

Parth's neighbour is 3rd to the left of Padam.


Padam faces Rachit's neighbour.

Studying the given information carefully we can place Rachit Raag and Rahi in Row 1 and Padam, Padma and Parth in Row 2. As shown in the puzzle below:



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
Reference:

Raja's neighbour faces Padma.

Inference:

Using the given information we can place Ras, raja and Pali in the puzzle. As there is only one place left in both of the rows combined it Padma be filled the remaining person i.e. Pari. And the puzzle is completed.

The final puzzle is as follows:



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1. Following the final Solution of the seating arrangement, we can say that all of the statements are true.

2. Following the final Solution of the seating arrangement, we can say that Pari sits second to the right of Padma.


Hence the correct answer is option (A.)
