDs which is not relevant to the main idea of the passage.

Clearly, option A) is the correct answer.

Additional Info: Please note, the correct sequence would be **D-C-E-B**.

3. We can clearly observe (C) as the beginning statement. The passage is related to the positive impact of informal sector on the economy of a nation.

Statement (D) explains the contribution of informal sector and (E) also continued with the same keyword 'contribution'. Moreover statement (D) and (E) has a cause-effect relation. Therefore, D-B-E is a triad formed by connecting the dots.

Statement (A) abruptly starts with an idea contrast to the topic discussed in the passage.

Therefore, option A is the correct answer.

Additional Info: Please note, the correct sequence would be **C-D-B-E**.

4. Statement (E) is the introductory sentence. The passage is regarding the US President's action on the protest against racism.

Chronologically, statements (C) and (B) are following (E) in tandem.

Statement (B) and (D) form a meaningful pair.

But statement (A) is deviating towards a list of protests in the US. It is not related to the main idea.

Therefore, (A) is the correct option.

Hence, option A is correct.

Additional Info: Please note, the correct sequence would be **E-C-B-D**.

5. The main idea of the passage is EU's strive to curb advantageous acquisition of local industries by protecting them from Chinese and other countries.

Statements (A), (D) and (E) are a triad mentioning the plans and curbs to keep the local industries aloof from 'unfair competition'.

Statement (B) best suits as the introduction of the passage.

Statement (C) is regarding trade 'outside' EU whereas the idea of the passage cites unfair trade inside EU.

Hence, C is the correct option.

Additional Info: Please note, the correct sequence would be **B-A-D-E**.

6. Statement (C) is the first sentence of the passage. The passage narrates the issue arose after the changes in US immigration policy.

Statement (B) is informative and supporting (C). So it forms a pair with (C).

Sentences (E) and (A) clearly form a pair citing problems of many Indians in US.

Statement (D) is regarding an action and is incomplete in the passage.

Hence, option D is correct.

Additional Info: Please note, the correct sequence would be **C-B-E-A**.

7. Statements (B) and (D) form a pair as (D) is in detailed form of (B).

The next sequence is Statement (E) which also forms pair with (C) and the reason is as same.

But Statement (A) does not have any relation with the incident construed in the passage.

Hence, A is the correct option.

Additional Info: Please note, the correct sequence would be **B-D-E-C**.

8. Chronologically, statements (A) and (E) are valid pairs as the two consecutive months are mentioned.

Statement (C) is initiating the passage as it refers to the coverage of the migrant workers under the health care facility. Other statements do not seem to be as the introductory sentence.

Statement (D) is not regarding the idea of the passage and slightly deviated to the plights of stranded migrants only. Therefore, (D) is the correct option.

Hence, option D is correct.

Additional Info: Please note, the correct sequence would be **C-A-E-B**.

9. The passage clearly draws an image of the problem faced in English by some students. And (C) is the beginning statement.

Statement (A) is the regarding the importance of English and directly follows (C).

Statement (E) has mentioned of a problem in English commonly across the nation, which is continued in statement (D). So (E) is followed by (D).

Statement (B) has no link to the point mooted as the 'perception of teachers' is completely absurd here.

Therefore, option B is the correct answer.

Additional Info: Please note, the correct sequence would be **C-A-E-D**.



**10.** (A) is the introductory statement which discusses a common tendency of resigning jobs due to frustration at work. Statement (B) can be the following one but (C) has a valid point supporting (A). So A-C-B is the apt triad.

As per the starting of statement (E), it is concluding with a probable risk of taking the decision hastily.

Statement (D) has mentioned of 'other's mistakes' which is not concerning the idea of the passage.

Therefore, option D is the correct answer.

Additional Info: Please note, the correct sequence would be A-C-B-E.



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
