1. <u>Connectors</u>:

B and D B: Despite being only 25, he is **so rich** D: that **he owns a luxury car** to his name

Other pairs do not have any such relationship and therefore cannot be combined to make a meaningful sentence.

This makes Option C the right choice among the given options.

2. <u>Connectors</u>:

A and E A: It is the **duty** of any public official E: **to serve** the common man without asking any questions

Hence, these two are matched.

Connectors:

C and D C: Though we are going to celebrate the 72nd **Independence Day** soon D: we are yet to achieve the **true freedom**

So, these two are also matched with each other meaningfully.

No other pair shares a meaningful relationship.

This makes Option C the right choice among the given options.

3. None of the given pairs can be matched in order to form a meaningful sentence.

Hence, it makes Option E the right choice among the given options.

4. Connectors:

A and F

A: I am so tired that

F: it is difficult for me to go through this now

Connectors: B and D B: It is **known to everybody** D: that **he prefers coffee to tea** anyday

Connectors: C and E C: The **Rescue Operations Team** has announced that E: It is **not possible to pursue this** further

Evidently, all the given pairs of fragments can be matched as above.

This makes Option A the right choice among the given options.

5. Connectors:

C and D C: IAS Officers may be very powerful D: but they have to abide by rules and norms

Connectors:

A: The insurance sector in India is

E: still at the nascent stage with a lot of potential

The remaining pair would have also been correct, had the fragments been connected with 'as' and had the phrase 'from business ventures' not been there.

Hence, Option D is the correct choice among the given options.

So, these two are also matched with each other meaningfully.

Connectors: B and F B: <u>The Education Technology sector in India</u> F<u>: Is overcrowded</u> with too many players

This makes option D the right choice among the given options.

8. None of the given pairs can be matched in order to form a meaningful sentence which is grammatically and contextually correct.

Hence, it makes option E the right choice among the given options.

9. Connectors:

A and E

A: The floating exchange rate regime is very uncertain

F: though the central banks are doing well to control it

None of the other pairs share any meaningful relationship with each other to form a sentence.

Though B-F connects well grammatically, they don't make a contextually sound pair as 'office politics' and 'depletion of organization structure' are two different things altogether.

On the other hand, fragment C is grammatically incorrect because of the usage of 'present continuous tense' instead of 'simple present or present indefinite tense'.

Ex. He is always complaining. (Incorrect).

Ex. He always complains. (Correct)

Hence, option D is the correct choice among the given options.

10. Connectors:

B and D B: <u>Money laundering activities in India have</u> D: <u>taken place</u> through the shell companies in tax havens

Connectors: C and E C: All the courts in the country <u>are facing</u> E: <u>the same issue</u> of human resource crunch

The other pairs do not share such a relationship so as to form grammatically and contextually correct sentences.

Hence, option B is the correct choice among the given options.
