Aavya and Eiliyah got married in February and November respectively and in South Africa and Netherland, but not necessarily in same order.

Saraf's marriage was held in December.

Udbhav was married to Bansri but not in July.

Quasar marriage did not take place in neither New Zealand nor England.

Daisha's marriage took place in Pakistan.

Common Explanation

References:

Aavya and Eiliyah got married in February and November respectively and in South Africa and Netherland, but not necessarily in same order.

Rayim's wedding took place in South Africa, however he was not married Aavya or Faritha.

The wedding in Netherland took in the month which has less number of days.

Inference:

Aavya got married in February and Eiliyah got married in November. Both of them marriage held in either South Africa or Netherland. [But we don't the correct order]

Rayim's marriage held in South Africa, but he didn't married Aavya or Faritha. Then he must marry Eiliyah. Thus Aavya marriage held in Netherland.

The wedding in Netherland took in the month which has less number of days. [Only February has less number of days among given month-28 days]

So in February Aavya got married in Netherland.

Saraf's marriage was held in December.

The Bride Carina's wedding took in the month of April, but not in Australia.

Udbhav was married to Bansri but not in July.

Inference:

From this information, we get some couple as,

Parbej's wedding took place in Australia and Taarun's wedding in New Zealand, but neither of them was married to Bansri or Daisha.

Quasar marriage did not take place in neither New Zealand nor England.

Daisha's marriage took place in Pakistan.

Inference:

Remaining bride groom left is Parbej, Taarun & Quasar.

Note: Carina marriage not held in Australia & Avaya Marriage held in Netherland.

Then Parbej must marry Faritha whose marriage held in Australia.

Similarly, Taarun must marry Carina whose marriage held in Newzeland

So Saraf must marry Daisha whose marriage held in Pakistan.

Thus, Quasar must marry Avaya whose marriage held in Netherland.

Answer:

1.

Following the common explanation, we get "**Udbhav-Bansri-September-England**". Hence, option B is correct.

2.

Following the common explanation, we get "Faritha-Parbej-July-Australia".

Hence, option C is correct.

3.

Following the common explanation, we get "Carina-Taarun-April-New Zealand".

If Carina is sister of Parbej, then Taarun is the brother in law of Parbej.

Hence, option D is correct.

4.

Following the common explanation, we get "Saraf-Daisha-December-Pakistan as the true combination."

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Hence, option B is correct.

5.

Following the common explanation, we get "Quasar-28 days, April-30 days".

Remaining options are paired with the month which has same days as their original month of marriage.

Whereas Quasar is paired with the month of April which has 30 days while his original month of marriage i.e. February has 28 days only.

Hence, option E is correct.

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
